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# WEIGHT GAIN MECANISMS AFTER DEEP BRAIN STIMULATION OF THE SUBTHALAMIC NUCLEUS IN PARKINSON'S DISEASE PATIENTS

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INTRODUCTION: Deep brain stimulation (DBS) of the subthalamic nucleus (STN) improves parkinsonian symptoms and attenuate motor fluctuations, it allows antiparkinsonian medication reduction but one of the fequent adverse effect is an important weight gain.

OBJECTIVES: to study the mechanisms of this body weight gain in Parkinson's disease (PD) patients 3 months after surgery.

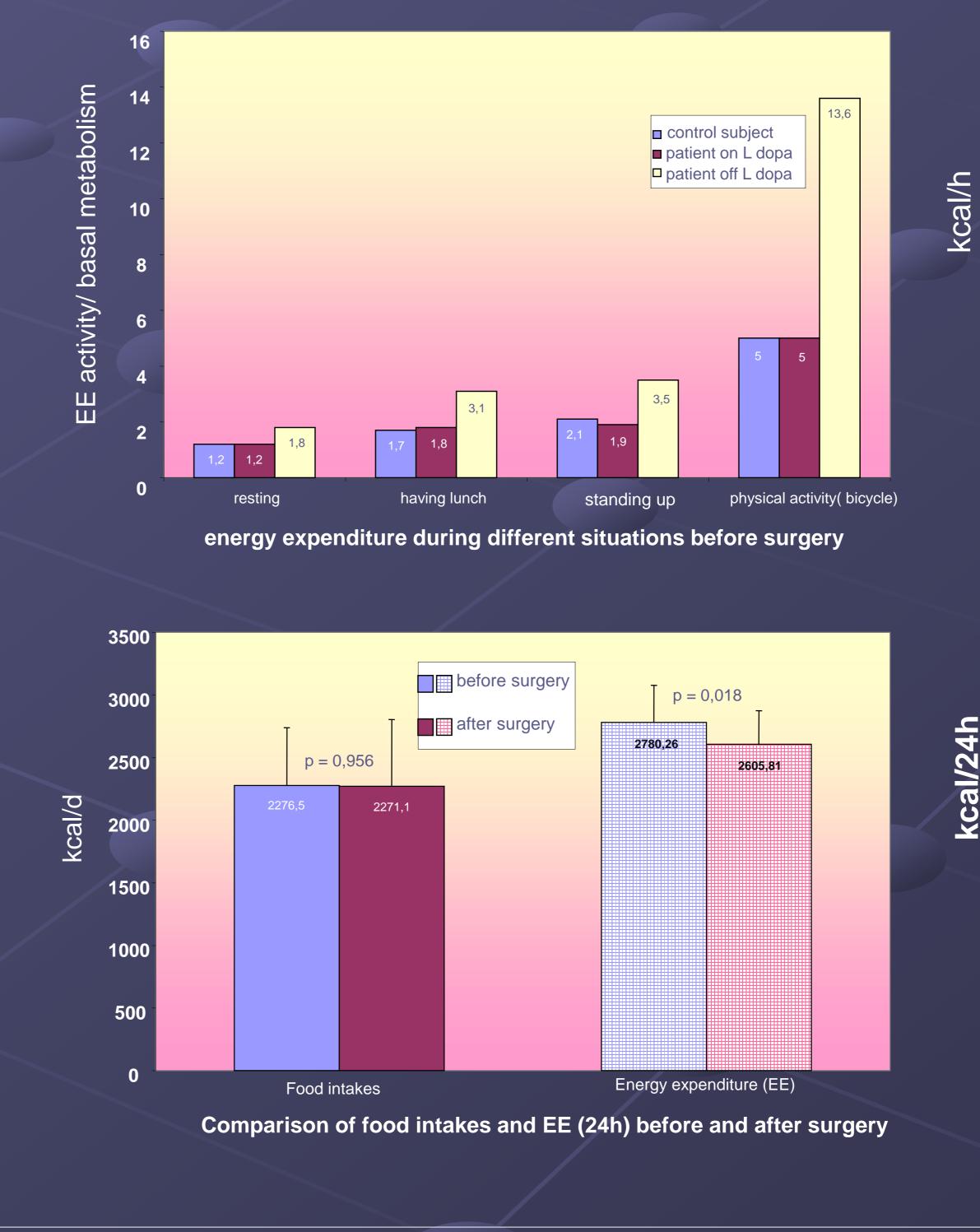


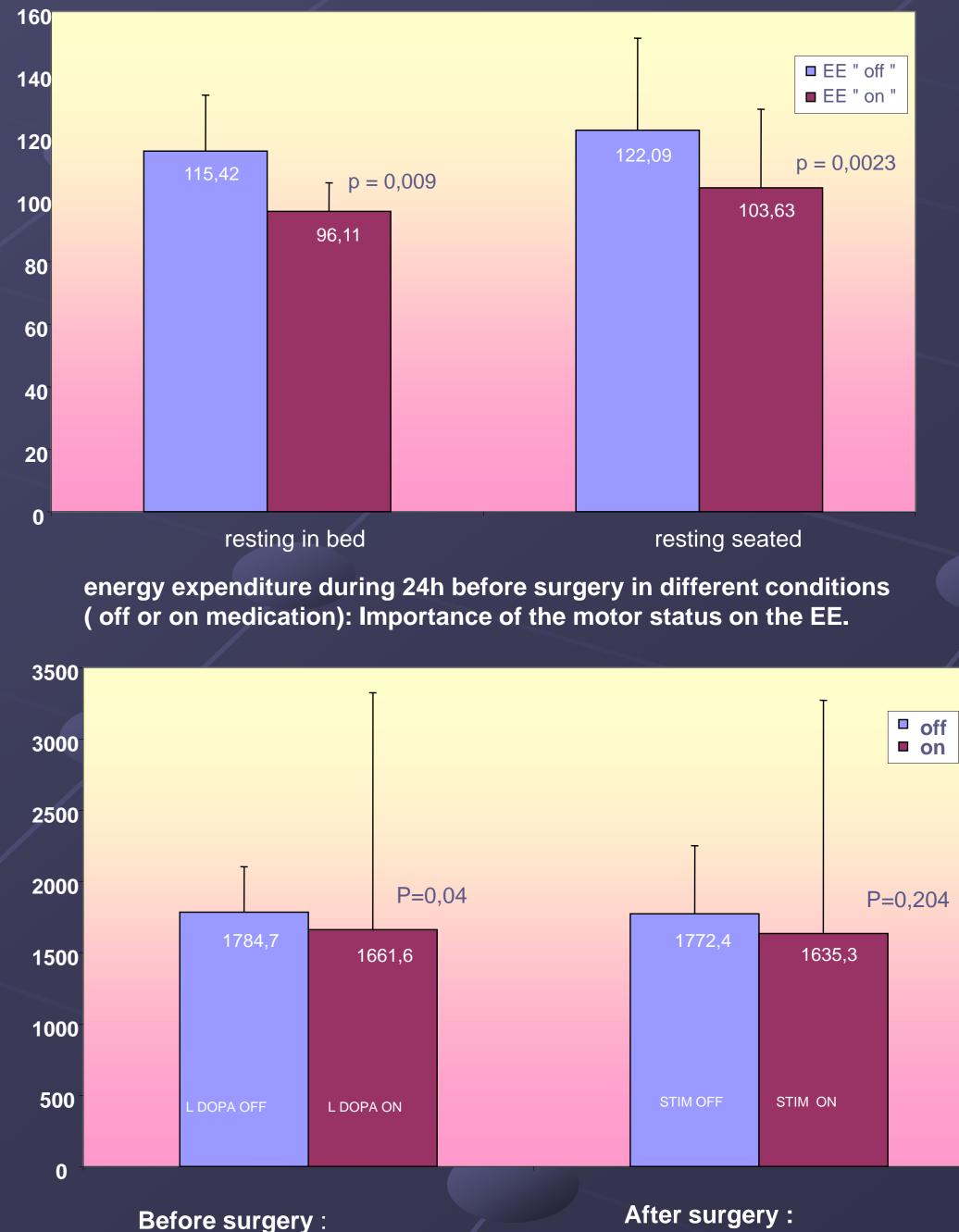


## RESULTS

Discussion: Before surgery, EE is increased during the off condition, especially during a physical activity. After chronic DBS- STN, there is a significant reduction of the motor fluctuations and a decrease of EE whereas the food intakes are not changed.

Conclusion: The gain weight after chronic DBS-STN in PD patients EE after surgery is explained by a normalization of EE without changes of the food intakes.
