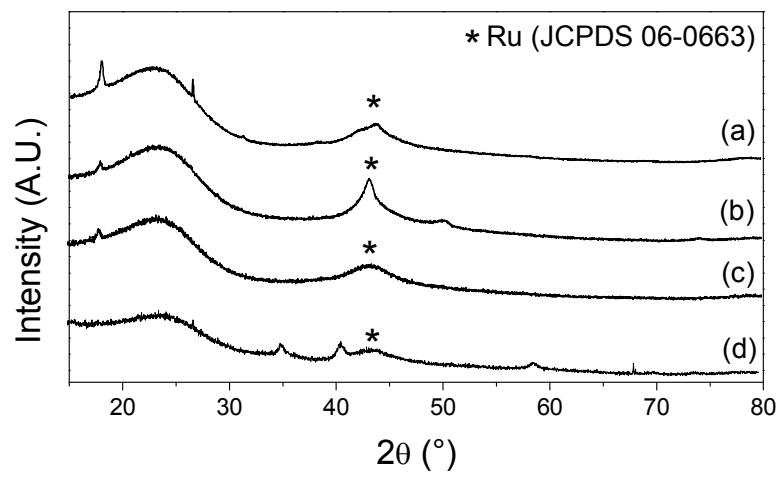

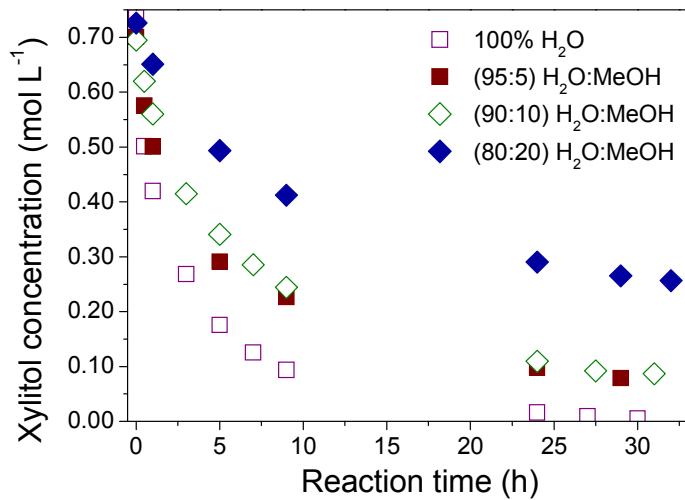

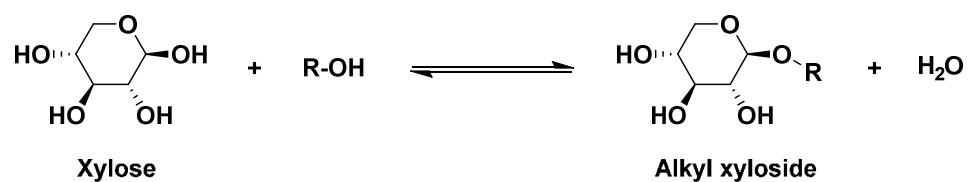


Figure S3. Possible by-product formation from xylose intermediate (pyranose form) in H₂O:ROH solvent.

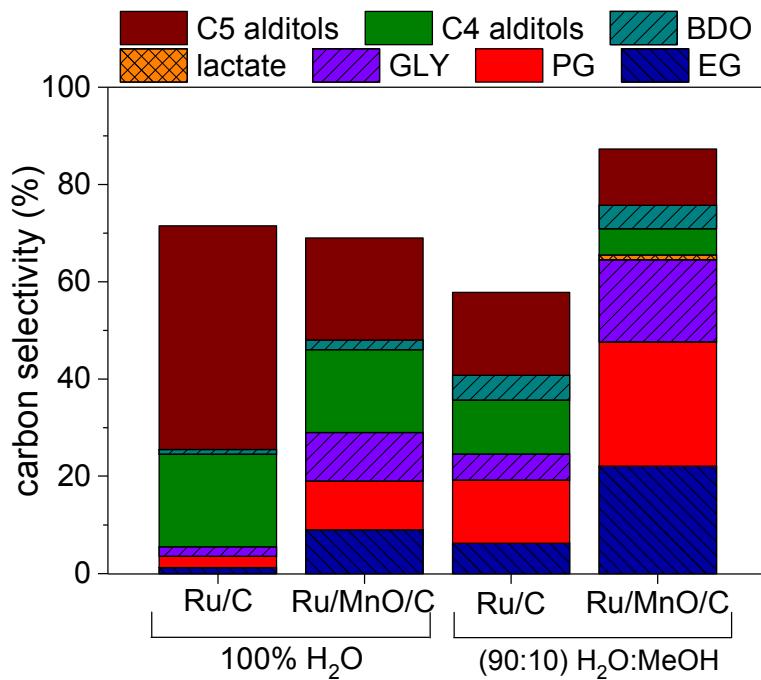

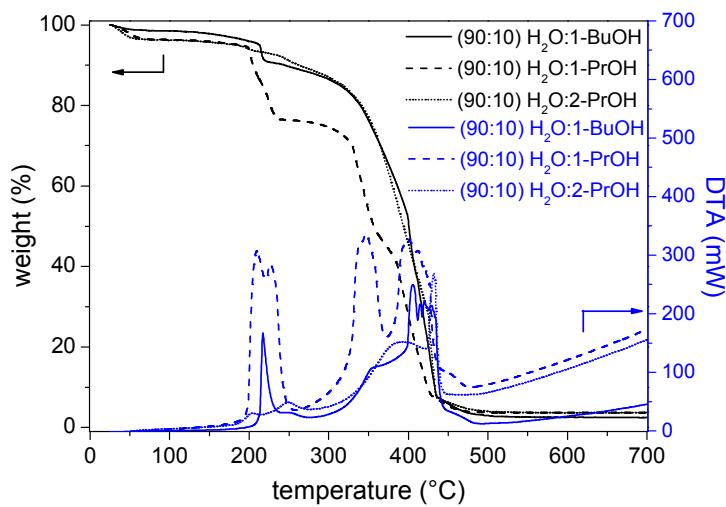

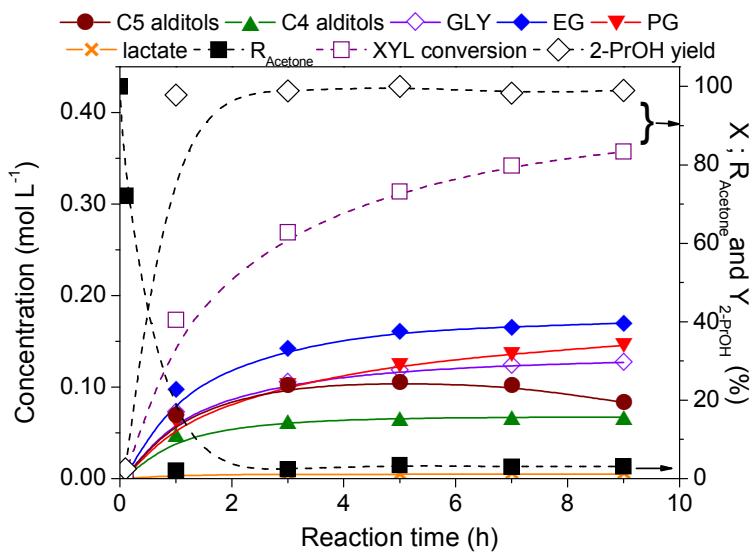
