- Support : French National Research Agency (ANR), CO<sub>2</sub>-EnergiCapt project.

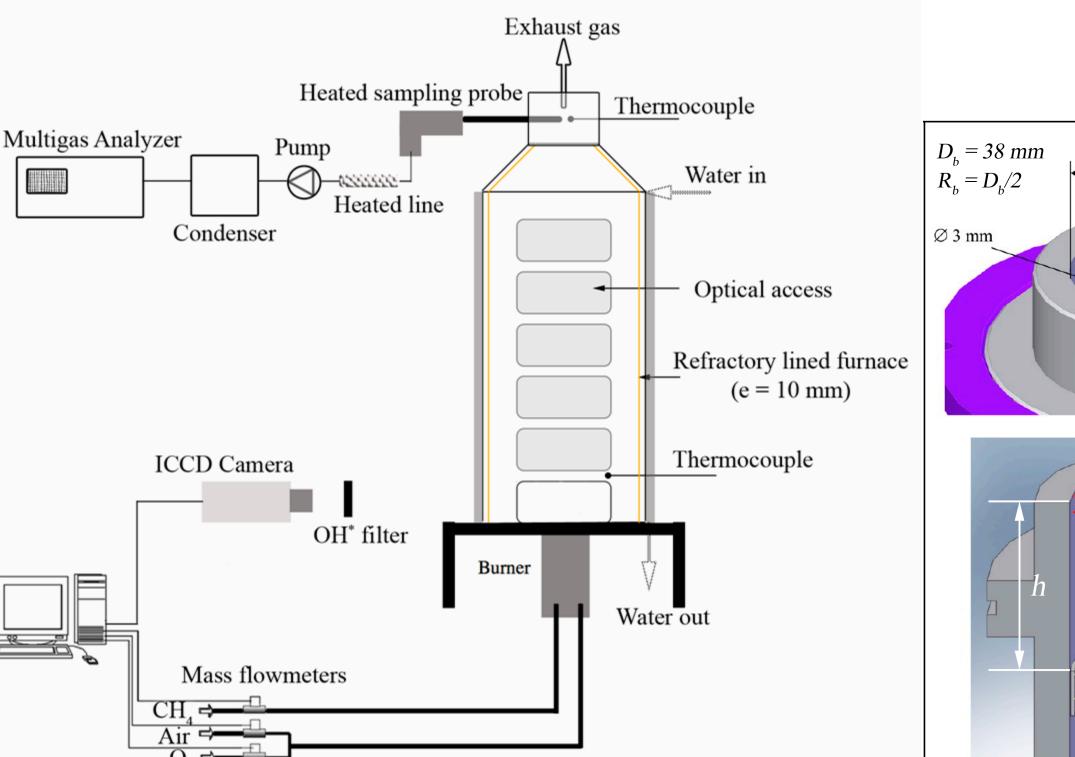
# **Objective**

- ✓ Optimization of industrial boilers by the combination of combustion air enriched with oxygen and reducing  $CO_2$  by a membrane capture.
- Study the characteristics of turbulent CH<sub>4</sub>-air flames with O<sub>2</sub> enrichment : Flame stability, Pollutant emissions (CO, NOx, CO<sub>2</sub>), Velocity fields.

