ERYNGIOPUS COHENI VACANTE AND GERSON TO SUPERSEDE ERYNGIOPUS  
SUMMERSI VACANTE AND GERSON

Vacante and Gerson (1988) described *Eryngiopus summersi* n. sp. from Italy, being unaware that the specific name *summersi* was already used by Gomaa and El-Enany (1985). Thus, in accordance with the article 57.2 of the International Code of Zoological Nomenclature (ICZN, 2000), we now wish to suggest another specific name for this species, and call it *Eryngiopus coheni* Vacante and Gerson **nom. nov.** The specific name is in honor of our esteemed colleague, Professor E. Cohen, of the Hebrew University in Jerusalem, in appreciation for his many contributions to insect physiology.

We wish to thank Dr. Qing-Hai Fan, Plant Health and Environmental Laboratory, Ministry for Primary Industries, Auckland, New Zealand, for drawing our attention to this synonymy.
