## ROLE OF SUBSTANCE P AND CGRP IN PAR-2-INDUCED RECTAL HYPERALGESIA IN RATS

Intracolonic infusion to rats of the proteinase-activated receptor-2 (PAR-2) activating-peptide SLIGRL, induced delayed hyperalgesia to rectal distension (RD). This study investigates the involvement of substance-P (SP) and calcitonin gene-related peptide (CGRP) in PAR-2-induced visceral hyperalgesia.

**Methods:** Four groups ( $n=6-8$ ) of male Wistar rats (250-300g) were equipped with an intracolonic (IC) catheter for SLIGRL (0.2mg/rat) or saline (0.25ml/rat) infusions, and electrodes for recording abdominal contraction (mean $\pm$ SEM for 5-min episodes) as visceral pain index. RD was performed by 5min steps of 0.4ml (0 to 1.2mL). Groups 1&2 were infused with SLIGRL or saline (0.25mL/20min) respectively, and the NK1-antagonist SR140333 (1mg/kg-IP): first, SR140333 was administered 30min before SLIGRL or saline; second, 3 days later, SR140333 was administered 10h after SLIGRL or saline. Groups 3&4 were similarly infused with SLIGRL or saline respectively, and the CGRP receptor-antagonist human-CGRP<sub>8-37</sub> (100  $\mu$ g/kg-IV), 20min before and 10h after SLIGRL or saline.

**Results:** SLIGRL (group 1) but not saline (group 2) induced 10h-delayed visceral hyperalgesia to RD ( $45.0\pm4.1$  contractions vs  $33.3\pm3.0$  in basal conditions i.e. 36% increase;  $p<0.05$ ). SR140333 inhibited SLIGRL-induced hyperalgesia when administered before ( $45.0\pm4.1$  vs  $31.2\pm4.5$ ;  $p<0.05$ ) but not after SLIGRL ( $45.0\pm4.1$  vs  $48.0\pm4.8$ ;  $p>0.05$ ).

Similarly, SLIGRL (group 3) but not saline (group 4) increased the number of abdominal contractions by 47% in response to RD (1.2mL) at 10h post-infusion. hCGRP<sub>8-37</sub> did not affect SLIGRL-induced hyperalgesia when administered either before or after SLIGRL.

**Conclusion:** NK1-receptor blockade prevents SLIGRL-induced visceral hyperalgesia which suggests that SP, but not CGRP, is involved in PAR-2-induced sensitization of primary afferent neurons.