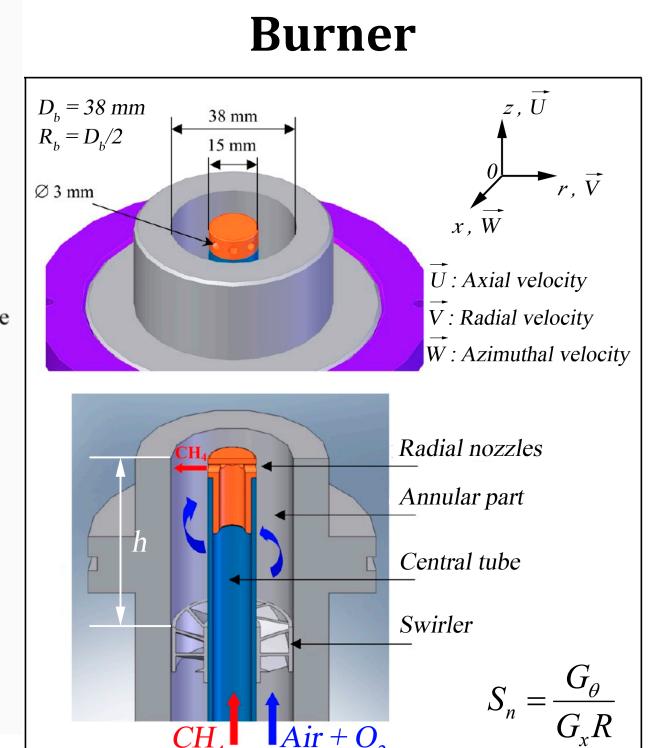
#### **Combustion chamber**



Combustion chamber : 25 kW, dimensions 0.5x0.5x1 m<sup>3</sup>



**Schematic view** of the combustion chamber with the OH Chemiluminescence system and the gas analyzer



#### **Burner** : two concentric tubes with a **swirler** in the annular part

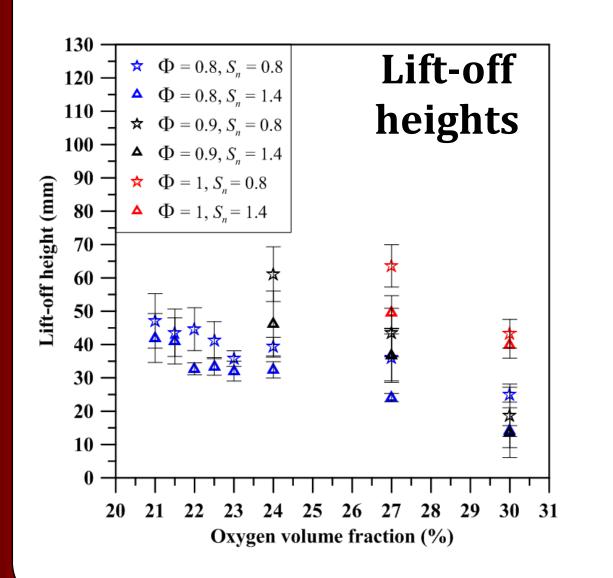
# Details of measurement techniques

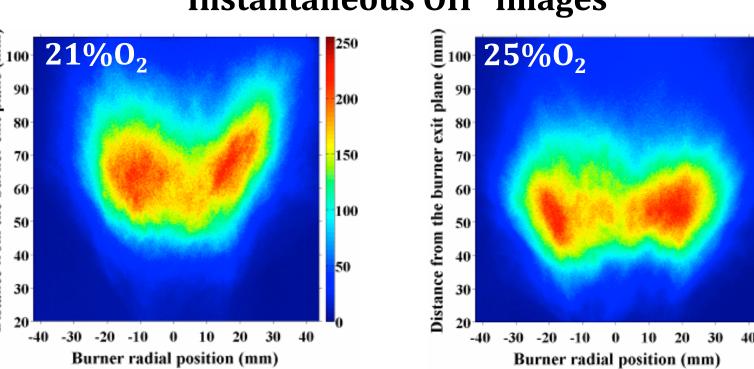
- ✓ **Multi-gas analyzer** :  $NO_x$ , CO,  $CO_2$ ,  $O_2$ ,  $SO_2$
- ✓ OH chemiluminescence: ICCD camera, a 105 mm UV lens, a 306 nm filter.
- **Stereo-PIV system** : a double-pulsed Nd:YAG laser (25 mJ/pulse) at 532 nm, 10 Hz. 2 TSI Powerview Plus 4MP, 2048 x 2048 px<sup>2</sup>, Scheimpflug adaptaters. Seeding :  $Al_2O_3 0.5-1 \mu m$ .
- ✓ V3V system of TSI: V3V-9000-TS probe, 3 cameras 4MP-HS, 2 Evergreen 200 mJ PIV lasers.

