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NUMBER FIELDS WHOSE ABELIAN CLOSURES HAVE ISOMORPHIC GALOIS GROUPS

Abstract. — Following a paper by Athanasios Angelakis and Peter Stevenhagen on the determination of imaginary quadratic fields having the same absolute Abelian Galois group (arXiv:1209.6005), we study this property for arbitrary number fields. We show that such a property is probably not generalizable to fields not imaginary quadratic, because of some p-adic obstructions about the units. By restriction to the p-parts of the Galois groups, we show that the corresponding study is related to the classical notion of p-rational fields. All this is a consequence of results yet published in our Springer book on class field theory.

R'esum'e. — A partir d'un article de Athanasios Angelakis et Peter Stevenhagen sur la détermination de corps quadratiques imaginaires ayant le même groupe de Galois Abélien absolu (arXiv:1209.6005), nous étudions cette propriété pour les corps de nombres quelconques. Nous montrons qu'une telle propriété est probablement non généralisable aux corps non quadratiques imaginaires en raison d'obstructions p-adiques au niveau des unités. En se restreignant aux p-parties des groupes de Galois, nous montrons que l'étude correspondante est liée à la notion classique de corps p-rationnels. Tout ceci est une conséquence de résultats déjà publiés dans notre livre chez Springer sur la théorie du corps de classes.

1. Introduction – Notations


Let K be a number field of degree $n =: r_1 + 2 r_2$, and let A_K be the Galois group $\operatorname{Gal}(\overline{K}^{\operatorname{ab}}/K)$ where $\overline{K}^{\operatorname{ab}}$ is the maximal Abelian pro-extension of K. The question is the following: in what circumstances the groups A_{K_1} and A_{K_2} are isomorphic groups when K_1 and K_2 are two distinct number fields? Of course such isomorphisms are only isomorphisms of Abelian profinite groups in which the arithmetical invariants (decomposition groups, inertia groups) are not respected. A first work on this subject was published in [O] by Midori Onabe.

Let p be a fixed prime number and let H^{ord} , H^{ord}_p , $H^{\mathrm{res}}_{\mathrm{ta}}$, \widetilde{K}_p , be the p-Hilbert class field, the maximal p-ramified (i.e. unramified outside p) Abelian pro-p-extension of K (in ordinary senses), the maximal tamely ramified Abelian pro-p-extension of K (in restricted sense), the compositum of the \mathbb{Z}_p -extensions of K, respectively.

Then let $\mathcal{T}_p^{\text{ord}} := \text{Gal}(H_p^{\text{ord}}/\widetilde{K}_p)$ and $\mathcal{C}_p^{\text{ord}} := \text{Gal}(H^{\text{ord}}/K)$ isomorphic to the p-class group of K. The groups $\mathcal{T}_p^{\text{ord}}$ and $\mathcal{C}_p^{\text{ord}}$ are finite groups.

For any finite place v of K, we denote by K_v the corresponding completion of K, then by $U_v := \{u \in K_v, |u|_v = 1\}$ and $U_v^1 := \{u \in U_v, |u-1|_v < 1\}$, the unit group and principal unit group of K_v , respectively.

These definitions can be summarized by the following diagram [Gr1, III.2.6.1, Fig. 2.2]:



where $\mathcal{B}_p \simeq \bigoplus_{v \mid p} U_v^1/i_p(E \otimes \mathbb{Z}_p)$, where E is the group of global units of K and $i_p = (i_v)_{v \mid p}$ the diagonal embedding.

We shall make use of some p-adic logarithms as follows:

(i) We consider the \mathbb{Q}_p -vector space $\bigoplus_{v|p} K_v$, and we denote by \log_p the p-adic logarithm:

$$\begin{array}{ccc} K^{\times} & \longrightarrow & \bigoplus_{v|p} K_v \\ x & \longmapsto & (\log_v(x))_{v|p} \end{array}$$

where $\log_v(x) := \log(i_v(x))$ for all v|p, and where $\log: \mathbb{C}_p^{\times} \longrightarrow \mathbb{C}_p$ is the Iwasawa extension of the usual p-adic logarithm defined on the group of principal units u =: 1 + x of \mathbb{C}_p by the convergent series $\log(1+x) := \sum_{i \geq 1} (-1)^{i+1} \frac{x^i}{i}$, and by $\log(p) := 0$.


We still denote by log the map $\bigoplus_{v|p} K_v^{\times} \longrightarrow \bigoplus_{v|p} K_v$ defined by $\log((x_v)_{v|p}) := (\log(x_v))_{v|p}$. We then have $\log_p = \log \circ i_p$ on K^{\times} .

