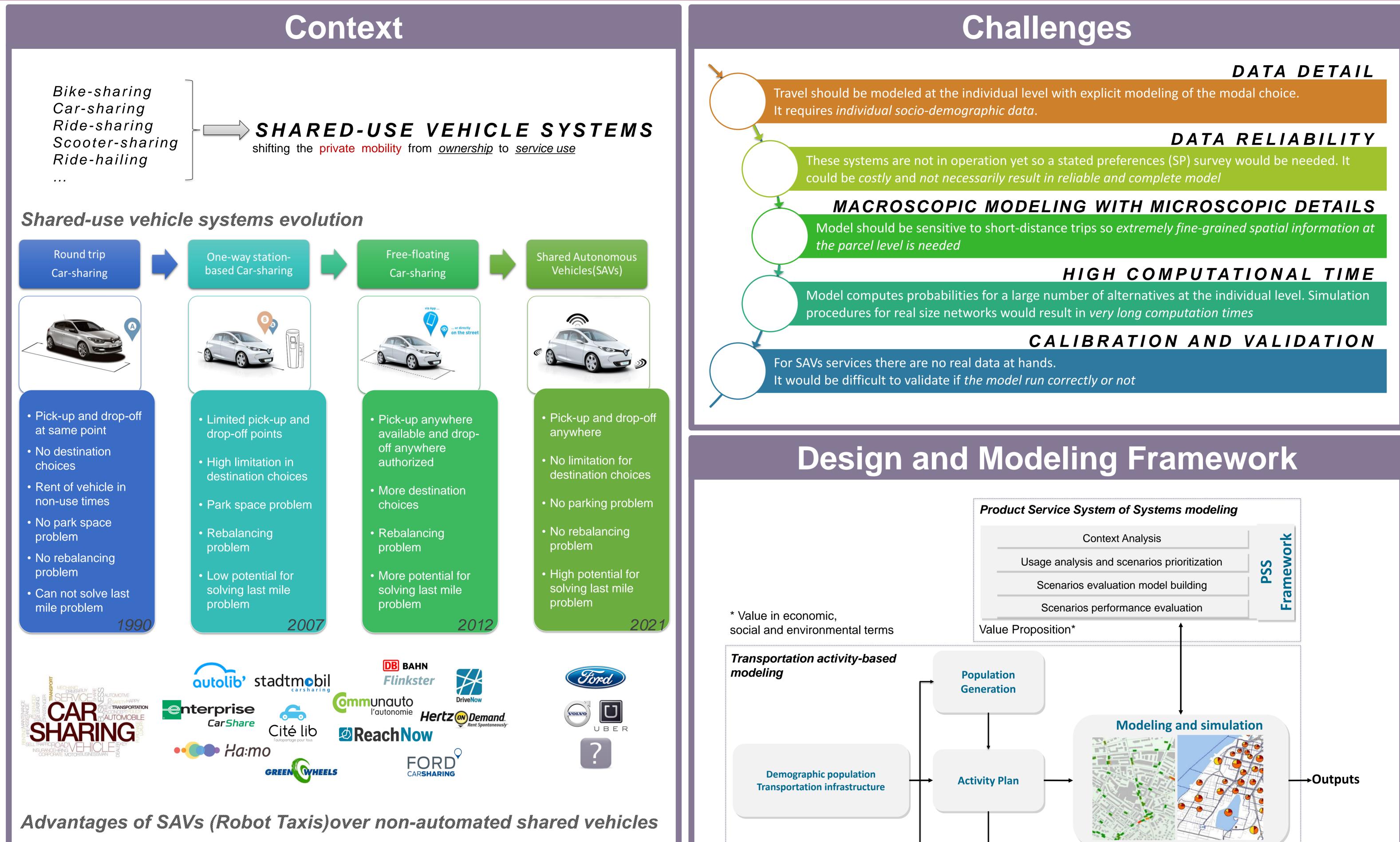

Mode and Route

- Not worrying about whether a shared vehicle will be available when the traveler is ready to departing.
- Anticipate future demand and relocate in advance to better match vehicle supply and travel demand.

Objectives

Two major research axes:

- Develop a design methodology for Robot Taxis systems
- Conduct sensitivity analysis by using multi-modal traffic simulation environment

- Predicting the usefulness of autonomous vehicles
- Estimating the number of shared autonomous vehicles needed to serve an existing demand

