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# THE $p$-ADIC KUMMER-LEOPOLDT CONSTANT NORMALIZED $p$-ADIC REGULATOR

#### Abstract

The p-adic Kummer-Leopoldt constant $\kappa_{K}$ of a number field $K$ is (assuming the Leopoldt conjecture) the least integer $c$ such that for all $n \gg 0$, any global unit of $K$, which is locally a $p^{n+c}$ th power at the $p$-places, is necessarily the $p^{n}$ th power of a global unit of $K$. This constant has been computed by Assim \& Nguyen Quang Do using Iwasawa's techniques, after intricate studies and calculations by many authors. We give an elementary $p$-adic proof and an improvement of these results, then a class field theory interpretation of $\kappa_{K}$. We give some applications (including generalizations of Kummer's lemma on regular $p$ th cyclotomic fields) and a natural definition of the normalized $p$-adic regulator for any $K$ and any $p \geq 2$. This is done without analytical computations, using only class field theory and especially the properties of the so-called $p$-torsion group $\mathcal{T}_{K}$ of Abelian $p$-ramification theory over $K$.


Résumé. - La constante $p$-adique de Kummer-Leopoldt $\kappa_{K}$ d'un corps de nombres $K$ est (sous la conjecture de Leopoldt) le plus petit entier $c$ tel que pour tout $n \gg 0$, toute unité globale de $K$, qui est localement une puissance $p^{n+c}$-ième en les $p$-places, est nécessairement puissance $p^{n}$-ième d'une unité globale de $K$. Cette constante a été calculée par Assim \& Nguyen Quang Do en utilisant les techniques d'Iwasawa, après des études et calculs complexes par divers auteurs. Nous donnons une preuve $p$-adique élémentaire et une qénéralisation de ces résultats, puis une interprétation corps de classes de $\kappa_{K}$. Nous donnons certaines applications (dont des généralisations du lemme de Kummer sur les $p$-corps cyclotomiques réguliers) et une définition naturelle du régulateur $p$-adique normalisé pour tous $K \& p \geq 2$. Ceci est fait sans calculs analytiques, en utilisant uniquement le corps de classes et tout spécialement les propriétés du fameux $p$-groupe de torsion $\mathcal{T}_{K}$ de la théorie de la $p$-ramification Abélienne sur $K$.

## 1. Notations

Let $K$ be a number field and let $p \geq 2$ be a prime number; we denote by $\mathfrak{p} \mid p$ the prime ideals of $K$ dividing $p$. Consider the group $E_{K}$ of $p$-principal global units of $K$ (i.e., units $\varepsilon \equiv 1\left(\bmod \prod_{\mathfrak{p} \mid p} \mathfrak{p}\right)$ ), so that the index of $E_{K}$ in the group of units is prime to $p$. For each $\mathfrak{p} \mid p$, let $K_{\mathfrak{p}}$ be the $\mathfrak{p}$-completion of $K$ and $\overline{\mathfrak{p}}$ the corresponding prime ideal of the ring of integers of $K_{\mathfrak{p}}$; then let

$$
U_{K}:=\left\{u \in \underset{\mathfrak{p} \mid p}{ } K_{\mathfrak{p}}^{\times}, u=1+x, x \in \bigoplus_{\mathfrak{p} \mid p} \overline{\mathfrak{p}}\right\} \quad \& \quad W_{K}:=\operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(U_{K}\right),
$$

the $\mathbb{Z}_{p}$-module of principal local units at $p$ and its torsion subgroup.

The $p$-adic logarithm $\log$ is defined on $1+x, x \in \bigoplus_{\mathfrak{p} \mid p} \bar{p}$, by means of the series $\log (1+x)=\sum_{i \geq 1}(-1)^{i+1} \frac{x^{i}}{i} \in \bigoplus_{\mathfrak{p} \mid p} K_{\mathfrak{p}}$. Its kernel in $U_{K}$ is $W_{K}$ [15, Proposition 5.6]. We consider the diagonal embedding $E_{K} \longrightarrow U_{K}$ and its natural extension $E_{K} \otimes$ $\mathbb{Z}_{p} \longrightarrow U_{K}$ whose image is $\bar{E}_{K}$, the topological closure of $E_{K}$ in $U_{K}$.
In the sequel, these embeddings shall be understood; moreover, we assume in this paper that $K$ satisfies the Leopoldt conjecture at $p$, which is equivalent to the condition $\mathrm{rk}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)=\operatorname{rk}_{\mathbb{Z}}\left(E_{K}\right)$ (see, e.g., [15, §5.5, p. 75]).

