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THE *p*-ADIC KUMMER–LEOPOLDT CONSTANT NORMALIZED *p*-ADIC REGULATOR

ABSTRACT. The *p*-adic Kummer–Leopoldt constant κ_K of a number field K is (under the Leopoldt conjecture for p in K) the least integer c such that for all n large enough, any global unit ε of K, which is locally (at the p-places) a p^{n+c} th power, is necessarily a p^n th power of a global unit of K. This constant has been computed by J. Assim and T. Nguyen Quang Do using Iwasawa's technics. In this short Note, we give an elementary p-adic proof of their result and the class field theory interpretation of κ_K by means of Abelian p-ramification theory over K. Then, from this, we give a natural definition of the normalized p-adic regulator of K for any K and any $p \geq 2$.

1. NOTATIONS

Let K be a number field and let $p \geq 2$ be a prime number. We assume in the sequel that K satisfies the Leopoldt conjecture at p. Denote by E_K the group of principal global units of K (i.e., units $\varepsilon \equiv 1 \pmod{\prod_{\mathfrak{p}\mid p}}$) and by

$$U_K := \left\{ u \in \prod_{\mathfrak{p}|p} K_{\mathfrak{p}}^{\times}, \ u = 1 + x, \ x \in \prod_{\mathfrak{p}|p} \mathfrak{p} \right\} \& W_K = \operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_p}(U_K),$$

the \mathbb{Z}_p -module of local units at p and its torsion subgroup, where $K_{\mathfrak{p}}$ is the **p**-completion of K.

The *p*-adic logarithm log is defined on 1 + x, $x \in \prod_{\mathfrak{p}|p} \mathfrak{p}$, by means of the series $\log(1+x) = \sum_{i\geq 1} (-1)^{i+1} \frac{x^i}{i} \in \prod_{\mathfrak{p}|p} K_{\mathfrak{p}}$. The kernel of log in U_K is W_K .

We consider the diagonal embedding $E_K \to U_K$ and its natural extension $E_K \otimes \mathbb{Z}_p \to U_K$ whose image is \overline{E}_K , the topological closure of E_K in U_K . In the sequel, these embeddings shall be understood.

2. The Kummer-Leopoldt constant

This notion comes from the Kummer lemma (see [W3, Theorem 5.36]), that is to say, if the prime number p is "regular", the cyclotomic field $K = \mathbb{Q}(\mu_p)$ satisfies the following property for the whole group E'_K of global units of K: any $\varepsilon \in E'_K$, congruent to a rational integer modulo p, is a pth power in E'_K .

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In fact, $\varepsilon \equiv a \pmod{p}$, with $a \in \mathbb{Z}$, implies $\varepsilon^{p-1} \equiv a^{p-1} \equiv 1 \pmod{p}$. So we shall write, equivalently, the Kummer property with principal units:

any $\varepsilon \in E_K$, congruent to 1 modulo p, is a pth power in E_K .

From [A], [L], [O], [S], [W1], [W2] (see the rather intricate history in [AN]) one can study this property and its generalizations with various technics. Give the following definition (from [AN]):

Definition 2.1. Let K be a number field satisfying the Leopoldt conjecture at the prime $p \ge 2$. Let E_K be the group of principal global units of K. We call Kummer–Leopoldt constant (denoted $\kappa = \kappa_K$), the smallest integer c such that the following condition is fulfilled:

for all $n \gg 0$, any unit $\varepsilon \in E_K$, such that $\varepsilon \in U_K^{p^{n+c}}$, is necessarily in $E_K^{p^n}$.

Remark 2.2. The existence of κ comes from the classical characterization of Leopoldt's conjecture given, for instance, in [Gr1, Theorem III.3.6.2 (iv)]. If the Leopoldt conjecture is not satisfied, we can find a sequence $\varepsilon_n \in E_K \setminus E_K^p$ such that $\log(\varepsilon_n) \to 0$ (i.e., $\varepsilon_n \in U_K^{p^m} \cdot W_K$, with $m \to \infty$ when $n \to \infty$); since W_K is finite, taking a suitable power of ε_n , we see that κ does not exist in that case.

We have the following p-adic result giving p^{κ} under the Leopoldt conjecture:

Theorem 2.3. Denote by E_K the group of principal global units of K, then by U_K the \mathbb{Z}_p -module of principal local units at p and by W_K its torsion subgroup. Let κ_K (Definition 2.1) be the Kummer–Leopoldt constant; then p^{κ_K} is the exponent of the finite group $\operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_p}(\log(U_K)/\log(\overline{E}_K))$, where \overline{E}_K is the closure of E_K in U_K (hence $\log(\overline{E}_K) = \mathbb{Z}_p \log(E_K)$).

