

As part of the DARIAH-DESIR project, a series of three-day workshops will be organised in 2018 and 2019, allowing an exchange of ideas between the DARIAH community and Digital Arts & Humanities projects in the US and Australia. The purposes of the workshops are to promote DARIAH tools and services, to initiate collaborations, and above all to exchange knowledge and experience in digital scholarship on an international level.

The **DESIR (DARIAH-ERIC Sustainability Refined)** project sets out to strengthen the sustainability of DARIAH (Digital Research Infrastructure for the Arts and Humanities) and firmly establish it as a long-term leader and partner within arts and humanities communities.

It is led by the DARIAH-EU and includes 15 partners from 12 countries (Belgium, Czech Republic, Finland, France, Germany, Israel, Poland, Portugal, Serbia, Spain, Switzerland and the UK.)