## 2. The Kummer-Leopoldt constant

This notion comes from the Kummer lemma (see, e.g., [15, Theorem 5.36]), that is to say, if the odd prime number $p$ is "regular", the cyclotomic field $K=\mathbb{Q}\left(\mu_{p}\right)$ of $p$ th roots of unity satisfies the following property stated for the whole group $E_{K}^{\prime}$ of global units of $K$ :
any $\varepsilon \in E_{K}^{\prime}$, congruent to a rational integer modulo $p$, is a pth power in $E_{K}^{\prime}$.
In fact, $\varepsilon \equiv a(\bmod p)$ with $a \in \mathbb{Z}$, implies $\varepsilon^{p-1} \equiv a^{p-1} \equiv 1(\bmod p)$. So we shall write the Kummer property with $p$-principal units in the more suitable equivalent statement:
any $\varepsilon \in E_{K}$, congruent to 1 modulo $p$, is a pth power in $E_{K}$.
From [1], 11], 13], [14, [16], [17] one can study this property and its generalizations with various techniques (see the rather intricate history in [2]). Give the following definition from [2]:

Definition 2.1. - Let $K$ be a number field satisfying the Leopoldt conjecture at the prime $p \geq 2$. Let $E_{K}$ be the group of p-principal global units of $K$ and let $U_{K}$ be the group of principal local units at the p-places.
We call Kummer-Leopoldt constant (denoted $\kappa_{K}=: \kappa$ ), the smallest integer $c$ such that the following condition is fulfilled:
for all $n \gg 0$, any unit $\varepsilon \in E_{K}$, such that $\varepsilon \in U_{K}^{p^{n+c}}$, is necessarily in $E_{K}^{p^{n}}$.
Remark 2.1. - The existence of $\kappa$ comes from various classical characterizations of Leopoldt's conjecture proved for instance in [5, Theorem III.3.6.2], after [14], $[11$ and oldest Iwasawa papers. Indeed, if the Leopoldt conjecture is not satisfied, we can find a sequence $\varepsilon_{n} \in E_{K} \backslash E_{K}^{p}$ such that $\log \left(\varepsilon_{n}\right) \rightarrow 0$ (i.e., $\varepsilon_{n} \in U_{K}^{p^{m}} \cdot W_{K}$, with $m \rightarrow \infty$ as $n \rightarrow \infty)$; since $W_{K}$ is finite, taking a suitable p-power of $\varepsilon_{n}$, we see that $\kappa$ does not exist in that case.

We shall prove (Theorem 3.1) that in the above definition, the condition "for all $n \gg 0$ " can be replaced by "for all $n \geq 0$ ", subject to introduce the group of global roots of unity of $K$ and a suitable statement.
We have the following first $p$-adic result giving $p^{\kappa}$ under the Leopoldt conjecture:
Theorem 2.1. - Denote by $E_{K}$ the group of p-principal global units of $K$, by $U_{K}$ the $\mathbb{Z}_{p}$-module of principal local units at the p-places, and by $W_{K}$ its torsion subgroup. Let $\kappa_{K}$ be the Kummer-Leopoldt constant (Definition 2.1).
Then $p^{\kappa_{K}}$ is the exponent of the finite group $\operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(\log \left(U_{K}\right) / \log \left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)\right)$, where $\log$ is the p-adic logarithm and $\bar{E}_{K}$ the topological closure of $E_{K}$ in $U_{K}$ (whence the relation $\log \left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)=\mathbb{Z}_{p} \log \left(E_{K}\right)$.

