







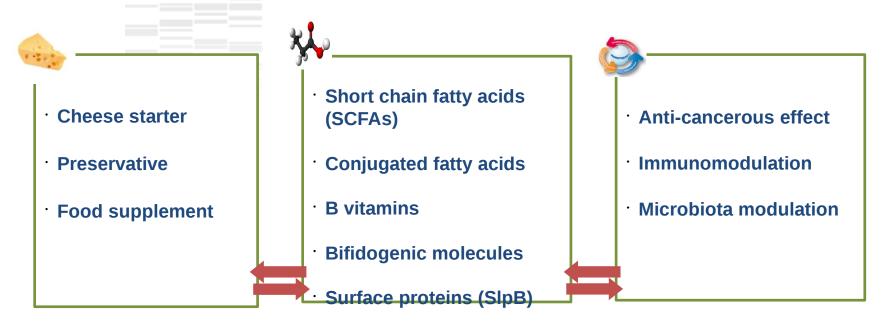

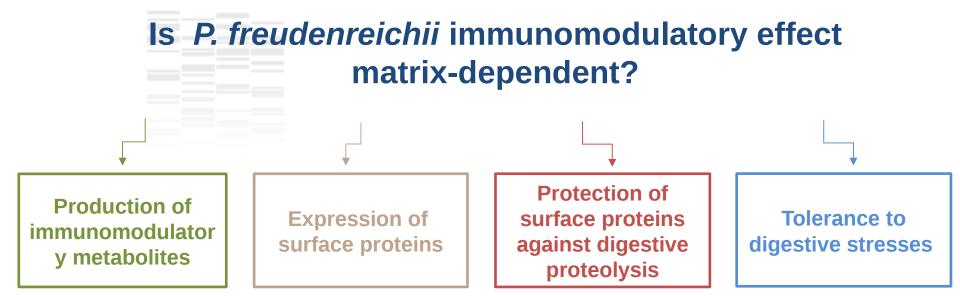

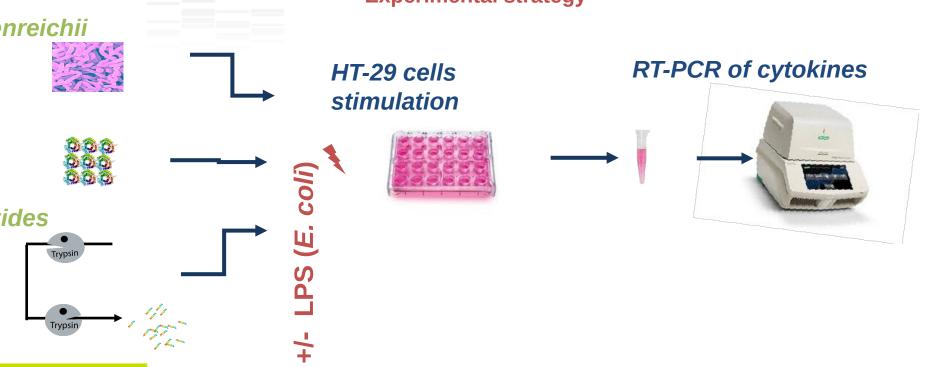


Variation of immunomodulatory property

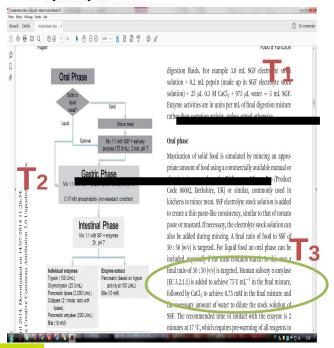






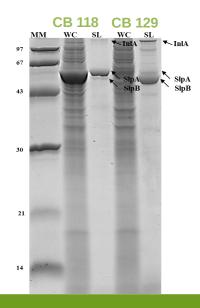
In vitro Static digestion model

- Standard experiment protocol (Minekus, et al. (2014))
 - Relatively easy absence of kinetics



First screening:

- Two strains were tested: *P. freudenreichii CIRM-BIA* 118 & 129
- Bacterial pellet extraction protocol from cheese was perfected -> For Western blot analyses

