Erodibility

Definition

"Sensitivity of the soil to erosion"

"Easiness of the soil to release particles to the water flow"

A fuzzy concept, even if a key parameter in models of soil erosion by water

Assessment of an erodibility index

Comparison of erosion fluxes between field plots and statistical analysis (R-USLE)

Tests of structural stability, i.e. laboratory measurements of the strength of soil aggregates

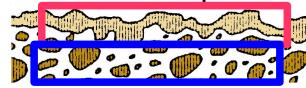

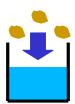

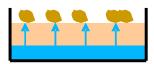
Method "Le Bissonnais, 1996":

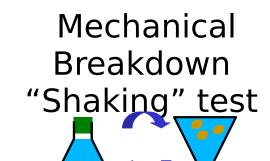
3 tests, based on breakdown mechanisms

Air compression "Fast wetting" test



Differential
Clay Swelling
"Slow wetting" test





- 1) Initial dry aggregates (3-5 mm)
- 2) Test
- 3) Sieving of the fragments

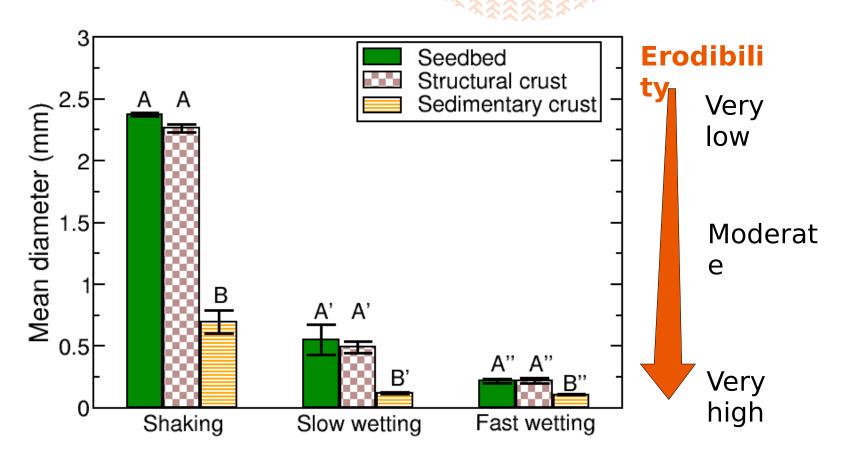