Proof. - Let $p^{\kappa}$ be the exponent of $\operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(\log \left(U_{K}\right) / \log \left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)\right)$.
(i) ( $\kappa$ is suitable). Let $n \gg 0$ and let $\varepsilon \in E_{K}$ be such that

$$
\varepsilon=u^{p^{n+\kappa}}, u \in U_{K}
$$

So $\log (u)$ is of finite order modulo $\log \left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)$ and $\log (\varepsilon)=p^{n} \cdot\left(p^{\kappa} \cdot \log (u)\right)=p^{n} \cdot \log (\bar{\eta})$ with $\bar{\eta} \in \bar{E}_{K}$. By definition of $\bar{E}_{K}$, we can write in $U_{K}$, for all $N \gg 0$,

$$
\bar{\eta}=\eta(N) \cdot u_{N}, \quad \eta(N) \in E_{K}, \quad u_{N} \equiv 1\left(\bmod p^{N}\right)
$$

we get $\log (\varepsilon)=p^{n} \cdot \log (\eta(N))+p^{n} \cdot \log \left(u_{N}\right)$ giving in $U_{K}$

$$
\varepsilon=\eta(N)^{p^{n}} \cdot u_{N}^{p^{n}} \cdot \xi_{N}, \quad \xi_{N} \in W_{K}
$$

But $\xi_{N}$ is near 1 (depending on the choice of $n \gg 0$ ), whence $\xi_{N}=1$ for all $N$, and $\varepsilon=\eta(N)^{p^{n}} \cdot u_{N}^{\prime}, \quad u_{N}^{\prime} \rightarrow 1$ as $N \rightarrow \infty$; so $u_{N}^{\prime}=\varepsilon \cdot \eta(N)^{-p^{n}}$ is a global unit, arbitrary close to 1 , hence, because of Leopoldt's conjecture [5, Theorem III.3.6.2 (iii, iv)], of the form $\varphi_{N}^{p^{n}}$ with $\varphi_{N} \in E_{K}$ (recall that $n$ is large enough, arbitrary, but fixed), giving

$$
\varepsilon=\eta(N)^{p^{n}} \cdot \varphi_{N}^{p^{n}} \in E_{K}^{p^{n}}
$$

(ii) ( $\kappa$ is the least solution). Suppose there exists an integer $c<\kappa$ having the property given in Definition 2.1. Let $u_{0} \in U_{K}$ be such that

$$
\log \left(u_{0}\right) \text { is of order } p^{\kappa} \text { in } \operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(\log \left(U_{K}\right) / \log \left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)\right)
$$

then $\log \left(u_{0}^{p^{\kappa}}\right)=\log \left(\bar{\varepsilon}_{0}\right), \bar{\varepsilon}_{0} \in \bar{E}_{K}$. This is equivalent to

$$
u_{0}^{p^{\kappa}}=\bar{\varepsilon}_{0} \cdot \xi_{0}=\varepsilon(N) \cdot u_{N} \cdot \xi_{0}, \quad \varepsilon(N) \in E_{K}, \quad u_{N} \equiv 1\left(\bmod p^{N}\right), \quad \xi_{0} \in W_{K}
$$

hence, for any $n \gg 0, u_{0}^{p^{n+\kappa}}=\varepsilon(N)^{p^{n}} \cdot u_{N}^{p^{n}}$. Taking $N$ large enough, but fixed, we can suppose that $u_{N}=v^{p^{2 \kappa}}, v \in U_{K}$ near 1 ; because of the above relations, $\log (v)$ is of finite order modulo $\log \left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)$, thus $\log \left(v^{p^{\kappa}}\right) \in \log \left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)$. This is sufficient, for

$$
u_{0}^{\prime}:=u_{0} \cdot v^{-p^{\kappa}}
$$

to get $\log \left(u_{0}^{\prime}\right)$ of order $p^{\kappa}$ modulo $\log \left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)$. So we can write:

$$
\varepsilon(N)^{p^{n}}=u_{0}^{p^{n+\kappa}} \cdot u_{N}^{-p^{n}}=u_{0}^{p^{n+\kappa}} \cdot\left(v^{-p^{\kappa}}\right)^{p^{n+\kappa}}=u_{0}^{p^{n+\kappa}} \in U_{K}^{p^{n+(\kappa-c)+c}}
$$

but, by assumption on $c$ applied to the global unit $\varepsilon(N)^{p^{n}}$, we obtain

$$
\varepsilon(N)^{p^{n}}=\eta_{0}^{p^{n+(\kappa-c)}}, \quad \eta_{0} \in E_{K}
$$

thus, the above relation $u_{0}^{\prime p^{n+\kappa}}=\varepsilon(N)^{p^{n}}=\eta_{0}^{p^{n+(\kappa-c)}}$ yields:

$$
p^{c} \cdot \log \left(u_{0}^{\prime}\right)=\log \left(\eta_{0}\right) \in \log \left(E_{K}\right)
$$

which is absurd since $\log \left(u_{0}^{\prime}\right)$ is of order $p^{\kappa}$ modulo $\log \left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)$.

