# An elementary proof of Fermat-Catalan conjecture. 

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## An elementary proof of Catalan-Mihailescu theorem and generalization to Fermat-Catalan conjecture Jamel Ghanouchi

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#### Abstract

$(\mathrm{MSC}=11 \mathrm{D} 04)$ We begin with an equation, for example : $Y^{p}=X^{q} \pm Z^{c}$ and solve it. (Keywords: Diophantine equations, Fermat-Catalan equation; Approach) Resolution of Catalan equation


Let Catalan equation :

$$
Y^{p}=X^{q}+1
$$

We have

$$
X^{q-3} Y^{2}-Y^{p-2} X^{3}=A
$$

And

$$
Y^{p-2} Y^{2}-X^{q-3} X^{3}=Y^{p}-X^{q}=1
$$

If $A=0$ then $X^{q-6}=Y^{p-4}$ leads, as $G C D(X, Y)=1$, to $p=4$ and $q=6$. This case has been studied by Lebesgue in the XIX century, it has no solution. Thus $A \neq 0$.
And if $A= \pm 1$ then it means that both
$X^{q-4} Y^{2}= \pm \frac{1}{X}+X^{2} Y^{p-2}$ and
$Y^{p-3} X^{3}=\mp \frac{1}{X}+X^{q-3} Y$ are rationals
it means, as it is impossible, that $q=3$ and $p=2$.
We have

\frac{X^{q-3}}{A} Y^{2}-\frac{Y^{p-2}}{A} X^{3}=1=Y^{p-2} Y^{2}-X^{q-3} X^{3}
$$

And we have simultaneously

\left(Y^{p-2}-\frac{X^{q-3}}{A}\right) Y^{2}=\left(X^{q-3}-\frac{Y^{p-2}}{A}\right) X^{3}
$$

Or

\left(A Y^{p-2}-X^{q-3}\right) Y^{2}=\left(A X^{q-3}-Y^{p-2}\right) X^{3}
$$

And

\left(Y^{2}+\frac{X^{3}}{A}\right) Y^{p-2}=\left(X^{3}+\frac{Y^{2}}{A}\right) X^{q-3}
$$

Or

\left(A Y^{2}+X^{3}\right) Y^{p-2}=\left(A X^{3}+Y^{2}\right) X^{q-3}
$$

But $X$ and $Y$ are coprimes. It means that we have four cases with $u$ and $v$ integers

Y^{p-2}=v\left(A X^{3}+Y^{2}\right) ; \quad X^{q-3}=v\left(X^{3}+A Y^{2}\right)
\end{gathered}
$$

Or

\end{gathered}

=u v\left(A^{2} X^{q}-Y^{p}+A(A)\right)=u v\left(A^{2} X^{q}+A^{2}-Y^{p}\right)=u v\left(A^{2} Y^{p}-Y^{p}\right)
\end{gathered}
$$

Thus

u v=\frac{1}{A^{2}-1}
$$

As $u v$ is integer, it means that it is impossible thus $u=0$ and $A^{2}=1$ or $A= \pm-1$ it means that $q=3$ and $p=2$.
Second case

u v \frac{Y^{p}}{A^{2}}=X^{q}-\frac{Y^{p}}{A^{2}}+\frac{Y^{2} X^{q-3}-Y^{p-2} X^{3}}{A} \\
=X^{q}-\frac{Y^{p}}{A^{2}}+1=X^{q}+1-\frac{Y^{p}}{A^{2}}=\left(\frac{A^{2}-1}{A^{2}}\right) Y^{p}
\end{gathered}
$$

Thus

u v=A^{2}-1
$$

And

u v\left(Y^{2} X^{q-3}-X^{3} Y^{p-2}\right)=u v A=u\left(X^{2 q-6}-Y^{2 p-4}\right) A=v\left(-X^{6}+Y^{4}\right) A
$$

u=-X^{6}+Y^{4} ; \quad v=X^{2 q-6}-Y^{2 p-4} \\
u v=A^{2}-1=\left(-X^{6}+Y^{4}\right)\left(X^{2 q-6}-Y^{2 p-4}\right)

