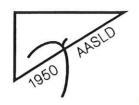

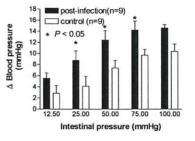
INCREASED SENSITIVITY TO VISCERAL DISTENSION IN POST-NIPPOSTRONGYLUS BRASILIENSIS-INFECTED RATS: INVOLVEMENT OF MAST CELLS AND TACHYKININ NK₂ RECEPTORS.

The pathophysiology of the irritable bowel syndrome (IBS) has been suggested to involve an increase in the number of mast cells in the human gut (Weston $et\ al.$, 1993, $Dig.\ Dis.\ Sci.$, 38, 1590-1595.). The present study investigated whether the long-term hypermastocytosis that occurs in the rat gut following $Nippostrongylus\ brasiliensis$ infection affects visceral sensitivity. A model of visceral pain that utilises jejunal or colonic distension (JD or CD) as the noxious visceral stimulus was used in this investigation. JD or CD, in anaesthetised rats, elicits a marked cardiovascular depressor response. Hyeralgesia or antinociception is characterised by potentiation or inhibition, respectively of the response. The effect of a tachykinin NK2 receptor antagonist on the depressor response was also investigated and compared in healthy (control) and infected rats.

Methods: Control or *N. brasiliensis*-infected (30-34 days post infection) male Wistar rats (300-400g) were anaesthetised with pentobarbitone sodium (60mg/kg). The distal colon or proximal jejunum was distended with a latex balloon via a

polyethylene catheter.



Results: Histological analysis revealed hypermastocytosis in the jejunum but not in the colon at 30 days post-infection. No inflammation (myeloperoxidase activity and histological analysis) was detected in either region. JD or CD (12.5-75 mmHg, 25s every 5min) produced a stimulus-related decrease in blood pressure. The depressor responses to JD at 25, 50 and 75 mmHg

were significantly greater in post-infected rats (see figure, P<0.05). However, the responses elicited by CD were not significantly affected following infection (n=10, P>0.05). The i.p. administration of the tachykinin NK₂ receptor antagonist, SR48968 (0.1-10 mg kg⁻¹) produced a dose-dependent inhibition of the depressor response to JD (75 mmHg, 25s, every 5 min) giving rise to an ED₅₀ of 0.5±0.2 mg kg⁻¹ (n=13) in control rats. In infected rats SR48968 was 3.1-fold more potent against the JD-induced depressor response than in control rats (ED₅₀=0.15±0.1) mg kg⁻¹ (n=13).

Conclusions: This study has shown that the non-inflammatory, chronic changes which occur in rat jejunum post-infection with *N. brasiliensis*, such as hypermastocytosis and neural re-modelling cause increased visceral sensitivity. The data obtained with SR48968 indicate that tachykinin NK₂ receptors mediate nociception in response to noxious JD in anaesthetised rats and are possibly involved in the increased visceral sensitivity observed following intestinal infection.