## 3. Interpretation of $\kappa_{K}$ - Fundamental exact sequence

The following $p$-adic result is valid without any assumption on $K$ and $p$ :
Lemma 3.1. - We have the exact sequence (from [5, Lemma 4.2.4]):

$$
1 \rightarrow W_{K} / \operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(\bar{E}_{K}\right) \longrightarrow \operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(U_{K} / \bar{E}_{K}\right) \xrightarrow{\log } \operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(\log \left(U_{K}\right) / \log \left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)\right) \rightarrow 0
$$

Proof. - The surjectivity comes from the fact that if $u \in U_{K}$ is such that $p^{n} \log (u)=\log (\bar{\varepsilon}), \bar{\varepsilon} \in \bar{E}_{K}$, then $u^{p^{n}}=\bar{\varepsilon} \cdot \xi$ for $\xi \in W_{K}$, hence there exists $m \geq n$ such that $u^{p^{m}} \in \bar{E}_{K}$, whence $u$ gives a preimage in $\operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(U_{K} / \bar{E}_{K}\right)$.
If $u \in U_{K}$ is such that $\log (u) \in \log \left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)$, then $u=\bar{\varepsilon} \cdot \xi$ as above, giving the kernel equal to $\bar{E}_{K} \cdot W_{K} / \bar{E}_{K}=W_{K} / \operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)$.
Corollary 3.1. - Let $\mu_{K}$ be the group of global roots of unity of p-power order of $K$.
Then, under the Leopoldt conjecture for $p$ in $K$, we have $\operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)=\mu_{K}$; thus in that case $W_{K} / \operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)=W_{K} / \mu_{K}$.
Proof. - From [5, Corollary III.3.6.3], [9, Définition 2.11, Proposition 2.12].
Put

$$
\mathcal{W}_{K}:=W_{K} / \mu_{K} \quad \& \quad \mathcal{R}_{K}:=\operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(\log \left(U_{K}\right) / \log \left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)\right)
$$

Then the exact sequence of Lemma 3.1 becomes:

$$
1 \longrightarrow \mathcal{W}_{K} \longrightarrow \operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(U_{K} / \bar{E}_{K}\right) \xrightarrow{\log } \mathcal{R}_{K} \longrightarrow 0
$$

Consider the following diagram (see [5], §III.2, (c), Fig. 2.2), under the Leopoldt conjecture for $p$ in $K$ :

where $\widetilde{K}$ is the compositum of the $\mathbb{Z}_{p}$-extensions, $\mathcal{C l}_{K}$ the $p$-class group, $H_{K}$ the $p$ Hilbert class field, $H_{K}^{\mathrm{pr}}$ the maximal Abelian $p$-ramified (i.e., unramified outside $p$ ) pro- $p$-extension, of $K$. These definitions are given in the ordinary sense when $p=2$ (so that the real infinite places of $K$ are not complexified (= are unramified) in the class fields under consideration which are "real").
By class field theory, $\operatorname{Gal}\left(H_{K}^{\mathrm{pr}} / H_{K}\right) \simeq U_{K} / \bar{E}_{K}$ in which the image of $\mathcal{W}_{K}$ fixes $H_{K}^{\text {reg }}$, the Bertrandias-Payan field, $\operatorname{Gal}\left(H_{K}^{\text {reg }} / \widetilde{K}\right)$ being then the Bertrandias-Payan module, except possibly if $p=2$ in the "special case" (cf. [2] about the calculation of $\kappa$ and the Références in [6] for some history about this module).
But $\mathcal{R}_{K}$ giving $\kappa_{K}$ has, a priori, nothing to do with the definition of the BertrandiasPayan module associated with $p^{r}$-cyclic extensions of $K, r \geq 1$, which are embeddable in cyclic $p$-extensions of $K$ of arbitrary large degree.
Then we put $\mathcal{T}_{K}^{\prime}:=\operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(\operatorname{Gal}\left(H_{K}^{\mathrm{pr}} / H_{K}\right)\right) \subseteq \mathcal{T}_{K}:=\operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(\operatorname{Gal}\left(H_{K}^{\mathrm{pr}} / K\right)\right)$. The group $\mathcal{R}_{K}$ is then isomorphic to $\operatorname{Gal}\left(H_{K}^{\text {reg }} / \widetilde{K} H_{K}\right)$. Of course, for $p \geq p_{0}$ (explicit), $\mathcal{W}_{K}=$ [ $\left.H_{K}: \widetilde{K} \cap H_{K}\right]=1$, whence $\mathcal{R}_{K}=\mathcal{T}_{K}$. We shall see in the Section 5 that $\mathcal{R}_{K} \simeq \mathcal{T}_{K}^{\prime} / \mathcal{W}_{K}$ is closely related to the classical $p$-adic regulator of $K$.

