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Population balance modelling combined to CFD simulations for breakage prediction in SMX+ static mixers

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Highlights:

- The emulsification process is the basis of a wide range of industrial applications
- In-line static mixers achieve high mixing performances in short residence times with low energy consumption
- Steady-state correlations are widely used for the prediction of droplets mean diameter in static mixers, however:
 - The mean diameter is not completely representative of an emulsion with wide size distribution
 - Hydrodynamic equilibrium is usually assumed in these correlations, which is not always true
- A population balance model is proposed in this work in order to predict the full droplet size distribution

Theoretical framework:

PBE accounting for a breakage process:

$$\frac{\partial n(v,t)}{\partial t} = \int_v^\infty \beta(v,v')g(v')n(v',t)dv' - g(v)n(v,t)$$

Breakage frequency : proposed by Alopaeus et *al.*, 2002

 $g(v) = C_1 \varepsilon^{1/3} \operatorname{erfc} \left[\sqrt{C_2 \frac{\sigma}{\rho_c \varepsilon^{2/3} v^{5/9}} + C_3 \frac{\mu_d}{\sqrt{\rho_c \rho_d} \varepsilon^{1/3} v^{4/9}}} \right]$

Daughter distribution function : Beta function with binary breakage

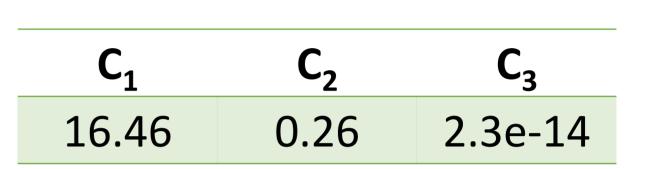
 $\beta(v,v') = 30\frac{m}{n'} \left(\frac{v}{n'}\right)^2 \left(1 - \left(\frac{v}{n'}\right)\right)^2$

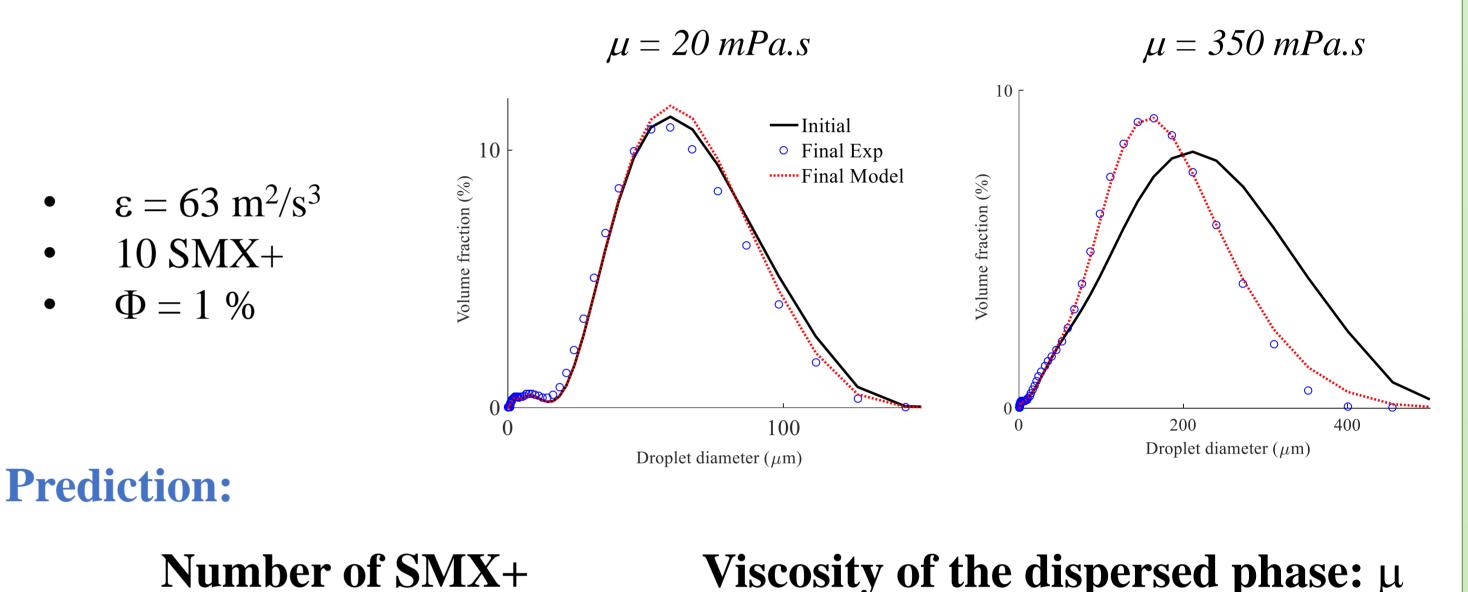
CFD simulations with COMSOL Multiphysics[®] are carried out to \bullet predict the energy dissipation rate : ε

