Highlight a cognitive effort indicator suitable for driving to detect drivers' overload

Kaiser et al, (1996; 1999)

Hearing beeps impact Heart Rate Change (HRC)

→ ECR1

Counting beeps impact HRC differently

→ ECR1 + ECR2

Hearing beeps impact Heart Rate Change (HRC)

→ ECR1

Counting beeps impact HRC differently

 \rightarrow ECR1 + ECR2

- Lawrence & Barry (2009)
- Same results : ECR1 + ECR2
- Counting beeps also impact Event-Related Potentials (**ERPs**)
 - N1 and P3
- Cerebral and cardiac pairs of matched components

ECR1/N1; ECR2/P3

➔ Possibility to infer ERP from HRC





Results > Discussion > Outlook Materials & Methods

18 participants (age 22,7 \pm 1,4), 10 males

3 Within-Subject Factors (2³ = 8 conditions)

- Cognitive Activity: Active vs Passive
- *Difficulty level*: Easy vs Difficult
- Task: Simple vs Dual

Material

Driving Simulator, BioPac MP150 to collect Heart Rate (**HR**)

Data averaged over 1279 events

Comparing each time step

High significant difference

(<.001) between 1.5 and 4.5 s

- Easy Task : Same Results than other authors.
- Difficult Task : larger amplitude.

Results

- 3 Important Results:
- Curves obtained match our assumptions for passive and active

conditions

Significant differences with a driving activity for active and

passive conditions

Difficult task = Higher amplitude than easy task

The intensity of HR acceleration seems reflected the « amount » of effort
Data averaged on 150 events by condition: impossibility to detect the cognitive effort in real-time

Empirically quantified the change in HR from respiratory data

Several explanatory variables

- Amplitude
- Duration
- HR
- Delay
- Time Factor

1 variable to be explained : Changes in HR
