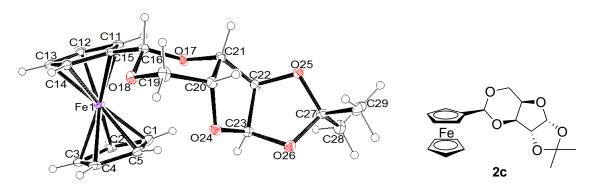

Compound 2c

The sample was studied with graphite monochromatized Mo_{Ka} radiation ($\lambda = 0.71073$ Å). The structure was solved by direct methods using the SIR97 program, ¹ and then refined with full-matrix least-square methods based on F² (SHELX-97)² with the aid of the WINGX program. ³ All non-hydrogen atoms were refined with anisotropic atomic displacement parameters. H atoms were finally included in their calculated positions. A final refinement on F^2 with 3853 unique intensities and 228 parameters converged at $\omega R(F^2) = 0.0678$ (R(F) = 0.0308) for 3613 observed reflections with $I > 2\sigma(I)$.

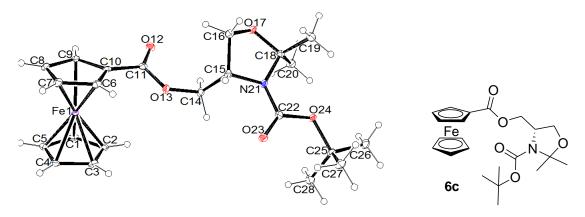

Compound 6c

The sample was studied with graphite monochromatized $Mo_{K\alpha}$ radiation ($\lambda = 0.71073$ Å). The structure was solved by direct methods using the SIR97 program,¹ and then refined with full-matrix least-square methods based on F² (SHELX-97)² with the aid of the WINGX program.³ The contribution of the disordered solvents to the calculated structure factors was estimated following the BYPASS algorithm,⁴ implemented as the SQUEEZE option in PLATON.⁵ A new data set, free of solvent contribution, was then used in the final refinement. All non-hydrogen atoms were refined with anisotropic atomic displacement parameters. H atoms were finally included in their calculated positions. A final refinement on F^2 with 5111 unique intensities and 267 parameters converged at $\omega R(F^2) = 0.0737$ (R(F) = 0.0305) for 4778 observed reflections with $I > 2\sigma(I)$.

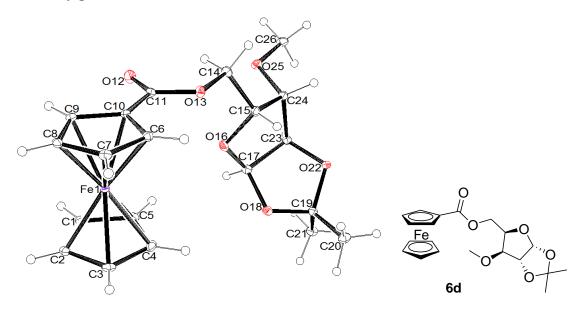

The sample was studied with graphite monochromatized $Mo_{K\alpha}$ radiation ($\lambda = 0.71073$ Å). The structure was solved by direct methods using the SIR97 program,¹ and then refined with full-matrix least-square methods based on F² (SHELX-97)² with the aid of the WINGX program.³ All non-hydrogen atoms were refined with anisotropic atomic displacement parameters. H atoms were finally included in their calculated positions. A final refinement on F^2 with 3747 unique intensities and 247 parameters converged at $\omega R(F^2) = 0.0555$ (R(F) = 0.0226) for 3679 observed reflections with $I > 2\sigma(I)$.

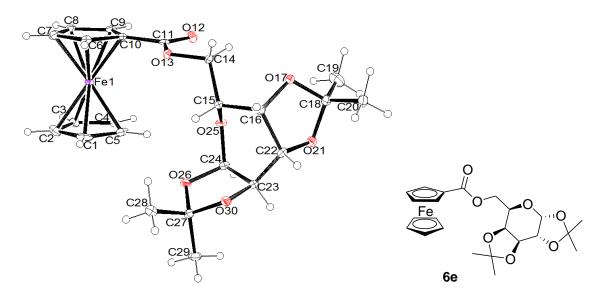

The sample was studied with graphite monochromatized $Mo_{K\alpha}$ radiation ($\lambda = 0.71073$ Å). The structure was solved by direct methods using the SIR97 program,¹ and then refined with full-matrix least-square methods based on F² (SHELX-97)² with the aid of the WINGX program.³ The contribution of the disordered solvents to the calculated structure factors was estimated following the BYPASS algorithm,⁴ implemented as the SQUEEZE option in PLATON.⁵ A new data set, free of solvent contribution, was then used in the final refinement. All non-hydrogen atoms were refined with anisotropic atomic displacement parameters. H atoms were finally included in their calculated positions. A final refinement on F² with 4456 unique intensities and 284 parameters converged at $\omega R(F^2) = 0.0805$ (R(F) = 0.0347) for 4236 observed reflections with I > 2 σ (I).

