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Example

Dioid

A dioid $(\mathcal{D},\oplus,\otimes)$ is a set with two inner operations.

- \oplus : commutative, associative, idempotent and admits a neutral element ε
- \otimes : associative, distributive with respect to the sum and admits a neutral element *e*.

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Order relation

The equivalence: $a \succeq b \Leftrightarrow a = a \oplus b$ defines a partial order relation.

Residuation theory⁶

f residuated \Leftrightarrow inequation $f(x) \leq b$ admits a greatest solution $f^{\sharp}(b)$

 f^{\sharp} is called *residual* of f.

Residuation theory⁶

f residuated \Leftrightarrow inequation $f(x) \leq b$ admits a greatest solution $f^{\sharp}(b)$

f^{\sharp} is called *residual* of f.

Example

 $L_a: x \mapsto a \otimes x$ is residuated, greatest solution of $L_a(x) \preceq b$ is $L_a^{\sharp}(b) = \frac{b}{a}$.

Application to JIT control

Composed mapping residuation⁷

Let $f : \mathcal{D} \to \mathcal{C}$ and $g : \mathcal{C} \to \mathcal{B}$. If f and g are residuated then $g \circ f$ is residuated and $(g \circ f)^{\sharp} = f^{\sharp} \circ g^{\sharp}$.

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Mapping restriction

Let $f : \mathcal{D} \to \mathcal{C}$ a mapping and $\mathcal{A} \subseteq \mathcal{D}$. We denote $f_{|\mathcal{A}} : \mathcal{A} \to \mathcal{C}$ the mapping defined by $f_{|\mathcal{A}} = f \circ Id_{\mathcal{A}}$ where $Id_{\mathcal{A}} : \mathcal{A} \to \mathcal{D}$ is the canonical injection.

$$\begin{array}{ccc} \mathcal{D} & \stackrel{f}{\longrightarrow} & \mathcal{C} \\ \mathsf{Id}_{\mathcal{A}} & & & \\ \mathcal{A} & & \mathsf{f}_{|\mathcal{A}} \end{array}$$

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Constrained residuation⁸

Such problems consist in finding the greatest solution of $f_{|\mathcal{A}}(x) \leq b$, with f residuated.

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Constrained residuation⁸

Such problems consist in finding the greatest solution of $f_{|\mathcal{A}}(x) \leq b$, with f residuated.

Proposition

If $Id_{\mathcal{A}}$ is residuated, the constrained residuation problem admits an optimal solution which is $f_{|\mathcal{A}}^{\sharp}(b) = (f \circ Id_{\mathcal{A}})^{\sharp}(b) = Id_{\mathcal{A}}^{\sharp} \circ f^{\sharp}(b).$

Two stages:

1. Operating schedule

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- O definition of the bus routes and the bus stops
- choice of a level-of-service (resources distribution, minimum and maximum headways)

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- O definition of the bus routes and the bus stops

- ensure a level of service at particular stops of the network: y(k) = C'x(k) ≤ z(k)
- satisfy maximum and minimum headways: $u(k+1) \succeq \triangle^{min}u(k)$ $u(k+1) \preceq \triangle^{max}u(k)$

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- satisfy maximum and minimum headways: $u(k+1) \succeq \triangle^{min}u(k)$ $u(k+1) \preceq \triangle^{max}u(k)$

 minimize waiting times : we must consider a new model:

 $x(k) = A'x(k-1) \oplus B'u(k)$

where $A'_{ij} = A_{ij}$ if $A_{ij} \neq \varepsilon$ and $A'_{ij} = w_{ij}$ if *i* in connection with *j*.

