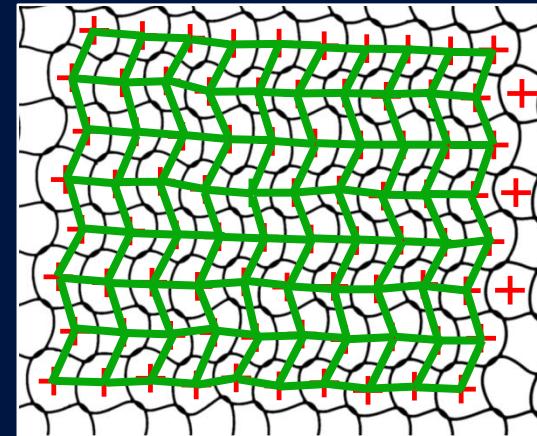
Loop center identification

=> more physical meaning ☺

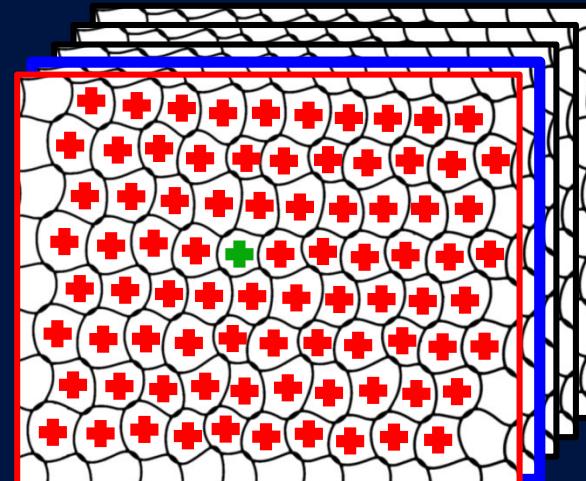