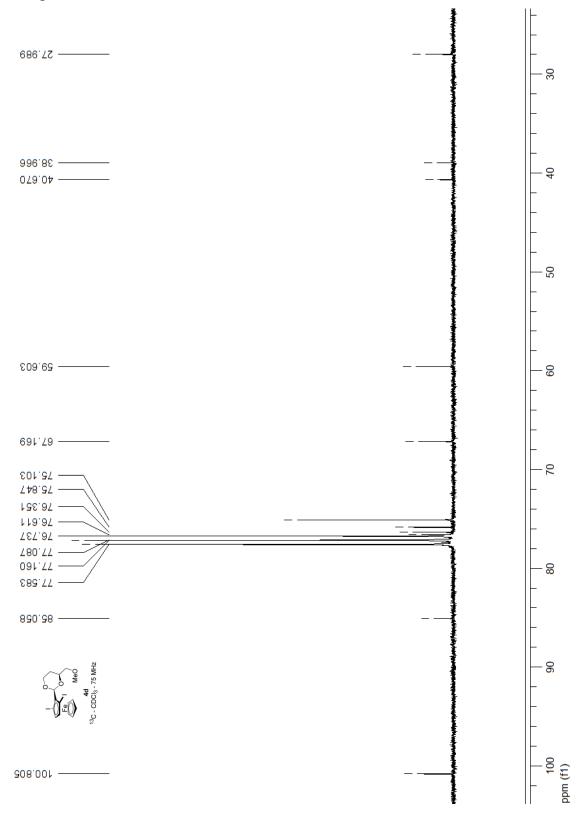
Compound 2c, ¹³C-NMR



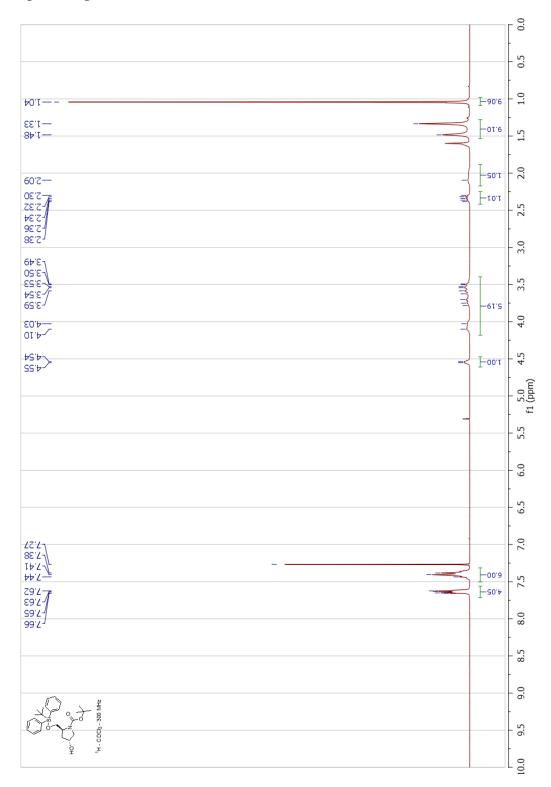

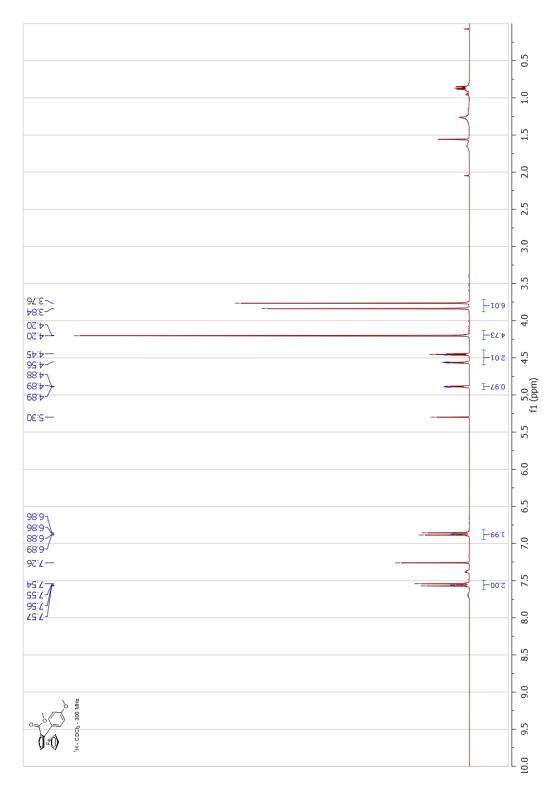
Compound S_P-11n, ¹H-NMR
