Magnetisation :

- Magnetic Field up to 2 / 3 Tesla
=> few 100 mT while imaging
- Magnetisation along e^- trajectory
- Tilting the sample for in-plane

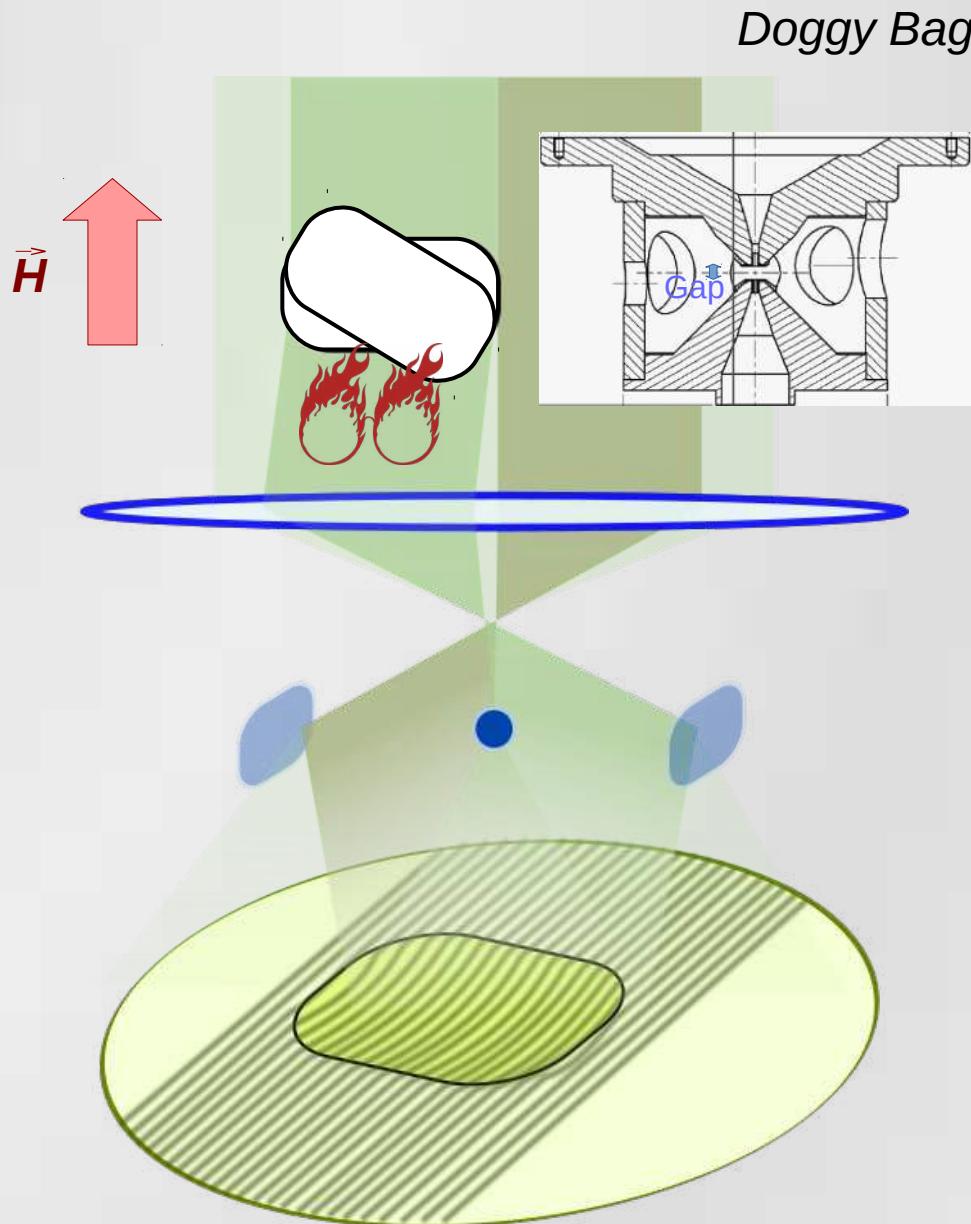

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Temperature :

