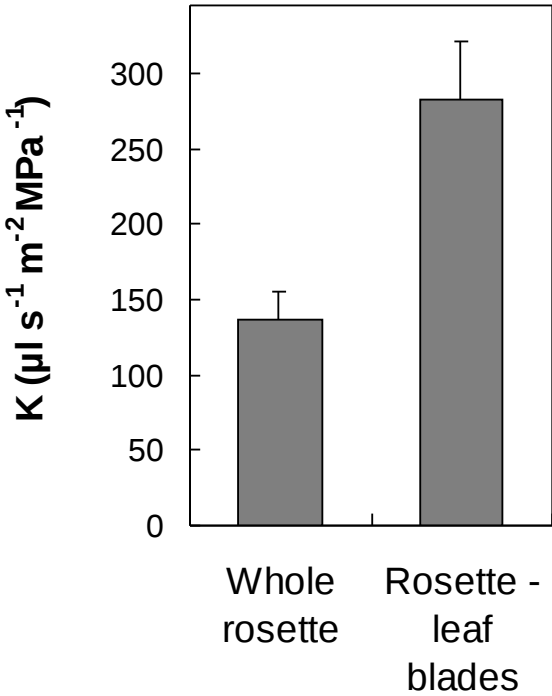

Supplemental Figure 1. Hydrostatic hydraulic conductivity (K) of whole rosettes (whole rosette) or of rosettes with all leaf blades excised (rosette – leaf blades).

K was measured in rosettes excised during day time from plants grown under a normal photoperiodic regime. K was successively measured on whole rosettes and after excising all blades at their basis. Pooled data from two independent cultures (*n* = 8 plants). Values are mean ± SE.