The constrained problem (1) is equivalent to solve:

 $L_{H_{|\mathcal{A}}}(u) = L_H \circ Id_{\mathcal{A}}(u) \preceq z$

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Characterization of \mathcal{A}

 ${\mathcal A}$ is a subset of $\overline{\mathbb{Z}}_{\textit{max}}[\![\gamma]\!]$ where

$$u \in \mathcal{A} \iff \begin{cases} \bigtriangleup^{\min} \gamma u & \preceq u \\ (\bigtriangleup^{\max})^{-1} \gamma^{-1} u & \preceq u, \end{cases}$$

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Residuability of Id_A

By quotienting $\overline{\mathbb{Z}}_{max}[\![\gamma]\!]$ by the following equivalence relation

$$\{x \mathcal{R} y\} \Longleftrightarrow \{\frac{x}{p^*} = \frac{y}{p^*}\}$$

we can deduce that $\frac{y}{p^*} \in \mathcal{A}$ is the greatest element of \mathcal{A} which is less than or equal to y.

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we can deduce that $\frac{y}{p^*} \in \mathcal{A}$ is the greatest element of \mathcal{A} which is less than or equal to y. \Leftrightarrow the inequation $Id_{\mathcal{A}}(x) \preceq x'$ (with $x' \in \mathbb{Z}_{max}[\![\gamma]\!]$) admits a greatest solution which is $\frac{x'}{p^*}$. $\Leftrightarrow Id_{\mathcal{A}}$ is residuated and

$$Id_{\mathcal{A}}^{\sharp}(x') = \bigoplus_{\{x \in \mathcal{A} | x \leq x'\}} x = \frac{x'}{p^*}$$

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Proposition

Since $\mathit{Id}_{\mathcal{A}}$ is residuated, $\mathit{L}_{\mathit{H}_{|\mathcal{A}}}$ is residuated too and

$$L^{\sharp}_{H_{|\mathbb{A}}}(z) = Id^{\sharp}_{|\mathbb{A}} \circ L^{\sharp}_{H}(z) = \frac{z}{p^{*}}$$

is the optimal solution to the constrained problem.

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- dioids algebra seems to be appropriate for the study of public transportation networks :
 - we have proposed a solution for the problem of timetables generation
 - stability of such networks has been studied
- extension:

we try currently to control such systems considering more general constraints.

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Just In Time control

For a given target *z*, find the greatest *u* such as $y = Hu \leq z$. \rightarrow residuation of L_H leads to $u_{opt} = \frac{z}{H}$.

Characterization of \mathcal{A}

$$\begin{cases} \triangle^{\min} u(k-1) \leq u(k) \\ (\triangle^{\max})^{-1} u(k+1) \leq u(k), \end{cases}$$

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$$\begin{cases} \bigtriangleup^{\min} \gamma u & \preceq u \\ (\bigtriangleup^{\max})^{-1} \gamma^{-1} u & \preceq u, \end{cases}$$

and $(\triangle^{\min} \gamma \oplus (\triangle^{\max})^{-1} \gamma^{-1}) u \preceq u$.

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Since product is residuated, we equivalently have

$$u = \frac{u}{\bigtriangleup^{\min} \gamma \oplus (\bigtriangleup^{\max})^{-1} \gamma^{-1}} \wedge u.$$

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Since product is residuated, we equivalently have

$$u = \frac{u}{\Delta^{\min} \gamma \oplus (\Delta^{\max})^{-1} \gamma^{-1}} \wedge u.$$

greatest solution:

$$u=\frac{u}{(\gamma\triangle^{\min}\oplus\gamma^{-1}(\triangle^{\max})^{-1})^{*}}.$$

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proposition

- Each equivalence class of $\overline{\mathbb{Z}}_{max}[\![\gamma]\!]_{/\mathcal{R}}$ contains one and only one element belonging to $\Pi(\overline{\mathbb{Z}}_{max}[\![\gamma]\!])$ and this element is explicitly given by $\frac{x}{p^*}$ for any x in the class.
- 2 Element ^x/_{p^{*}} is the least element in [x]_R, and it is the greatest element of Π(Z_{max}[[γ]]) which is less than x.

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