Corollary 3.2. - Under the Leopoldt conjecture for $p$ in $K$, the KummerLeopoldt constant $\kappa_{K}$ of $K$ is 0 if and only if $\mathcal{R}_{K}=1$ (i.e., $H_{K}^{\mathrm{reg}}=\widetilde{K} H_{K}$ ).
Proof. - From Theorem 2.1]using the new terminology of the "algebraic regulator" $\mathcal{R}_{K}:=\operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(\log \left(U_{K}\right) / \log \left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)\right)$ whose exponent is $p^{\kappa}$.
Corollary 3.3. - If the prime number $p$ is regular, then $\kappa_{K}=0$ for the field $K=\mathbb{Q}\left(\mu_{p}\right)$ of pth roots of unity, and any unit $\varepsilon \in E_{K}$ such that $\varepsilon \equiv 1(\bmod p)$ is in $E_{K}^{p}$ (Kummer's lemma).
Proof. - (i) We first prove that if the real unit $\varepsilon$ is congruent to 1 modulo $p$ then it is a $p$ th power in $U_{K}$. Put $\varepsilon=1+\alpha \cdot p$ for a $p$-integer $\alpha \in K^{\times}$. Let $K_{0}$ be the maximal real subfield of $K$ and let $\pi_{0}$ be an uniformizing parameter of its $p$-completion. Put $\alpha=a_{0}+\beta \cdot \pi_{0}$ with $a_{0} \in[0, p-1]$ and a $p$-integer $\beta$. Since $\mathrm{N}_{K_{0} / \mathbb{Q}}(\varepsilon)=1$, this yields $a_{0}=0$, whence $\varepsilon=1+\beta \cdot p \cdot \pi_{0}$. The valuation of $p \cdot \pi_{0}$, calculated in $K$, is $p+1$, which is sufficient to get $\varepsilon \in U_{K}^{p}$ (use [15, Proposition 5.7]).
(ii) Then we prove that $\kappa=0$. The cyclotomic field $K=\mathbb{Q}\left(\mu_{p}\right)$ is $p$-regular and p-rational in the meaning of [4, Théorème \& Définition 2.1], so $\mathcal{T}_{K}=1$ giving $\kappa=0$. In other words, $\kappa=0$ is given by a stronger condition ( $p$-rationality of $K$ ) than $\mathcal{R}_{K}=1$.
One may preferably use the general well-known $p$-rank formula (the $p$-rank $\mathrm{rk}_{p}(A)$ of a finite Abelian group $A$ is the $\mathbb{F}_{p}$-dimension of $A / A^{p}$ ), valid for any field $K$ under the Leopoldt conjecture, when the group $\mu_{K}$ of $p$ th roots of unity is nontrivial [5, Proposition III.4.2.2]:

$$
\mathrm{rk}_{p}\left(\mathcal{T}_{K}\right)=\mathrm{rk}_{p}\left(\mathcal{C l}_{K}^{S_{K} \mathrm{res}}\right)+\# S_{K}-1
$$