- Need for dedicated sample holder
 - « Easy » : -100°C to ~ 300°C
 - « Tricky » : 70 K ... 800 °C
 - « Dedicated » : few K 1500°C

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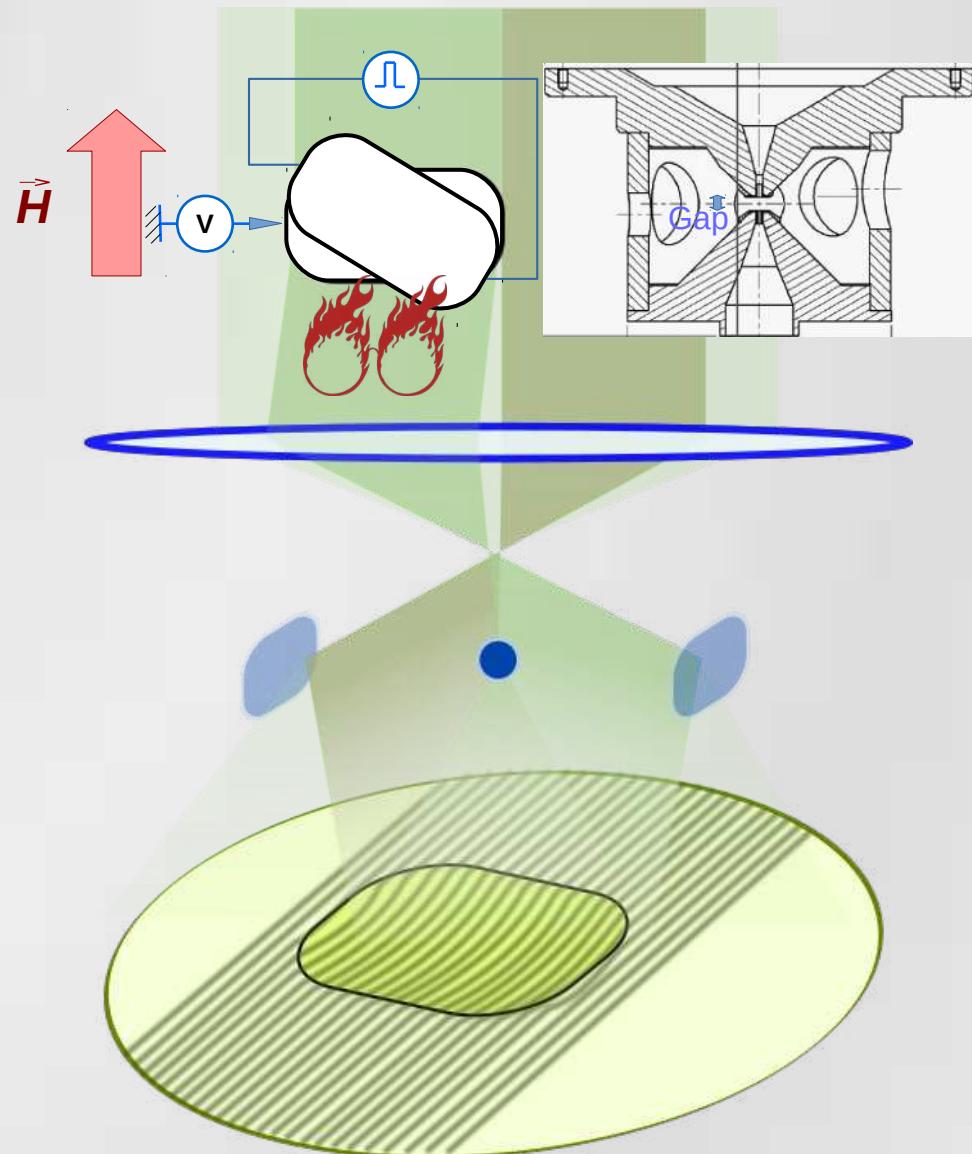
Biasing:

- => Sample holder with up to 10 connexions
- => Nanofab with electron transparency
- => Careful of heating
- => High Frequency is the key !

« STM » probing:

*Local biasing or stress
