Creating the Greenness Indexes Is necessary for classification the different vegetation communities ("Transform – Tasseled Cap" ENVI) Each of the TC Bands is represented in grey scale. ETM TC file.





Brightness & Greenness Bands of Vegetation Indexes TC Greenness Index gives us a value of zero greenness – no vegetation ! We use it for creating ROI

3D representation (Colour-band Image upon DEM made from SRTM). DEM resolution is 256, Vertical Exaggeration = 2.0. File saved as raster .jpg-image

7. Creation the Altitude Layer



Creating the Altitude Zones using "Intersect Regions" for the each pair of ROIs. Final altitude zones that we interested in are: Lowland Vegetation (1-2500m), Subparamo Vegetation (2501-3500), Paramo Vegetation (3501-4100) and Superparamo Vegetation (4101 – 5000). All these zones are shown on the map in different colours (yellow, beige, two greens)
