

RECOTOX: a network of research sites to implement multiple and multi-scale approaches for a posteriori environmental risk assessment in agricultural systems

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Context and objectives of Recotox

- For many years, the scientific community underlines the lack of long-term and wide scale monitoring of chemical effects on ecosystems.
- Ecotoxicological studies are mostly supported by protocols often far away from realistic environmental conditions.
- Hence, our potential to understand and foresee the ecotoxicological effects remains limited.
- In this respect, the aims of RECOTOX are to:
 - Promote a transverse and integrated research to follow, understand and mitigate the environmental (and health) impacts of pesticides,
 - Analyse the chain "pressures-exposures-impacts" by coordinating and integrating the in natura observation and experiment in spatial ecotoxicology and toxicology,
 - Share between its sites a common culture in ecotoxicology.



Why RECOTOX?

Needs expressed by the scientific community

- Scientists: controlled conditions > in natura, realism, long-term
- Site managers: opening and évolution

What is RECOTOX?

- ❖ A network of sites providing various and additional agro-pedo-climatic conditions to monitor, understand and mitigate the impacts of pesticides (synthetic, metals, biopesticides)
- A scientific and operating project
- To consider:
 - the chain pressure-exposure-impact
 - the factors controlling the vulnerability of the agro-ecosystems, their ability of résilience
 - the exposure to multi-substances, the multiple stress and their long-term effects
 - the various compartments of agro-ecosystems
 - In realistic in natura conditions
- To be the French focal point, partner for discussion with stakeholders (risk assessors and managers, pharmacovigilance...), provider of open data...

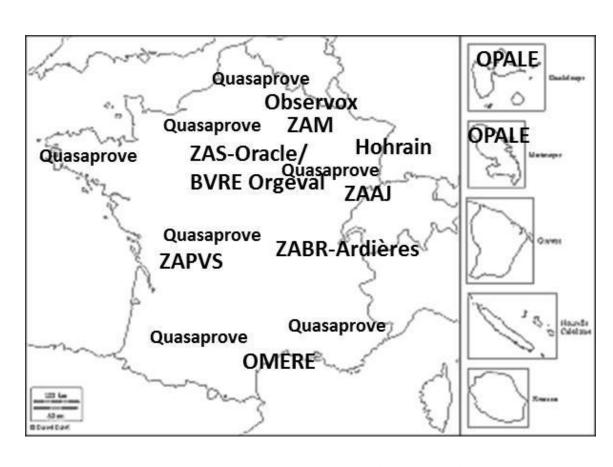

Synergy / interest of the sites

Agro-pedo-climatic conditions

- Crops, vineyards, meadows
- Various degrees of intensification and pesticide use
- Various contexts of contamination (type, amount, temporality and spatialisation)
- Types of soils (continental, tropical...)

Environmental compartments

- Soils
- Plants
- Terrestrial and aquatic fauna
- Surface and ground-waters
- Air

Studied scale

Plot, small (10 km²) large (100 à 1000 km²) catchment

Disciplines, approaches and knowledge

- Soil science, agronomy, hydrology, chemistry, biology, ecotoxicology...
- Survey, field monitoring and experiment, analytical methods, modeling
- Field and laboratory pre-existing instrumentation
- Pre-existing data (including long-term sequences)
- Existing sample collections (soils, DNAs...), passive samplers...
- Links with operational partners



The project, since 2017

- WP0 : animation and management of the network
- WP1: promoting the network for an integrated and transversal research in ecotoxicology

Incubation for innovative projects and production of position papers

WP2: up-scaling approaches in ecotoxicology, from plot to landscape, considering several compartments (soil, water, air, biota)

Support for increasing ecological relevance, up-scaling

WP3: from ecotoxicology to toxicology

Characterisation of exposure, and (human) exposome

 WP4: harmonizing analytical methods and measurements, sharing equipments, documentary resources, technological intelligence within the sites

Methods, skills and equipment sharing, quality management (reliability, traceability)

WP5: developing a focal point to acquire, store, diffuse and archive data for end users at the local and national scale

Metadata standardization, geo-referenced sites, data management plan

WP6: communication, exploitation and dissemination of results

Scientific and technical publication, training, workshops

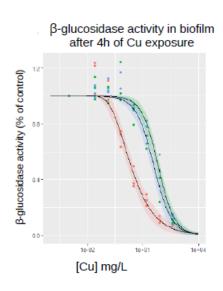


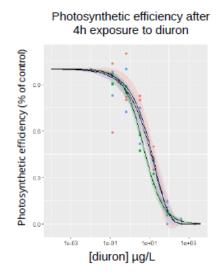




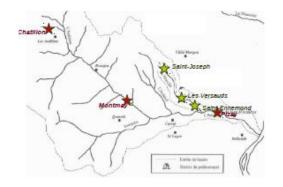
Example of a posteriori environmental risk assessment:

microbial adaptation as a tool to detect pesticides impact on Morcille and <u>Ardières</u> river (Beaujolais, France), may 2017









- Cu is present at higher levels at Montmay and Pizay stations than in the upstream station Chatillon
- Diuron levels are similar within the 3 stations tested