Y^{p}=X^{q}+1 \Rightarrow Y^{p-2} X^{3}=X^{q} \frac{X^{3}}{Y^{2}}+\frac{X^{3}}{Y^{2}}
$$

And

Y^{2} X^{q-3}=X^{q} \frac{X^{q-3}}{Y^{p-2}}+\frac{X^{q-3}}{Y^{p-2}}
$$

We deduce

A=Y^{2} X^{q-3}-X^{3} Y^{p-2}=\left(X^{q}+1\right)\left(\frac{X^{q-3}}{Y^{p-2}}-\frac{X^{3}}{Y^{2}}\right)
$$

But

Y^{p}>X^{q} \Rightarrow A<0 \Rightarrow \frac{X^{q-3}}{Y^{p-2}}<\frac{X^{3}}{Y^{2}}
$$

And if

X^{3}<Y^{2} \Rightarrow X^{q-3}<Y^{p-2} \Rightarrow A^{2}-1=\left(-X^{6}+Y^{4}\right)\left(X^{2 q-6}-Y^{2 p-4}<0\right.

$0>Y^{2}\left(X^{q-3}-Y^{p-2}\right)=Y^{2} X^{q-3}-Y^{p}=Y^{2} X^{q-3}-X^{q}-1=X^{q-3}\left(Y^{2}-X^{3}\right)-1>-1$
And it is possible if $q-3=p-2=0$.
And if

X^{q-3}>Y^{p-2} \Rightarrow X^{3}>Y^{2} \Rightarrow A^{2}-1=\left(-X^{6}+Y^{4}\right)\left(X^{2 q-6}-Y^{2 p-4}<0\right.
$$

$0<Y^{2}\left(X^{q-3}-Y^{p-2}\right)=Y^{2} X^{q-3}-Y^{p}=Y^{2} X^{q-3}-X^{q}-1=X^{q-3}\left(Y^{2}-X^{3}\right)-1<0$
And it is possible if $q-3=p-2=0$

v\left(Y^{2} X^{q-3}-X^{3} Y^{p-2}\right)=v A=u v A\left(X^{2 q-6}-Y^{2 p-4}\right)=A\left(-X^{6}+Y^{4}\right)
\end{gathered}

$$

With $u$ and $A^{2}-1$ integers, it means $A^{2}=1!$ Fourth case :

\end{gathered}

We have here

u Y^{2}=A X^{q-3}-Y^{p-2} ; \quad u X^{3}-A Y^{p-2}=-X^{q-3}
$$

Y^{p-2}=A X^{q-3}-u Y^{2}=\left(Y^{2} X^{q-3}-X^{3} Y^{p-2}\right) X^{q-3}-u Y^{2}
$$

Hence

u \frac{Y^{p}}{A^{2}}=v\left(X^{q}-\frac{Y^{p}}{A^{2}}+1\right)=v\left(1-\frac{1}{A^{2}}\right) Y^{p}
$$

Thus

u\left(Y^{2} X^{q-3}-X^{3} Y^{p-2}\right)=u A=A\left(X^{2 q-6}-Y^{2 p-4}\right)=u v\left(-X^{6}+Y^{4}\right) A
$$

Thus

1=v\left(-X^{6}+Y^{4}\right)
$$

With $v$ and $A^{2}-1$ integers, it means $A^{2}-1=0$ !
The only solution, in all cases, in $p=2$ and $q=3$.
And $Y^{2}=X^{3}+1$ whose solution is $(X, Y)=(2, \pm 3)$.