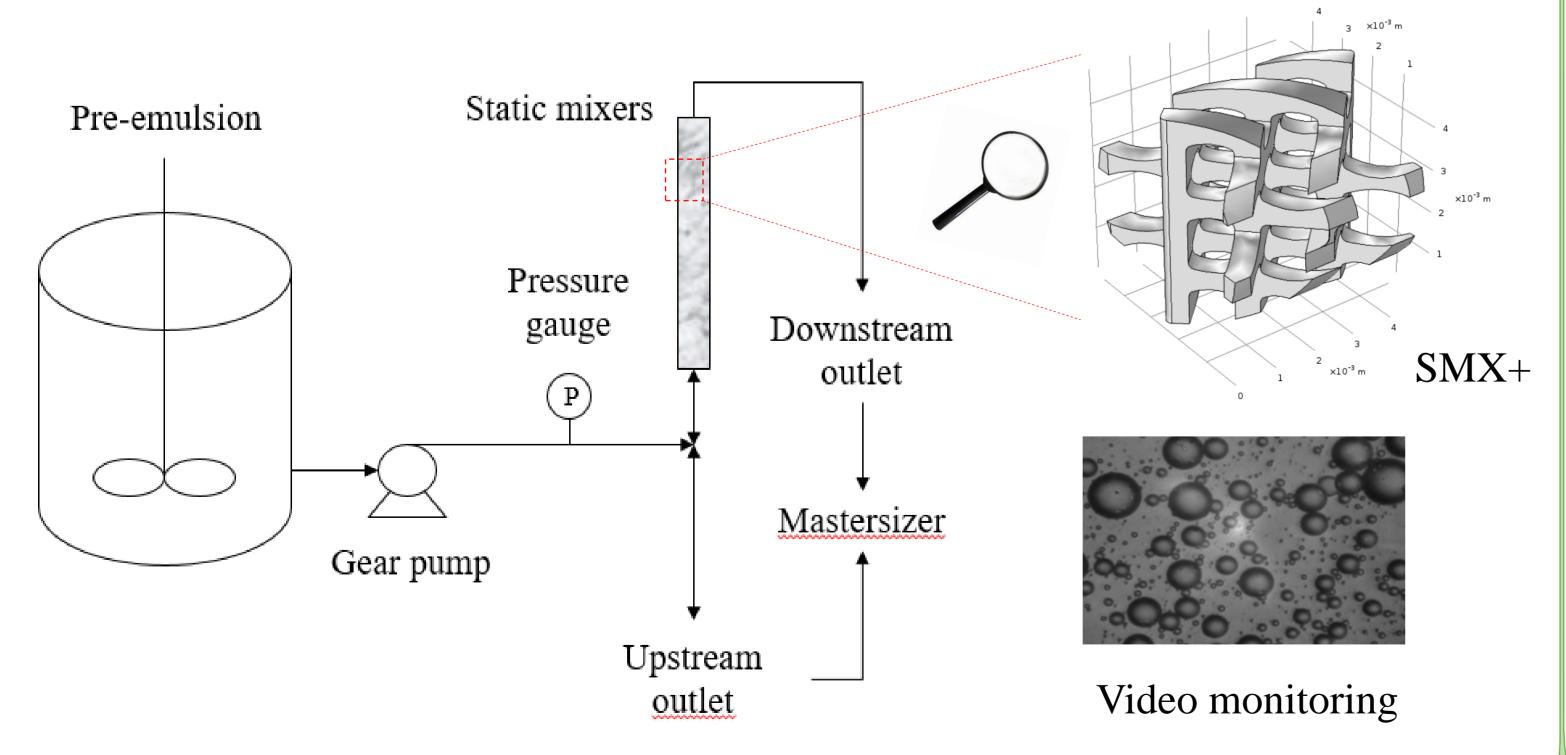


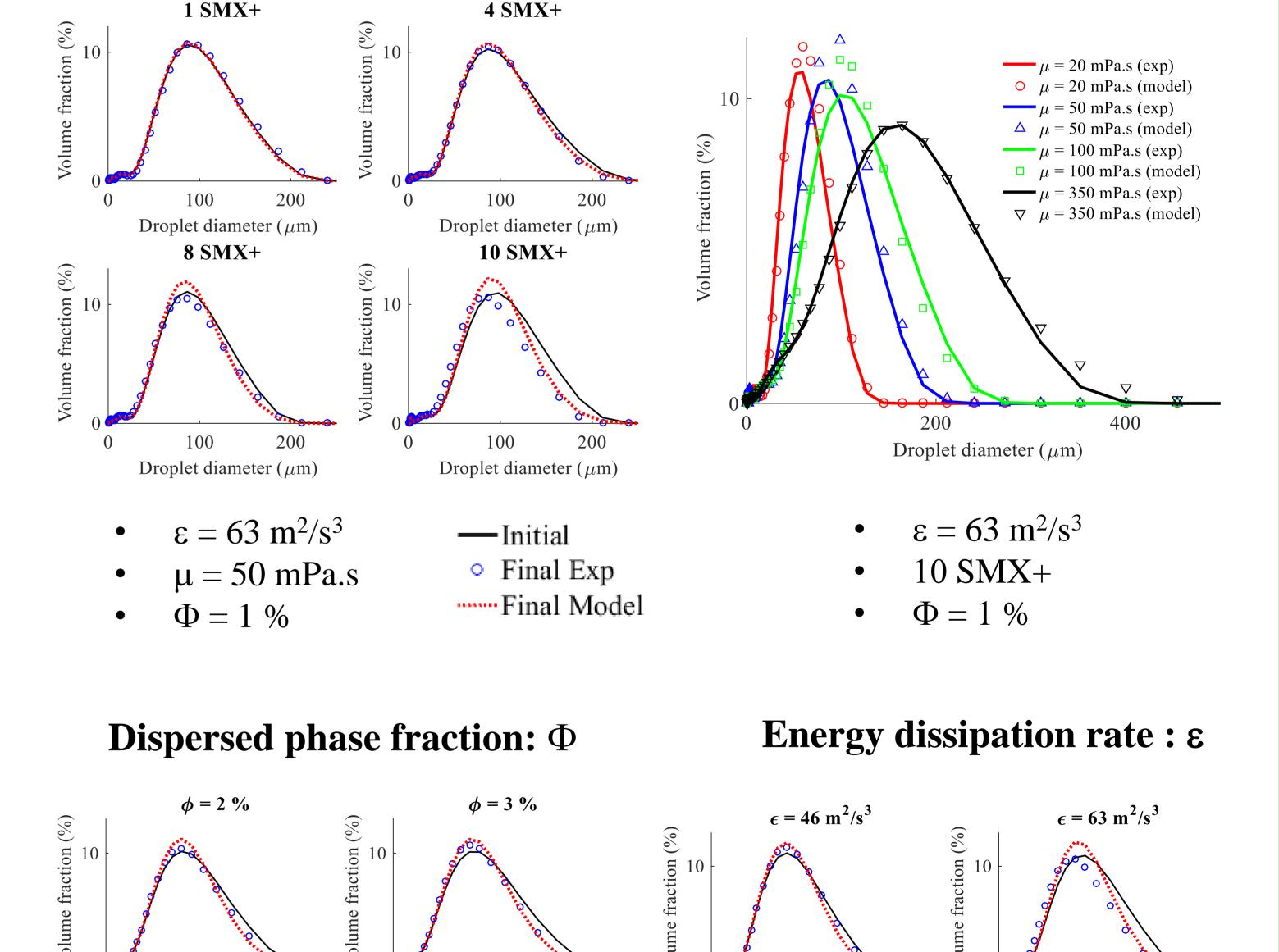
- A finite volume scheme is adopted to solve numerically the PBE
- The parameters of the breakage frequency are determined using the \bullet MATLAB[®] Optimization Toolbox

