Impedance models¹

$$\hat{z}(s) = \hat{z}_{p}(s) + \hat{z}_{c}(s) \quad (3)$$

$$\hat{z}_{p}(s) = a_{0} + a_{1/2}\sqrt{s} + a_{1}s \quad (4)$$

$$\hat{z}_{c}(s) = \coth(b_{0} + b_{1/2}\sqrt{s} + b_{1}s) \quad (5)$$

- Design a numerical TDIBC for time-domain simulation from acoustical models $(\neq$ state of the art)
- Investigate well-posedness and stability

Challenges of (2):

- Generally does not reduce to Dirichlet, Neumann or Robin
- Acoustical models for z only known in the frequency domain (i.e. $\hat{z}(s)$ only)

Analysis of acoustical impedance models: oscillatory-diffusive representation

- Recast of models (4,5) leads to the definition of \hat{h}_{ρ} and \hat{h}_{c}
 - $\hat{z}_{p}(s) = a_{0} + a_{1/2} \hat{h}_{p}(s) s + a_{1} s$ $\hat{z}_{c}(s) = 1 + e^{-\Delta t s} \hat{h}_{c}(s)$
 - $z_p \star u_n = a_0 u_n + a_{1/2} h_p \star u_n + a_1 u_n$ $z_c \star u_n = u_n + h_c \star u_n (\cdot \Delta t)$
- ▶ Analysis in the complex plane reveals both poles s_n and cut C









$$h(t) = \sum_{n \in \mathbb{Z}} r_n e^{s_n t} + \int_{\mathcal{C}} e^{-\xi t} d\mu(\xi)$$

Convolution is then recast into an observer of an infinite-dimensional state-space representation

$$h \star u_{n} = \sum_{n \in \mathbb{Z}} r_{n} \psi_{n} + \int_{\mathcal{C}} \varphi_{\xi} d\mu (\xi)$$

where variables φ_{ξ} and ψ_n follow a first order dynamic

$$\dot{\varphi}_{\xi} = -\xi \,\varphi_{\xi} + u_n \quad \dot{\psi}_n = s_n \,\psi_n + u_n$$

✓ Time-local realisation of a hereditary operator \checkmark Analysis applicable to a wide class of acoustical models⁴

Numerical impedance boundary condition

- Numerical TDIBC stems from the discretisation of (8)
- ► DoF: N_{ψ} poles s_n and weights $\tilde{r}_n / N_{\varphi}$ poles ξ_k and weight $\tilde{\mu}_k$
- Optimisation of \tilde{r}_n and $\tilde{\mu}_k$ in the frequency domain³ (10)
 - Broadband approximation through elementary linear least squares
 - ✓ No optimisation against experimental data



Spatial discretisation

- Discontinuous Galerkin method (high spatial order) \checkmark
- Numerical flux for the TDIBC⁵: centred, with fictive state q_z

Additional variables $(\psi_n, \varphi_k)_{n,k}$ at each node of Γ_z

Spatial discretisation leads to the following global formulation

 $\dot{X}(t) = AX(t) + CX(t - \Delta t)$

on extended state $X = [p_i \ u_i \ \psi_n \ \varphi_k]$

- ✓ TDIBC integrated at the semi-discrete level
- ▶ If $C \neq 0$, (11) is a delay differential equation (DDE)

Time discretisation

High-order time integration with Runge-Kutta method (a_{ij}, b_j)

Validation

Asymptotic stability study of (11) on a monodimensional case

▶ If $C \neq 0$, use of a continuous extension⁶ $(a_{ii}, b_i(\theta))$

✓ TDIBC does not impact stability limit as long as $\xi_{max} \leq f_{max}^{DG}$

Semigroup theory on extended state⁸ $\left[p(\cdot, t) u(\cdot, t) \psi_n \varphi_{\xi} \right]$ Admissibility conditions for z: reality, passivity, causality and stability'

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