## Resolution of Fermat equation

Let Fermat equation :

Y^{n}=X^{n}+Z^{n}
$$

We have

$$
X^{n-2} Y^{2}-Y^{n-2} X^{2}=A
$$

And

$$
Y^{n-2} Y^{2}-X^{n-2} X^{2}=Y^{n}-X^{n}=Z^{n}
$$

If $A=0$ then $X^{n-4}=Y^{n-4}$ leads, as $G C D(X, Y)=1$, to $n=4$. This case has been studied by Fermat, it has no solution. Thus $A \neq 0$.
And if $A= \pm Z^{n}$ then it means that both
$X^{n-3} Y^{2}= \pm \frac{Z^{n}}{X}+X Y^{n-2}$ and
$Y^{n-3} X^{2}=\mp \frac{Z^{n}}{Y}+X^{n-2} Y$ are rationals
it means, as it is impossible, that $n$ is not greater than 2 or $n=2$.
We have

$$
\frac{X^{n-2} Z^{n}}{A} Y^{2}-\frac{Y^{n-2} Z^{n}}{A} X^{2}=Z^{n}=Y^{n-2} Y^{2}-X^{n-2} X^{2}
$$

And we have simultaneously

$$
\left(Y^{n-2}-\frac{X^{n-2} Z^{n}}{A}\right) Y^{2}=\left(X^{n-2}-\frac{Y^{n-2} Z^{n}}{A}\right) X^{2}
$$

Or

\left(A Y^{n-2}-X^{n-2} Z^{n}\right) Y^{2}=\left(A X^{n-2}-Y^{p-2} Z^{n}\right) X^{2}
$$

As $u v$ is integer, it means that it is impossible thus $u=0$ and $A^{2}=Z^{2 n}$
it means that $p=2$.
Second case

## Resolution of Fermat- Catalan equation

Let Fermat-Catalan equation :

$a= \pm 1$

$$

If $A=0$ then $X^{q-2 w}=Y^{p-4}$ leads, as $G C D(X, Y)=1$, to $p=4$ and $q=2 w$. Thus $A \neq 0$.
And if $A= \pm Z^{c}$ then it means that both
$X^{q-w-1} Y^{2}= \pm \frac{a Z^{c}}{X}+X^{w-1} Y^{p-2}$ and
$Y^{p-3} X^{w}=\mp \frac{a Z^{c}}{Y}+X^{q-w} Y$ are rationals
it means, as i is imossble, that $q=w$ and $p=2$.
We have

\frac{X^{q-w} Z^{c}}{A} Y^{2}-\frac{Y^{p-2} Z^{c}}{A} X^{w}=a Z^{c}=Y^{p-2} Y^{2}-X^{q-w} X^{w}
$$

And we have simultaneously

\left(Y^{p-2}-\frac{X^{q-w} Z^{c}}{A}\right) Y^{2}=\left(X^{q-w}-\frac{Y^{p-2} Z^{c}}{A}\right) X^{w}
$$

\frac{Y^{2}}{A}= & u\left(X^{q-w}-\frac{Y^{p-2} Z^{c}}{A}\right) \quad \frac{X^{w}}{A}=u\left(-\frac{X^{q-w} Z^{c}}{A}+Y^{p-2}\right) \\
& v \frac{Y^{p-2}}{A}=X^{w}+\frac{Y^{2} Z^{c}}{A} \quad v \frac{X^{q-w}}{A}=\frac{X^{w} Z^{c}}{A}+Y^{2}
\end{aligned}
$$

Or

$$
\begin{gathered}
u \frac{Y^{2}}{A}=X^{q-w}-\frac{Y^{p-2} Z^{c}}{A} \quad u \frac{X^{w}}{A}=-\frac{X^{q-w} Z^{c}}{A}+Y^{p-2} \\
\frac{Y^{p-2}}{A}=v\left(X^{w}+\frac{Y^{2} Z^{c}}{A}\right) \quad \frac{X^{q-w}}{A}=v\left(\frac{X^{w} Z^{c}}{A}+Y^{2}\right)
\end{gathered}
$$