- (ii) We then define the quotient \mathbb{Q}_p -vector space $\mathcal{L}_p := \left(\bigoplus_{v|p} K_v\right) / \mathbb{Q}_p \log_p(E)$. We have, under the Leopoldt conjecture for p in K, $\dim_{\mathbb{Q}_p}(\mathcal{L}_p) = r_2 + 1$.
- (iii) Finally, we denote by Log_p the map from the group I_p of ideals of K prime to p, to \mathcal{L}_p sending $\mathfrak{a} \in I_p$ to $\operatorname{Log}_p(\mathfrak{a})$ defined as follows. If m is such that $\mathfrak{a}^m = (\alpha)$ with $\alpha \in K^{\times}$, we set $\operatorname{Log}_p(\mathfrak{a}) := \frac{1}{m} \operatorname{log}_p(\alpha) \mod \mathbb{Q}_p \operatorname{log}_p(E)$.

It is clear that if we also have $\mathfrak{a}^{m'} = (\alpha')$ with $\alpha' \in K^{\times}$, then $(\alpha)^{m'} = (\alpha')^m$, hence $\alpha^{m'} = \alpha'^m \varepsilon$ with $\varepsilon \in E$, so that $\frac{1}{m} \log_p(\alpha) = \frac{1}{m'} \log_p(\alpha') + \frac{1}{m m'} \log_p(\varepsilon)$, showing that Log_p is defined in \mathcal{L}_p .

2. Class field study of the Abelian closure

In [Gr1, III.4.4.1], we have given the following fundamental diagram for the structure of the p-part of the Galois group A_K (assuming the Leopoldt conjecture for p), where $\overline{K}^{ab}(p)$ is the maximal Abelian pro-p-extension of K:



where F_v is the residue field of v in K and $(F_v^{\times})_p \simeq F_v^{\times} \otimes \mathbb{Z}_p$ the p-part of its multiplicative group. This also concerns the real infinite places for which $F_v^{\times} = \{\pm 1\}$ (see [Gr1, I.3.1.2]). For the definition of the embeddings of $\mathcal{E} := E \otimes \mathbb{Z}_p$ in $\prod_{v \nmid p} (F_v^{\times})_p$ and in $\bigoplus_{v \mid p} U_v^1$, respectively, see [Gr1, III.4.4.5.1].

Definition 2.1. — The number field K is said to be p-rational (see [MN], [GJ], [JN]) if it satisfies the Leopoldt conjecture for p and if $\mathcal{T}_p^{\text{ord}} = 1$.

Remarks 2.2. — (i) By [Gr1, III.2.6.1 (ii₂)], using [Gr1, III.4.2.4, III.4.2.5], and assuming the Leopoldt conjecture, the p-rationality of K is equivalent to the following three conditions:

- the p-Hilbert class field H^{ord} is contained in the compositum \widetilde{K}_p of the \mathbb{Z}_p -extensions of K (this point is equivalent to the fact that $\mathcal{C}_p^{\text{ord}} \simeq \mathbb{Z}_p \text{Log}_p(I_p) / \bigoplus_{v|p} \log(U_v^1) \mod \mathbb{Q}_p \log_p(E)$, which can be nontrivial),
- $\bigoplus_{v|p} \mu_p(K_v) = i_p(\mu_p(K))$, where $\mu_p(k)$ denotes, for any field k, the group of roots of unity in k of p-power order,
- $\mathbb{Z}_p \log_p(E)$ is a direct summand in $\bigoplus_{v|p} \log(U_v^1)$, which expresses the minimality of the valuation of the *p*-adic regulator.
- (ii) If K is p-rational, then all its subfields are p-rational. By [Gr1, III.4.1.11], \mathbb{Q} is p-rational for all p.
- (iii) For a p-rational field K, we have (noncanonically, see [Gr1, III.4.1.10]):

$$\operatorname{Gal}(\overline{K}^{\operatorname{ab}}(p)/K) \simeq \mathbb{Z}_p^{r_2+1} \times \prod_{v \nmid p} (F_v^{\times})_p.$$

So, a sufficient condition to get $\operatorname{Gal}(\overline{K}^{\operatorname{ab}}/K) \simeq \widehat{\mathbb{Z}}^{r_2+1} \times \prod_v F_v^{\times}$ is that K be p-rational for all p. We have the following result, valid for any number field K.

Proposition 2.3. — Let K be a number field. We denote by μ_K the group of roots of unity in K and by w_K its order. Let F_v be the residue field of the place v (finite or real infinite) in K. Then we have the group isomorphism

$$\prod_{v} F_{v}^{\times} \simeq \prod_{n \ge 1} \mathbb{Z}/w_{K} n \mathbb{Z}.$$


Proof. — Since $\mathbb{Q}(\mu_K) \subseteq K$, we know that $|F_v^{\times}| \equiv 0 \pmod{w_K}$ for all v. Then, following [AS, Lemma 3.2], we consider in the two groups the ℓ -parts for fixed prime ℓ . We have to prove that in the left member there exist infinitely many places v of K for which the norm $Nv := |F_v|$ is congruent to 1 modulo ℓ^m but not modulo ℓ^{m+1} , where $m \geq 0$ is the ℓ -valuation

of w_K . Let ζ be a primitive ℓ^{m+1} th root of unity; then $K(\zeta)/K$ is a nontrivial extension since $\mathbb{Q}(\zeta) \not\subseteq K$, and there exist infinitely many finite places v of K totally split in K/\mathbb{Q} and non totally split in $K(\zeta)/K$; so the prime q under v is non totally split in $\mathbb{Q}(\zeta)/K \cap \mathbb{Q}(\zeta)$ and totally split in $\mathbb{Q}(\zeta^{\ell})/\mathbb{Q}$. From classical class field theory in cyclotomic fields, we get the result.