Proof. (i) (κ is suitable). Let $n \gg 0$ and let $\varepsilon \in E_K$ be such that $\varepsilon = u^{p^{n+\kappa}}$, $u \in U_K$ (thus ε is arbitrary near from 1, depending on the choice of $n \gg 0$). Then $\log(\varepsilon) = p^n \cdot (p^{\kappa} \cdot \log(u)) = p^n \cdot \log(\overline{\eta})$ with $\overline{\eta} \in \overline{E}_K$. So, writting

$$\overline{\eta} = \eta(N) \cdot u_N, \ \eta(N) \in E_K, \ u_N \equiv 1 \pmod{p^N}, \ N \to \infty,$$

we get $\log(\varepsilon) = p^n \cdot \log(\eta(N)) + p^n \cdot \log(u_N)$ giving

$$\varepsilon = \eta(N)^{p^n} \cdot u_N^{p^n} \cdot \xi, \ \xi \in W_K.$$

But ξ is near from 1, whence $\xi = 1$. Then

$$\varepsilon = \eta(N)^{p^n} \cdot u'_N, \ u'_N \to 1 \text{ as } N \to \infty;$$

so $u'_N = \varepsilon \cdot \eta(N)^{-p^n}$ is a global unit, arbitrary near from 1, hence, because of the Leopoldt conjecture (loc. cit. in Remark 2.2), of the form $\varphi_N^{p^n}$ with $\varphi_N \in E_K, \varphi_N \to 1$ as $N \to \infty$ (recall that *n* is arbitrary but fixed), giving $\varepsilon = \eta(N)^{p^n} \cdot \varphi_N^{p^n}$, whence:

$$\varepsilon \in E_K^{p^n}$$
.

(ii) (κ is the least solution). Suppose there exists $c < \kappa$ having the property given in Definition 2.1.

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Let $u_0 \in U_K$ be such that $\log(u_0)$ is of order p^{κ} in $\operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_p}(\log(U_K)/\log(\overline{E}_K))$; then $\log(u_0^{p^{\kappa}}) = \log(\overline{\varepsilon}_0), \ \overline{\varepsilon}_0 \in \overline{E}_K$. This is equivalent to

$$u_0^{p^{\kappa}} = \overline{\varepsilon}_0 \cdot \xi_0 = \varepsilon(N) \cdot u_N \cdot \xi_0, \ \varepsilon(N) \in E_K, \ u_N \in U_K, \ \xi_0 \in W_K$$

(with $u_N \to 1$ when $N \to \infty$), hence, for any $n \gg 0$,

$$u_0^{p^{n+\kappa}} = \varepsilon(N)^{p^n} \cdot u_N^{p^n}$$

Taking N large enough, we can suppose that $u_N = v_N^{p^{2\kappa}}$, $v_N \in U_K$ arbitrary near from 1; because of the above relation, $\log(v_N)$ is of finite order modulo $\log(\overline{E}_K)$, thus $\log(v_N^{p^{\kappa}}) \in \log(\overline{E}_K)$. This is sufficient, for $u'_0 := u_0 \cdot v_N^{-p^{\kappa}}$, to get $\log(u'_0)$ of order p^{κ} modulo $\log(\overline{E}_K)$. So we can write:

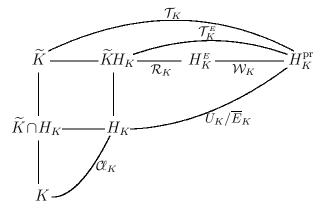
$$\varepsilon(N)^{p^n} = u_0^{p^{n+\kappa}} \cdot u_N^{-p^n} = u_0^{p^{n+\kappa}} \cdot (v_N^{-p^\kappa})^{p^{n+\kappa}} = u_0^{p^{n+\kappa}} \in U_K^{p^{n+(\kappa-c)+c}}$$

but, by assumption on c, we obtain $\varepsilon(N)^{p^n} = \eta_0^{p^{n+(\kappa-c)}}$, $\eta_0 \in E_K$; thus, the above relation $u_0^{\prime p^{n+\kappa}} = u_0^{\prime p^{n+(\kappa-c)+c}} = \eta_0^{p^{n+(\kappa-c)}}$, yields to:

$$p^c \cdot \log(u'_0) = \log(\eta_0) \in \log(E_K)$$
 (absurd).

3. Interpretation of κ_K – Fundamental exact sequence

Consider the following diagram, under the Leopoldt conjecture for p in K (diagram given in [Gr1], § III.2, (c), Fig. 2.2):



where \widetilde{K} is the compositum of the \mathbb{Z}_p -extensions of K, \mathcal{C}_K the p-class group in the ordinary sense, H_K the p-Hilbert class field, H_K^{pr} the maximal Abelian p-ramified (i.e., unramified outside p) pro-p-extension of K; then we put $\mathcal{T}_K^E := \operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_p}(\operatorname{Gal}(H_K^{\mathrm{pr}}/H_K)) \subseteq \mathcal{T}_K := \operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_p}(\operatorname{Gal}(H_K^{\mathrm{pr}}/K))$, and $\mathcal{R}_K \simeq \operatorname{Gal}(H_K^E/\widetilde{K}H_K)$.