Experimental procedure:

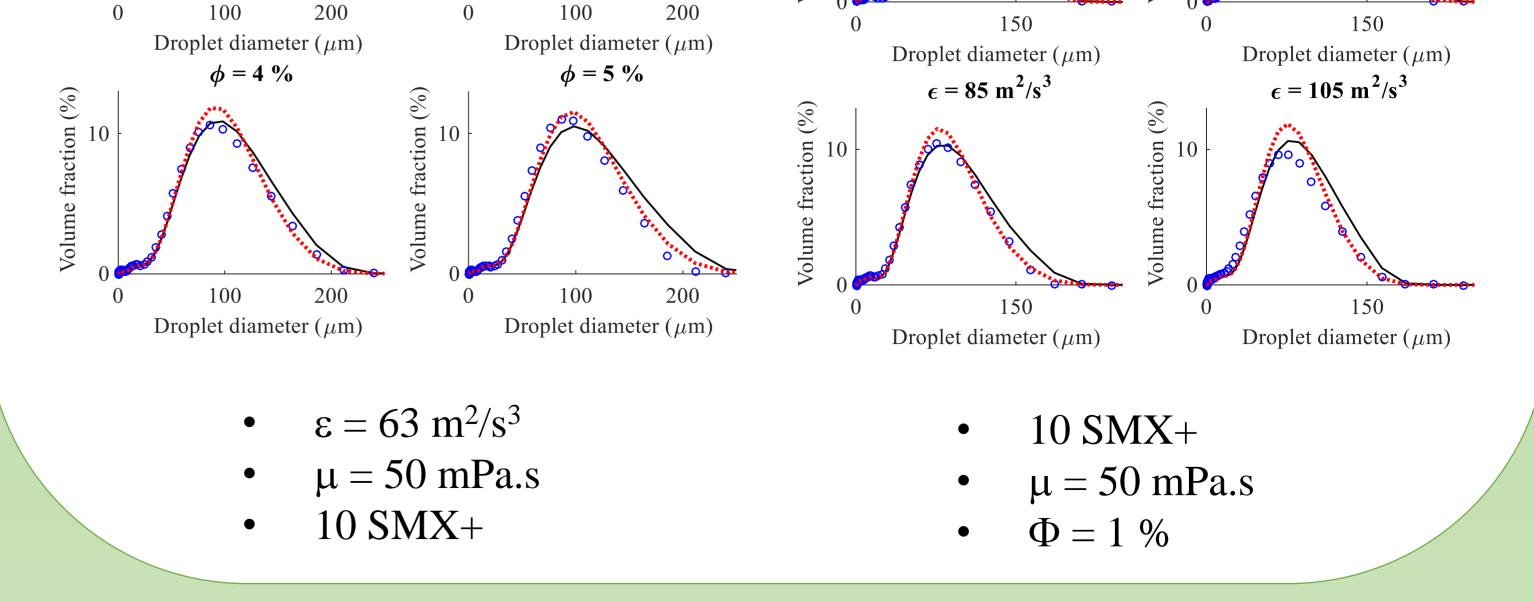
 \bullet

- Oil-in-water pre-emulsions are prepared using Silicon oils with different viscosities
- Tween[®] 20 is used as emulsifier
- Monitoring of the DSD is done before and after the SMX+





The effects of the **number** of SMX+ elements, the **viscosity**, the **fraction** of the dispersed phase and the energy dissipation rate are investigated.



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Conclusions:

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- A population balance model accounting for droplet breakage in SMX+ static mixers is proposed and validated
- CFD simulations are performed in order to accurately assess the energy dissipation rate to be used in the PBE-based model
- The PBE-based model demonstrates a predictive capability under different operating conditions as validated by experimental data

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