Corollary 2.4. — Let \mathcal{H}^{ord} be the compositum of the fields H_p^{ord} (maximal p-ramified Abelian pro-p-extensions of K) for all prime numbers p. Then we have the group isomorphism

$$\operatorname{Gal}(\overline{K}^{\operatorname{ab}}/\mathcal{H}^{\operatorname{ord}}) \simeq \prod_{n\geq 1} \mathbb{Z}/w_K \, n\mathbb{Z}.$$

So we can resume with the following diagram:



where \mathcal{H}_{ta}^{res} is the compositum of the tame extensions H_{ta}^{res} and $\mathcal{M}_0 = \mathcal{H}^{ord}\mathcal{H}_{ta}^{res}$ (direct compositum over H^{ord}). So we can summarize these results in the following theorem:

Theorem 2.5. — Let \overline{K}^{ab} be the maximal Abelian pro-extension of K. We suppose that the p-adic Leopoldt conjecture is verified in K for all prime number p. There exists an Abelian extension \mathcal{F}_K of K such that \mathcal{H}^{ord} is the direct compositum of \mathcal{F}_K and the maximal $\widehat{\mathbb{Z}}$ -extension, \widetilde{K} , of K and such that

$$\operatorname{Gal}(\overline{K}^{\operatorname{ab}}/\mathcal{F}_K) \simeq \widehat{\mathbb{Z}}^{r_2+1} \times \prod_{n \geq 1} \mathbb{Z}/w_K \, n\mathbb{Z}.$$

Remark 2.6. — Write $w_K = \prod_{\ell \text{ prime}} \ell^{\lambda_\ell}$ and put $w_K^1 := \prod_{\lambda_\ell \geq 2} \ell^{\lambda_\ell}$. Then we can replace w_K by w_K^1 in the above formulas.

Corollary 2.7. — The Galois groups $Gal(\overline{K}^{ab}/\mathcal{F}_K)$ (up to non canonical isomorphisms) are independent of the number fields K as soon as these fields have the same number of complex places and the same w_K^1 .

Thus, for all totally real number fields K (satisfying the Leopoldt conjecture for all p) we have

$$\operatorname{Gal}(\overline{K}^{\operatorname{ab}}/\mathcal{F}_K) \simeq \widehat{\mathbb{Z}} \times \prod_{n \geq 1} \mathbb{Z}/n\mathbb{Z}.$$

Of course the extension \mathcal{F}_K/K is in general non canonical and infinite. It is the compositum of finite extensions F_p such that $H_p^{\mathrm{ord}} = \widetilde{K}_p F_p$; we then have $\mathrm{Gal}(F_p/K) \simeq \mathcal{T}_p$ for each p, and $\mathrm{Gal}(\mathcal{F}_K/K)$ measures a mysterious degree of complexity of $\mathrm{Gal}(\overline{K}^{\mathrm{ab}}/K)$.

We have $\mathcal{F}_K = K$ if and only if K is p-rational for all p, which is a very strong condition.

From Remark 2.2, we see that the first two conditions involve a finite number of primes p, but that the third condition is the most ugly. For instance, for $K = \mathbb{Q}(\sqrt{2})$, it is not satisfied for $p = 13, 31, 1546463, \ldots$ and perhaps for infinitely many primes p (see [Gr1, III.4.14]).

So, we are only concerned with the imaginary quadratic fields studied in [AS] since in Remarks 2.2, the third point is empty; the first and second ones can be verified probably for infinitely many imaginary quadratic fields as suggested in [AS, Conjecture 7.1].

For example (after [Gr2, III]), for p=2, the 2-rational Abelian 2-extensions of $\mathbb Q$ are the subfields of the fields

$$\mathbb{Q}(\mu_{2^{\infty}})\mathbb{Q}(\sqrt{-\ell}), -\ell \equiv 5 \mod (8),$$

or of the fields

$$\mathbb{Q}(\mu_{2^{\infty}})\mathbb{Q}\left(\sqrt{\sqrt{\ell}} \frac{a-\sqrt{\ell}}{2}\right), \ \ell = a^2 + 4b^2 \equiv 5 \bmod (8).$$

For p=3, the 3-rational Abelian 3-extensions of $\mathbb Q$ are the subfields of the fields

$$\widetilde{\mathbb{Q}}_3 k_{\ell}, \ \ell \equiv 4, \ 7 \bmod (9),$$

where $\widetilde{\mathbb{Q}}_3$ is the cyclotomic \mathbb{Z}_3 -extension of \mathbb{Q} and k_ℓ the cyclic cubic field of conductor ℓ .

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
