The Standardization Survival Kit (SSK) is an overlay platform dedicated to promoting a wider use of standards within Arts and Humanities. It is conceived as a comprehensive online environment aiming at:


- **documenting** existing standards by providing reference materials,
- fostering the adoption of standards,
- and **communicating** to research communities.

HOW does it work?

The SSK takes a **user-centered** approach. It will guide scholars through all available resources, on the basis of **reference research scenarios** identified at the start of the project. The design intends to provide a **single entry point for both novice and advanced scholars** in **digital methods**.