First case

$$
Y^{p}=u v\left(A^{2} X^{q}-Y^{p} Z^{2 c}+A Z^{c}\left(Y^{2} X^{q-w}-Y^{p-2} X^{w}\right)\right)
$$

$=u v\left(A^{2} X^{q}-Y^{p} Z^{2 c}+a A(A) Z^{c}\right)=u v\left(A^{2} X^{q}+A^{2} Z^{c}-Y^{p} Z^{2 c}\right)=u v\left(A^{2} Y^{p}-Y^{p} Z^{2 c}\right)$
Thus

$$
u v=\frac{1}{A^{2}-Z^{2 c}}
$$

As $u v$ is integer, it means that it is impossible thus $u=0$ and $A^{2}=Z^{2 c}$ or $A= \pm-Z^{c}$ it means that $q=w$ and $p=2$.
Second case

$$
\begin{gathered}
u v \frac{Y^{p}}{A^{2}}=X^{q}-\frac{Y^{p} Z^{2 c}}{A^{2}}+Z^{c} \frac{Y^{2} X^{q-w}-Y^{p-2} X^{w}}{A} \\
=X^{q}-\frac{Y^{p} Z^{2 c}}{A^{2}}+a Z^{c}=X^{q}+a Z^{c}-\frac{Y^{p} Z^{2 c}}{A^{2}}=\left(\frac{A^{2}-Z^{2 c}}{A^{2}}\right) Y^{p}
\end{gathered}
$$

Thus

$$
u v=A^{2}-Z^{2 c}
$$

And (with $a>0$, the proof is similar for $a<0$ )

$$
u v\left(Y^{2} X^{q-w}-X^{w} Y^{p-2}\right)=u v a A=u\left(X^{2 q-2 w}-Y^{2 p-4}\right) A=v\left(-X^{2 w}+Y^{4}\right) A
$$

Thus

$$
\begin{gathered}
u a=-X^{2 w}+Y^{4} ; \quad v a=X^{2 q-2 w}-Y^{2 p-4} \\
u v=A^{2}-Z^{2 c}=\left(-X^{2 w}+Y^{4}\right)\left(X^{2 q-2 w}-Y^{2 p-4}\right) \\
Y^{b}=X^{a}+Z^{c} \Rightarrow Y^{b-2} X^{w}=X^{a} \frac{X^{w}}{Y^{2}}+Z^{n} \frac{X^{w}}{Y^{2}}
\end{gathered}
$$

And

$$
Y^{2} X^{a-w}=X^{a} \frac{X^{a-w}}{Y^{b-2}}+Z^{c} \frac{X^{a-w}}{Y^{b-2}}
$$

We deduce

$$
A=Y^{2} X^{a-w}-X^{w} Y^{b-2}=\left(X^{a}+Z^{c}\right)\left(\frac{X^{a-w}}{Y^{b-2}}-\frac{X^{w}}{Y^{2}}\right)
$$

But

$$
Y^{b}>X^{a} \Rightarrow A<0 \Rightarrow \frac{X^{a-w}}{Y^{b-2}}<\frac{X^{w}}{Y^{2}}
$$

And if

$$
X^{w}<Y^{2} \Rightarrow X^{a-w}<Y^{b-2} \Rightarrow A^{2}-1=\left(-X^{2 w}+Y^{4}\right)\left(X^{2 a-2 w}-Y^{2 b-4}<0\right.
$$

But

$$
X^{a-w}<Y^{b-2} \Rightarrow X^{a-w} Y^{2}<Y^{n}=X^{a}+Z^{c} \Rightarrow Y^{2}<X^{w}+Z^{c} X^{w-a}
$$

