State of the art : The limits of these alloys: potential fluctuations

- Cu_{Zn} antisite has the lowest formation energy (by contrast with CIGS for which it is V_{Cu} vacancy)
- low formation energy for defect cluster such as the pair $(Cu_{Zn} + Sn_{Zn})$ and the triplet $(2Cu_{Zn} + Sn_{Zn})$



 $(Cu_{Zn} + Sn_{Zn}) =>$ deep donor level in the bandgap

 $(2Cu_{Zn} + Sn_{Zn}) =>$ decrease the gap by about 200 meV

Calculated energy band shifts caused by different defect clusters induced by cation disorder

Optical spectroscopy

- Emission properties of CZTS single crystals (population) photoluminescence (PL)

- absorption properties of CZTS (density of states) photoluminescence excitation (PLE)

- Time resolved spectroscopy (energy transfer between localized states, type of recombination).

- Evidence of a band-tail of localized states in CZTS

- Power dependence of the PL emission
- Energy shift between PL and the PLE (Stokes shift)
- Time resolved spectroscopy

The Cu₂ZnSnS₄ samples

 Cu_2ZnSnS_4 monograin powder synthesized from elemental and binary precursors in a two step process: sputtering followed by sulfurization (annealing during 1 hour



1013°K under sulfur atmosphere

Cu-poor and Zn-rich conditions

Formation of Cu_2ZnSnS_4 monograins during the heating process and recrystallization by Oswald ripening.

Optical spectroscopy: Time resolved PL



Efficient carriers transfer between the localized states within the band-tail



transfer between the localized states explains why a decay curve at given energy is useless to account for any recombination time