where $S_{K}$ is the set of prime ideals of $K$ above $p$ and $\mathcal{C} \ell_{K}^{S_{K} \text { res }}$ the $S_{K}$-class group in the restricted sense (when $p=2$ ) equal to the quotient of the $p$-class group of $K$ in the restricted sense by the subgroup generated by the classes of ideals of $S_{K}$; so for $K=\mathbb{Q}\left(\mu_{p}\right)$, we immediately get $\operatorname{rk}_{p}\left(\mathcal{T}_{K}\right)=\operatorname{rk}_{p}\left(\mathcal{C l}_{K}\right)$, which is by definition trivial for regular primes.
Theorem 3.1. - Let $\kappa_{K}$ be the Kummer-Leopoldt constant of $K$ (Definition 2.1) and let $p^{\nu}$ be the exponent of $\mathcal{W}_{K}=W_{K} / \mu_{K}$, where $W_{K}=\operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(U_{K}\right)$ and $\mu_{K}$ is the group of global roots of unity of $K$ of p-power order.(1)
The property defining $\kappa_{K}$ can be improved as follows:
(i) If $\nu \geq 1$, for all $n \geq 0$, any $\varepsilon \in E_{K}$ such that $\varepsilon \in U_{K}^{p^{n+\kappa_{K}}}$ is necessarily of the form $\varepsilon=\zeta \cdot \eta^{p^{n}}$, with $\zeta \in \mu_{K} \cap W_{K}^{p^{n}}, \eta \in E_{K}$.
(ii) If $\nu=0$, for all $n \geq 0$, any $\varepsilon \in E_{K}$ being in $U_{K}^{p^{n+\kappa_{K}}}$ is necessarily in $E_{K}^{p^{n}}$.

Proof. - Let $n \geq 0$. Suppose that $\varepsilon=u^{p^{n+\kappa}}, u \in U_{K}$. So $\log (\varepsilon)=p^{n} \cdot p^{\kappa} \cdot \log (u)=$ $p^{n} \cdot \log (\bar{\eta}), \bar{\eta} \in \bar{E}_{K}$; thus $\bar{\eta}=\eta(N) \cdot u_{N}$, with $\eta(N) \in E_{K}, u_{N} \equiv 1\left(\bmod p^{N}\right)$, for all $N \gg 0$, and $\log (\varepsilon)=p^{n} \cdot \log (\eta(N))+p^{n} \cdot \log \left(u_{N}\right)$ giving in $U_{K}$

$$
\varepsilon=\eta(N)^{p^{n}} \cdot u_{N}^{p^{n}} \cdot \xi_{N}, \quad \xi_{N} \in W_{K}, \text { for all } N \gg 0
$$

Taking $N$ in a suitable infinite subset of $\mathbb{N}$, we can suppose $\xi_{N}=\xi$ independent of $N \rightarrow \infty$. Then $\xi=\left(\varepsilon \cdot \eta(N)^{-p^{n}}\right) \cdot u_{N}^{-p^{n}} \in \operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)$, whence $\xi=\zeta \in \mu_{K}$ because of Leopoldt's conjecture (loc. cit. in proof of Corollary 3.1). Then

u^{p^{n+\kappa}}=\varepsilon=\eta(N)^{p^{n}} \cdot u_{N}^{p^{n}} \cdot \zeta=\eta(N)^{p^{n}} \cdot u_{N}^{\prime} \cdot \zeta, \quad u_{N}^{\prime}\left(\in E_{K}\right) \rightarrow 1 \text { as } N \rightarrow \infty
$$
whence $\varepsilon$ of the form $\eta(N)^{p^{n}} \cdot \varphi_{N}^{p^{n}} \cdot \zeta, \varphi_{N} \in E_{K}$, for $N \gg 0$. So $\varepsilon=\zeta \cdot \eta^{p^{n}}$, with $\eta \in E_{K}$ and $\zeta=\varepsilon \cdot \eta^{-p^{n}} \in \mu_{K} \cap W_{K}^{p^{n}}$, since $\varepsilon$ is a local $p^{n}$ th power.
If $\nu=0, W_{K}=\mu_{K}$ and $\zeta \in \mu_{K} \cap W_{K}^{p^{n}}=\mu_{K}^{p^{n}}$ is a $p^{n}$ th power.