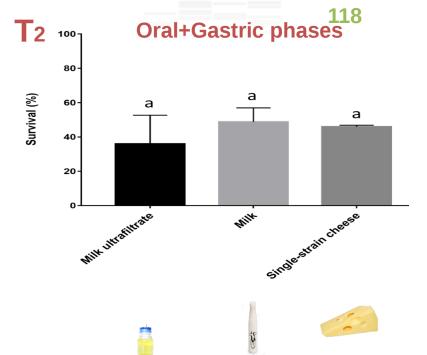


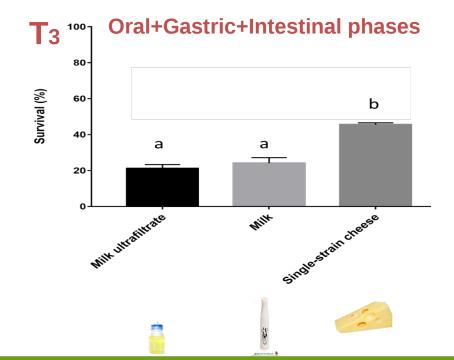

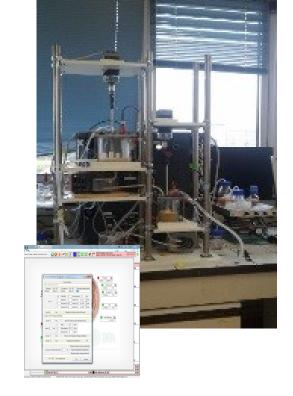






In vitro dynamic digestion model

- Dynamic digestion using Didgi® system:
 - Two compartments: gastric and intestinal
 - Two tested matrices: cheese and milk ultrafiltrate
 - One strain: *P. freudenreichii* CIRM-BIA 129
- Digestion was monitored by StoRM® software
- Same parameters were applied for both matrices: cheese parameters
- Sampling were performed:
 - **Gastric phase**: t=30, 60, 80, 120 et 180 minutes
 - Intestinal phase: t=120, 150, 195 et 240 minutes

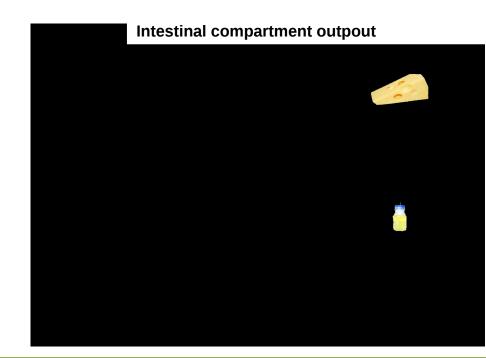






Cheese matrix enhances *P. freudenreichii* survival during *in vitro* dynamic digestion

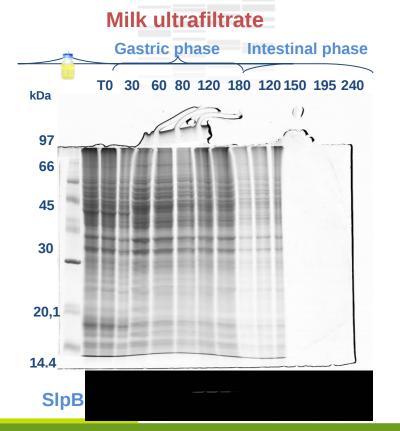


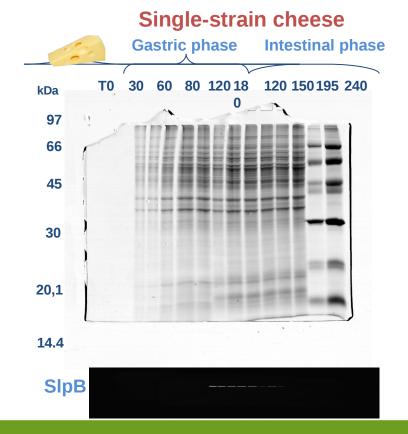

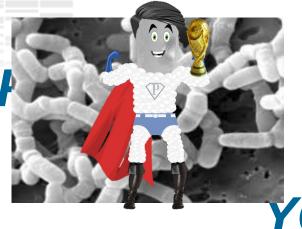
Conclusions & Perspectives

- In vitro P. freudenreichii stress tolerance is matrix-dependent as was showed to be strain-dependent
- Cheese matrix enhances propionibacteria survival to *in vitro* digestive stresses
- Cheese matrix protects SIpB surface protein from *in vitro* digestive proteolysis
- In vivo P. freudenreichii' immunomodulatory properties MAY be matrix-dependent
- In vivo P. freudenreichii' immunomodulatory properties MAY be enhanced by cheese r
- In vivo experiment was carried out in healthy piglets -> confirmation in part of the in vitro results
