Vulnerability and family life in French law: Gender, marriage and parentage

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Introduction

• Evolution of the gender system:

- Initially links between sex, gender, sexuality, procreation and parenthood
 - Sex characteristics determines gender
 - Sex characteristics determines sexuality
 - The aim of sexuality is procreation
 - Parenthood is for the one who procreates
- Currently: a progressive destruction of the links between those notions

Consequences on the law:

- Tight gender system → legal creation of vulnerabilities for the families who don't fit in this system
- Loose gender system

 fighting against reminiscent vulnerabilities

I. In the past system of gender

A. State of the law

- Marriage
 - Link between sex, sexuality and reproduction
 marriage for heterosexual couple (no text in the civil code)
 - Link between sex and gender → sex condition is determined by biological test: Cass. civ. 6 april 1903
- Parentage; link between sex, sexuality and reproduction:
 - Parentage for one woman (and one man) with different rules of establishing parentage
 - Hierarchy of parentage (married couple, non married couple)
 - Adoption only by married couple
 - No medically assisted procreation (MAP)

I. In the past system of gender

B. Creation of vulnerability

- No legal protection for homosexual partners or couple with a trans* person
- Diminished legal protection for child raised in homosexual couples

II. In the current system of gender

A. What has been done already?

- 2002 Opening marriage to trans* people [Goodwin]
- 2013 Same sex marriage and adoption by same sex couple
 - Opening marriage: art. 143 c. civ.
 - Opening adoption: art. 6-1 & 346 c. civ.
- **2014** Extending possibilities of adoption to MAP performed abroad
- 2017 Extending possibilities of adoption to surrogated motherhood performed abroad

B. What are the remaining problems?

1. Weaker parenthood

- "natural" parentage vs adoptive parentage for LGT couples
 - Judicial and administrative procedure (risk of refusal)
 - Money and time consuming
 - Only for married couple
- Legal uncertainty for trans* parenthood

B. What are the remaining problems?

2. Difference of access to procreative technologies

- MAP nationally closed to heterosexual couple (art. L. 2141-2 public health code);
- Preservation of gametes closed to transgender undergoing sex assignment therapy (art. L. 2141-11 public health code and public statement of the national academy of medicine).

Conclusion

- What's left of the traditional gender system nowadays?
 - Marriage: from creating to destroying vulnerabilities
 - Cass. civ., 28 janv. 2015, Franco-Moroccan same sex marriage case
 - Parenthood: from one vulnerability to another
 - Limitation of access to procreative technology
 - Hierarchy of filiation