## 4. Remarks and applications

As above, we assume the Leopoldt conjecture for $p$ in the fields under consideration.
(a) The condition $\varepsilon \in U_{K}^{p^{n+\kappa}}=\bigoplus_{\mathfrak{p} \mid p} U_{\mathfrak{p}}^{p^{n+\kappa}}$, where $U_{\mathfrak{p}}:=1+\overline{\mathfrak{p}}$, may be translated, in the framework of Kummer's lemma, into a less precise condition of the form $\varepsilon \equiv 1\left(\bmod \prod_{\mathfrak{p} \mid p} \mathfrak{p}^{m_{\mathfrak{p}}(n, \kappa)}\right)$ for suitable minimal exponents $m_{\mathfrak{p}}(n, \kappa)$ giving local $p^{n+\kappa}$ th powers. This was used by most of the cited references with $p$-adic analytical calculations using the fact that $\# \mathcal{T}_{K}$ is, roughly speaking, a product "class number" $\times$ "regulator" from $p$-adic $L$-functions, giving an upper bound for $\kappa$ (it is the analytic way used in [16] and [13] to generalize Kummer's lemma when $p$ is not regular).
(b) If $\mathcal{T}_{K}=1$ (in which case $\kappa=0$ ), the field $K$ is said to be a $p$-rational field (see [5, §IV.3], 4, 10, 12]). Then in any p-primitively ramified $p$-extension $L$ of $K$ (definition and examples in [5, § IV.3, (b); § IV.3.5.1], after [8, Theorem 1, § II.2]), we get $\mathcal{T}_{L}=1$ whence $\kappa_{L}=0$.
The following examples illustrate this principle:
(i) The $p^{m}$-cyclotomic fields. The above applies for the fields $K_{m}:=\mathbb{Q}\left(\mu_{p^{m}}\right)$ of $p^{m}$-roots of unity when the prime $p$ is regular, since we have seen that $\mathcal{T}_{\mathbb{Q}\left(\mu_{p}\right)}=1$.
(ii) Some $p$-rational $p$-extensions of $\mathbb{Q}(p=2$ and $p=3)$. The following fields have a Kummer-Leopoldt constant $\kappa=0$ ([5, Example IV.3.5.1], after [8, § III]):

- The real Abelian 2-extensions of $\mathbb{Q}$, subfields of the fields $\mathbb{Q}\left(\mu_{2 \infty}\right) \cdot \mathbb{Q}(\sqrt{\ell}), \ell \equiv 3$ $(\bmod 8)$, and $\mathbb{Q}\left(\mu_{2 \infty}\right) \cdot \mathbb{Q}\left(\sqrt{\sqrt{\ell} \frac{a-\sqrt{\ell}}{2}}\right), \ell=a^{2}+4 b^{2} \equiv 5(\bmod 8)$.
- The real Abelian 3-extensions of $\mathbb{Q}$, subfields of the fields $\mathbb{Q}\left(\mu_{3 \infty}\right) \cdot k_{\ell}, \ell \equiv 4,7$ $(\bmod 9)$, where $k_{\ell}$ is the cyclic cubic field of conductor $\ell$.
(c) When $\mu_{K}=1$, the formula giving $\operatorname{rk}_{p}\left(\mathcal{T}_{K}\right)$, used in the proof of Kummer's lemma (Corollary 3.3), must be replaced by a formula deduced from the "reflection theorem": let $K^{\prime}:=K\left(\zeta_{p}\right)$, where $\zeta_{p}$ is a primitive $p$ th root of unity; then

$$
\mathrm{rk}_{p}\left(\mathcal{T}_{K}\right)=\mathrm{rk}_{\omega}\left(\mathcal{C}_{K^{\prime}}^{S_{K^{\prime}} \mathrm{res}}\right)+\sum_{\mathfrak{p} \mid p} \delta_{\mathfrak{p}}-\delta
$$

