1986	to promote modern biology and biotechnology
1987	The National Institute of Immunology (NII) set up by DBT
1989	Bangalore Genei starts production of restriction enzymes & other tools for genetics
	The National Center for Biological Sciences (NCBS) is established to pursue R&D in molecular biology
1991	Bharat Biotech International Ltd. starts an R&D centre at Genome Valley, Hyderabad
1996	The Center for Biochemical Technology (CBT) is established to focus on bioinformatics and genomics
1997	Shantha Biotech launches India's first recombinant product, a Hep B vaccine
1998	Monsanto research establishes an R&D center for plant genomics