By class field theory, $\operatorname{Gal}(H_K^{\operatorname{pr}}/H_K)$ is canonically isomorphic to U_K/\overline{E}_K in which the image of $\mathcal{W}_K := W_K/\mu_K$ (where μ_K is the group of roots of unity of K of p-power order) fixes H_K^E , which is (except possibly if p = 2 in the "special case") equal to the Bertrandias–Payan field H_K^{bp} , $\operatorname{Gal}(H_K^{\operatorname{bp}}/\widetilde{K})$ being then the Bertrandias–Payan module (also evoked in [AN] about the calculation of κ ; see also [Gr2, Références] for some history about this module).

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Lemma 3.1. We have (without any assumption on K and p) the following exact sequence:

$$1 \longrightarrow W_K / \operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_p}(\overline{E}_K) \longrightarrow \operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_p}(U_K / \overline{E}_K)$$
$$\xrightarrow{\log} \operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_p}(\log(U_K) / \log(\overline{E}_K)) \longrightarrow 0.$$

Proof. From [Gr1, Lemma 4.2.4]: the surjectivity comes from the fact that if $u \in U_K$ is such that $p^n \log(u) = \log(\overline{\varepsilon}), \overline{\varepsilon} \in \overline{E}_K$, then $u^{p^n} = \overline{\varepsilon} \cdot \xi$ for $\xi \in W_K$, hence there exists $m \ge n$ such that $u^{p^m} \in \overline{E}_K$, whence $u \in \operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_p}(U_K/\overline{E}_K)$; u is a preimage. If u is such that $\log(u) \in \log(\overline{E}_K), u = \overline{\varepsilon} \cdot \xi$ as above, giving the kernel equal to $\overline{E}_K \cdot W_K/\overline{E}_K = W_K/\operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_p}(\overline{E}_K)$.

Assuming the Leopoldt conjecture, we have $\operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_p}(\overline{E}_K) = \mu_K$ ([Gr1, Corollary III.3.6.3]). Thus, $W_K/\operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_p}(\overline{E}_K) = W_K/\mu_K = \mathcal{W}_K$ and the exact sequence in the Lemma becomes, with the notations of the diagram:

$$1 \longrightarrow \mathcal{W}_K \longrightarrow \mathcal{T}_K^E \xrightarrow{\log} \mathcal{R}_K \longrightarrow 0,$$

Corollary 3.2. Under the Leopoldt conjecture for p in K, the Kummer– Leopoldt constant κ of K is 0 if and only if $\mathcal{R}_K = 1$, which is equivalent to $#\mathcal{T}_K = [H_K : \widetilde{K} \cap H_K] \cdot #\mathcal{W}_K.$

Corollary 3.3. If the prime number p is regular, then $\kappa = 0$ for the field $\mathbb{Q}(\mu_p)$ (Kummer's lemma).

Proof. In this case we know that the cyclotomic field $\mathbb{Q}(\mu_p)$ is regular in the meaning of [GJ, Théorème & Définition 2.1], so $\mathcal{T}_K = 1$ giving the result. \Box

For instance, if $\mathcal{T}_K = 1$ (in which case $\kappa_K = 0$) then in any *p*-primitively ramified *p*-extension *L* of *K* (definition and examples in [Gr1, IV.3, (b); IV.3.5.1], after [Gr4, Theorem 1, II.2] in the direction of the notion of "*p*rational field"), we get $\mathcal{T}_L = 1$ whence $\kappa_L = 0$.

Many generalizations are available which are left to the reader.

4. Normalized p-adic regulator of a number field

Definition 4.1. Under the Leopoldt conjecture for p in K, we call

$$\mathcal{R}_K := \operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_p} \left(\log(U_K) / \log(\overline{E}_K) \right) \simeq \operatorname{Gal}(H_K^E / \overline{K} H_K),$$

(or its order) the normalized p-adic regulator of K, whatever the number field K and the prime number $p \ge 2$.

For instance, in the totally real case, from Coates's formula [C, Appendix], we get easily:

$$#\mathcal{R}_K \sim \frac{1}{2} \cdot \frac{\left(\mathbb{Z}_p : \log(\mathcal{N}_{K/\mathbb{Q}}(U_K))\right)}{#\mathcal{W}_K \cdot \prod_{\mathfrak{p}|p} \mathcal{N}\mathfrak{p}} \cdot \frac{R_K}{\sqrt{D_K}},$$

where \sim means equality up to a *p*-adic unit factor, where R_K is the usual *p*-adic regulator and D_K the discriminant of K.

In the real Galois case, with $p \neq 2$ unramified in K/\mathbb{Q} , we get, as defined in [Gr3, Definition 2.3], $\#\mathcal{R}_K \sim \frac{R_K}{p^{[K:\mathbb{Q}]-1}}$.

One computes that $\#\mathcal{R}_K = 1$ for all imaginary quadratic fields and all p.

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