which links the $p$-rank of $\mathcal{T}_{K}$ to that of the $\omega$-component of the $p$-group of $S_{K^{\prime \prime}}$-ideal classes of the field $K^{\prime}$, where $\omega$ is the Teichmüller character of $\operatorname{Gal}\left(K^{\prime} / K\right), \delta_{\mathfrak{p}}:=1$ or 0 according as the completion $K_{\mathfrak{p}}$ contains $\zeta_{p}$ or not, $\delta:=1$ or 0 according as $\zeta_{p} \in K$ or not (so that $\omega=1$ if and only if $\zeta_{p} \in K$ ).
(d) Unfortunately, $p^{\kappa}$ may be less than $\# \mathcal{R}_{K}$ (hence a fortiori less than $\# \mathcal{T}_{K}$ ) due to the unknown group structure of $\mathcal{R}_{K}$; as usual, when $K / \mathbb{Q}$ is Galois with Galois group $G$, the study of its $G$-structure may give more precise information:
Indeed, to simplify assume $p>2$ unramified in $K$, so that $\log \left(U_{K}\right)$ is isomorphic to $O_{K}$, the direct sum of the rings of integers of the $K_{\mathfrak{p}}, \mathfrak{p} \mid p$; if $\eta=: 1+p \cdot \alpha \in E_{K}$ generates a sub- $G$-module of $E_{K}$, of index prime to $p$ (such a unit does exist since $E_{K} \otimes \mathbb{Q}$ is a monogenic $\mathbb{Q}[G]$-module; cf. [5, Corollary I.3.7.2 \& Remark I.3.7.3]),
the structure of $\mathcal{R}_{K}$ can be easily deduced from the knowledge of $P(\alpha) \equiv \frac{1}{p} \log (\eta)$ modulo a suitable power of $p$, where $P(\alpha)$ is a rational polynomial expression of $\alpha$ generating a sub- $G$-module of $O_{K}$; thus many numerical examples may be obtained. (e) We have given in [7, §8.6] a conjecture saying that, in any fixed number field $K$, we have $\mathcal{T}_{K}=1$ for all $p \gg 0$, giving conjecturally $\kappa=0$ for all $p \gg 0$.

## 5. Normalized $p$-adic regulator of a number field

The previous Section 3 shows that the good notion of $p$-adic regulator comes from the expression of the $p$-adic finite group $\mathcal{R}_{K}$ associated with the class field theory interpretation of $\operatorname{Gal}\left(H_{K}^{\text {reg }} / \widetilde{K} H_{K}\right)$.
For this, recall that $\bar{E}_{K}$ is the topological closure, in the $\mathbb{Z}_{p}$-module $U_{K}$ of principal local units at $p$, of the group of $p$-principal global units of $K$, and $\log$ the $p$-adic logarithm:

Definition 5.1. - Let $K$ be any number field and let $p \geq 2$ be any prime number. Under the Leopoldt conjecture for $p$ in $K$, we call $\mathcal{R}_{K}:=\operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(\log \left(U_{K}\right) / \log \left(\bar{E}_{K}\right)\right)$ (or its order $\# \mathcal{R}_{K}$ ) the normalized $p$-adic regulator of $K$.
We have in the simplest case of totally real number fields (from Coates's formula [3, Appendix] and also [5, Remarks III.2.6.5] for $p=2$ ):
Proposition 5.1. - For any totally real number field $K \neq \mathbb{Q}$, we have, under the Leopoldt conjecture for $p$ in $K$,

$$
\# \mathcal{R}_{K} \sim \frac{1}{2} \cdot \frac{\left(\mathbb{Z}_{p}: \log \left(\mathrm{N}_{K / \mathbb{Q}}\left(U_{K}\right)\right)\right)}{\# \mathcal{W}_{K} \cdot \prod_{\mathfrak{p} \mid p} \mathrm{~Np}} \cdot \frac{R_{K}}{\sqrt{D_{K}}}
$$

where $\sim$ means equality up to a p-adic unit factor, where $R_{K}$ is the usual p-adic regulator [15, §5.5] and $D_{K}$ the discriminant of $K$.
With this expression, we find again classical results obtained by means of analytic computations (e.g., [1, Theorem 6.5]). In the real Galois case, with $p$ unramified in $K / \mathbb{Q}$, we get, as defined in [7, Définition 2.3], $\# \mathcal{R}_{K} \sim \frac{R_{K}}{p[K: \mathbb{Q}]-1}$ for $p \neq 2$ and $\# \mathcal{R}_{K} \sim \frac{1}{2^{d-1}} \frac{R_{K}}{2^{[K: \mathbb{Q}]-1}}$ for $p=2$, where $d$ is the number of prime ideals $\mathfrak{p} \mid 2$ in $K$. Of course, $\# \mathcal{R}_{K}=\# \operatorname{tor}_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\left(\log \left(U_{K}\right)\right)=1$ for $\mathbb{Q}$ and any imaginary quadratic field.

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[^0]:    ${ }^{(1)}$ In the case $\nu=0$, if $\mu_{K}=1$, then $\mu_{K_{\mathfrak{p}}}=1 \forall \mathfrak{p} \in S_{K}$; if $\mu_{K} \neq 1$, then $S_{K}=\{\mathfrak{p}\} \& \mu_{K_{\mathfrak{p}}}=\mu_{K}$.
