## Conclusions

Gerry Avrami's model is suitable to simulate the colonization rate by green algae of cement-based mortars.

Gef The results confirmed the ability of CAC to inhibit the algal fouling, even with a thin layer coating (thickness ≈ 1 mm).
Solution by increasing the latency time, decreasing the attachment rate constant and strongly decreasing the attachment rate constant.