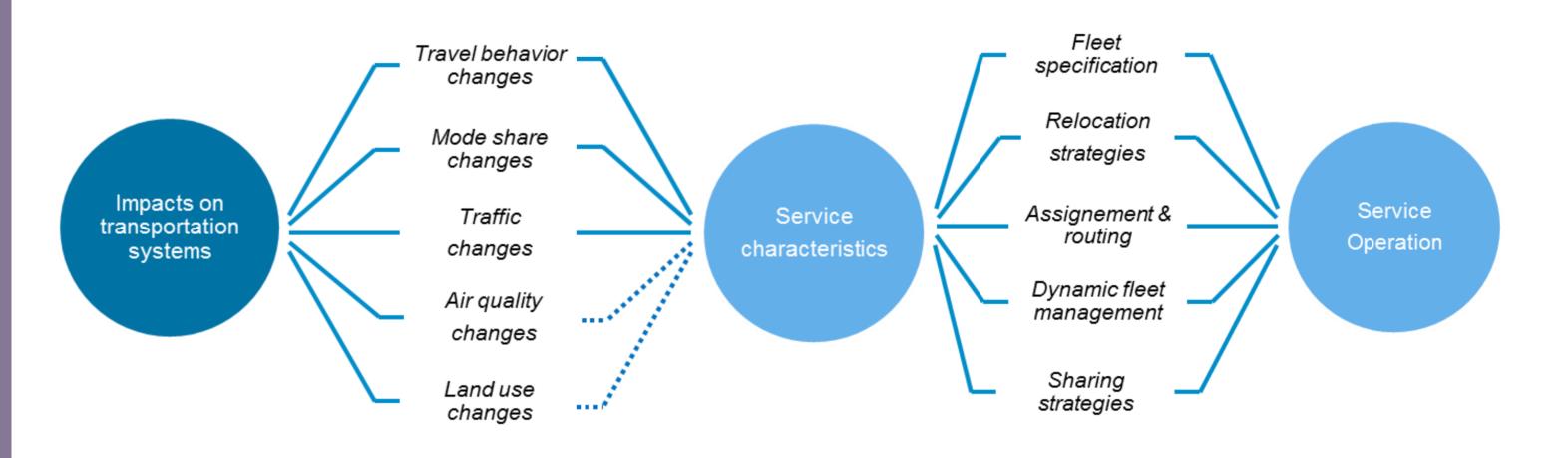
Expected results

- mode choice?

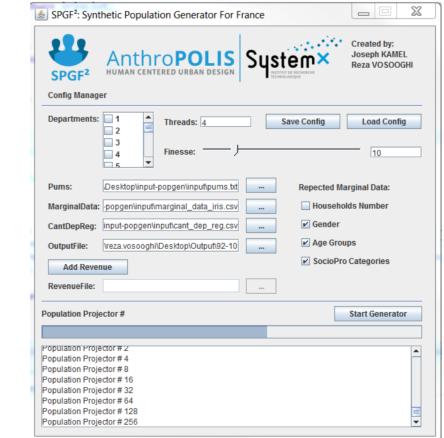

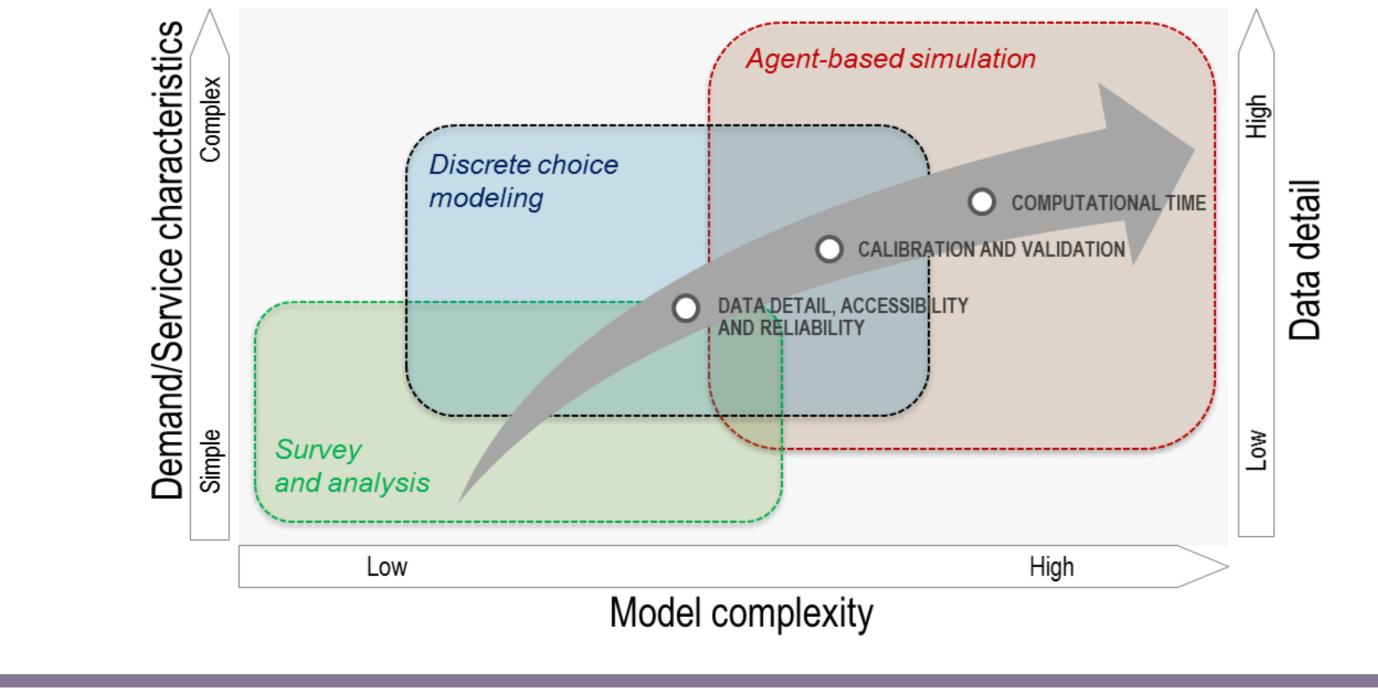