And

$$
0<Y^{2}-X^{w}<Z^{c} X^{w-a}
$$

and if $X^{a}>Z^{c}$ it means $b=2$. And if

$$
X^{a-w}>Y^{b-2} \Rightarrow X^{w}>Y^{2} \Rightarrow A^{2}-1=\left(-X^{2 w}+Y^{4}\right)\left(X^{2 a-2 w}-Y^{2 b-4}>0\right.
$$

But

$$
X^{a-w}>Y^{b-2} \Rightarrow X^{a-w} Y^{2}>Y^{b}=X^{a}+Z^{c} \Rightarrow Y^{2}>X^{w}+Z^{c} X^{w-a}
$$

And

$$
0>Y^{2}-X^{w}>Z^{c} X^{w-a}>0
$$

And $b-2=0$
Third case :
We have here

$$
\begin{gathered}
Y^{2}=u\left(A X^{q-w}-Y^{p-2} Z^{c}\right) ; \quad X^{w}=u\left(-X^{q-w} Z^{c}+A Y^{p-2}\right) \\
v Y^{p-2}=A X^{w}+Y^{2} Z^{c} ; \quad v X^{q-w}=X^{w} Z^{c}+A Y^{2}
\end{gathered}
$$

And

$$
\begin{gathered}
v Y^{p}=u\left(A^{2} X^{q}-Y^{p} Z^{2 c}+a A^{2} Z^{c}\right)=u\left(A^{2}-Z^{2 c}\right) Y^{p} \\
v=u\left(A^{2}-Z^{2 c}\right) \\
v\left(Y^{2} X^{q-w}-X^{w} Y^{p-2}\right)=v a A=u v A\left(X^{2 q-2 w}-Y^{2 p-4}\right)=A\left(-X^{2 w}+Y^{4}\right)
\end{gathered}
$$

Thus $a u\left(X^{2 q-2 w}-Y^{2 p-4}\right)=1$ : it is possible only if $p=2$ and $q=w$. Fourth case :

$$
\begin{array}{cc}
u \frac{Y^{2}}{A}=X^{q-w}-\frac{Y^{p-2} Z^{c}}{A} ; \quad u \frac{X^{w}}{A}=-\frac{X^{q-w} Z^{c}}{A}+Y^{p-2} \\
\frac{Y^{p-2}}{A}=v\left(X^{w}+\frac{Y^{2} Z^{c}}{A}\right) ; \quad \frac{X^{q-w}}{A}=v\left(\frac{X^{w} Z^{c}}{A}+Y^{2}\right)
\end{array}
$$

We have here

$$
u Y^{2}=A X^{q-w}-Y^{p-2} Z^{c} ; \quad u X^{w}-A Y^{p-2}=-X^{q-w} Z^{c}
$$

And

$$
Y^{p-2}=A X^{q-w}-u Y^{2} Z^{c}=\left(Y^{2} X^{q-w}-X^{w} Y^{p-2}\right) X^{q-w}-u Y^{2} Z^{c}
$$

Hence

$$
u \frac{Y^{p}}{A^{2}}=v\left(X^{q}-\frac{Y^{p} Z^{2 c}}{A^{2}}+a Z^{c}\right)=v\left(1-\frac{Z^{2 c}}{A^{2}}\right) Y^{p}
$$

Thus

$$
u=v\left(A^{2}-Z^{2 c}\right)
$$

$$
u\left(Y^{2} X^{q-w}-X^{w} Y^{p-2}\right)=u a A=A\left(X^{2 q-2 w}-Y^{2 p-4}\right)=u v\left(-X^{2 w}+Y^{4}\right) A
$$

Thus $-a v\left(X^{2 w}-Y^{4}\right)=1$ : it is possible only if $u=0$ and $p-2=q-w=0$
The only solution, in all cases, is $p=2$.
And $Y^{2}=X^{q}+a Z^{c}$.

## Conclusion

Fermat-Catalan equation $Y^{p}=X^{q} \pm Z^{c}$ has solutions only for $p=2$. We have shown a way to solve it.