#### **Pollutant emissions**

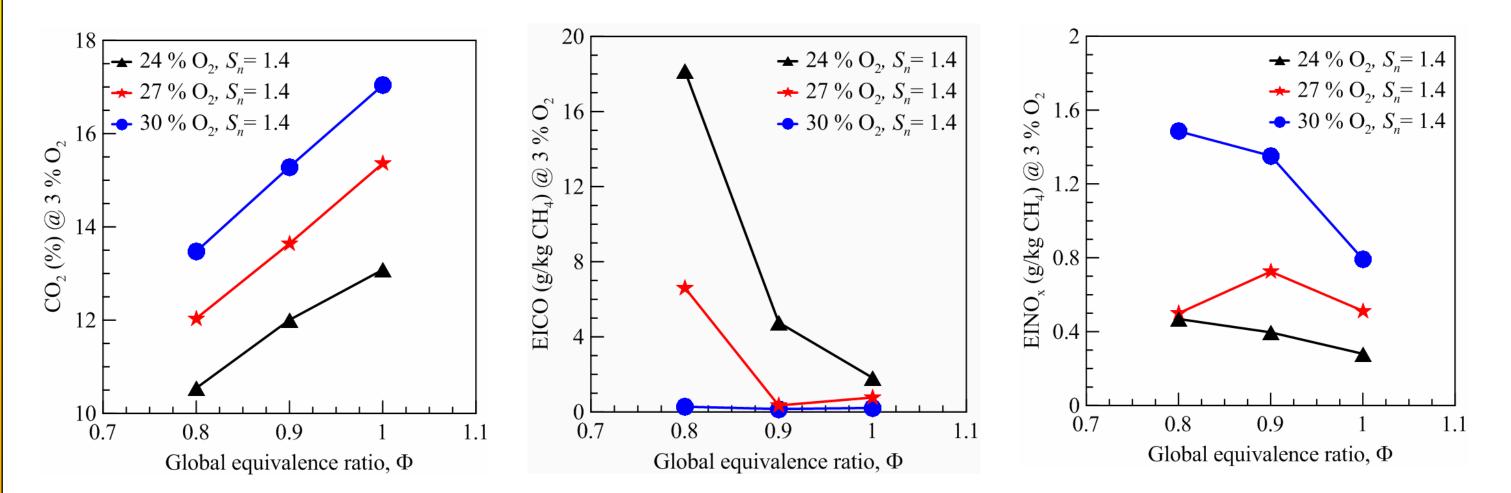
#### **Flame behavior**





**Chame stability** is **enhanced** with oxygen addition even for **low oxygen enrichment** rates.

- ✓ Lift-off heights > with  $O_2$  addition.
- ✓ Fluctuations of lift-off heights ⊔ with O<sub>2</sub> addition.
- ✓ Lift-off heights ⊔ with swirl number (S<sub>n</sub>).
- ✓ Lift-off heights  $\lor$  when equivalence ratio (Φ)  $\lor$ .

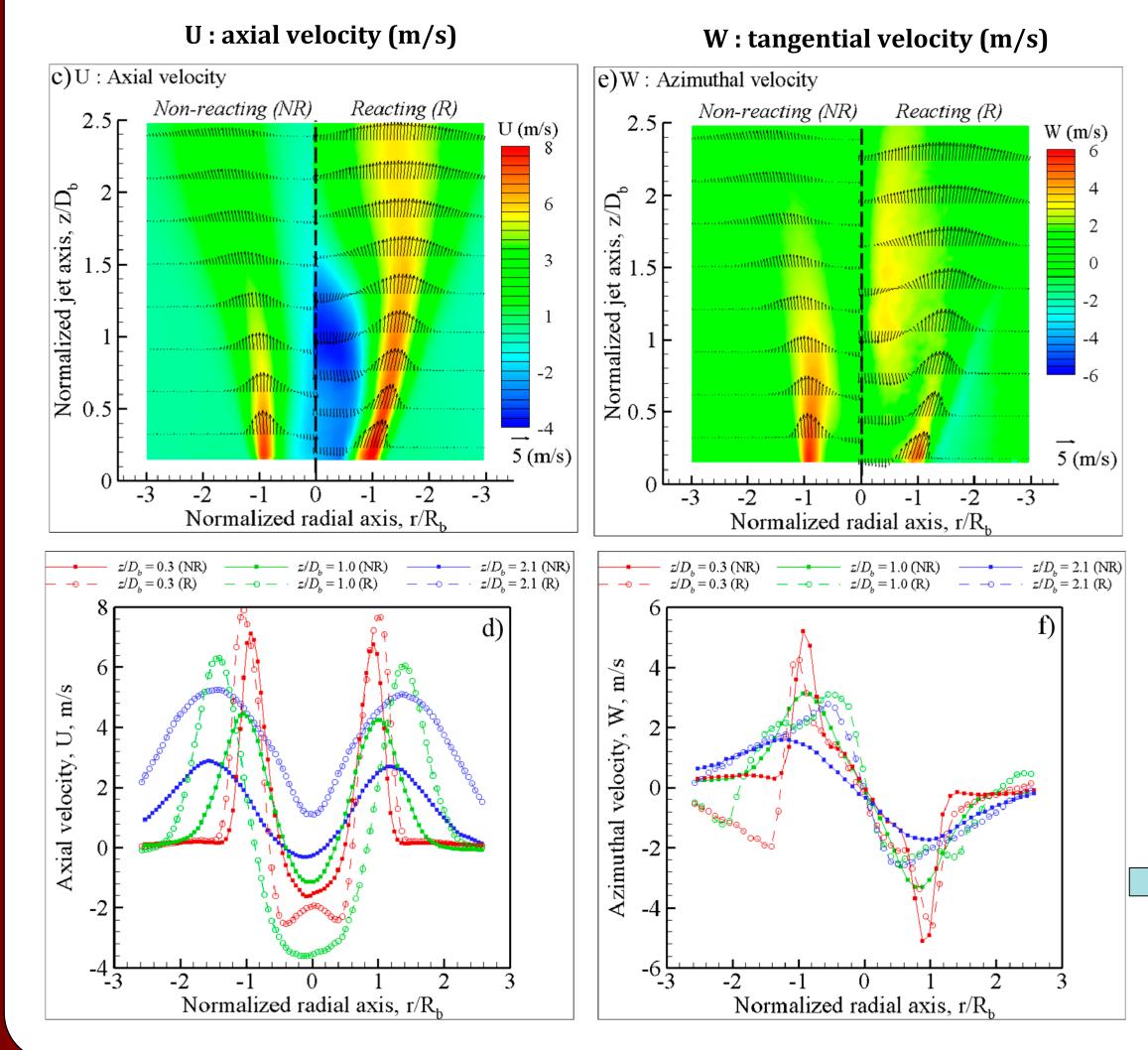


✓  $CO_2$  concentrations increase with  $O_2$  addition and global equivalence ratio (a).

- CO emissions largely decrease with  $O_2$  addition and global equivalence ratio (b).
- $\checkmark$  NO<sub>x</sub> emissions increase with oxygen addition, and decrease with equivalence ratio (c).

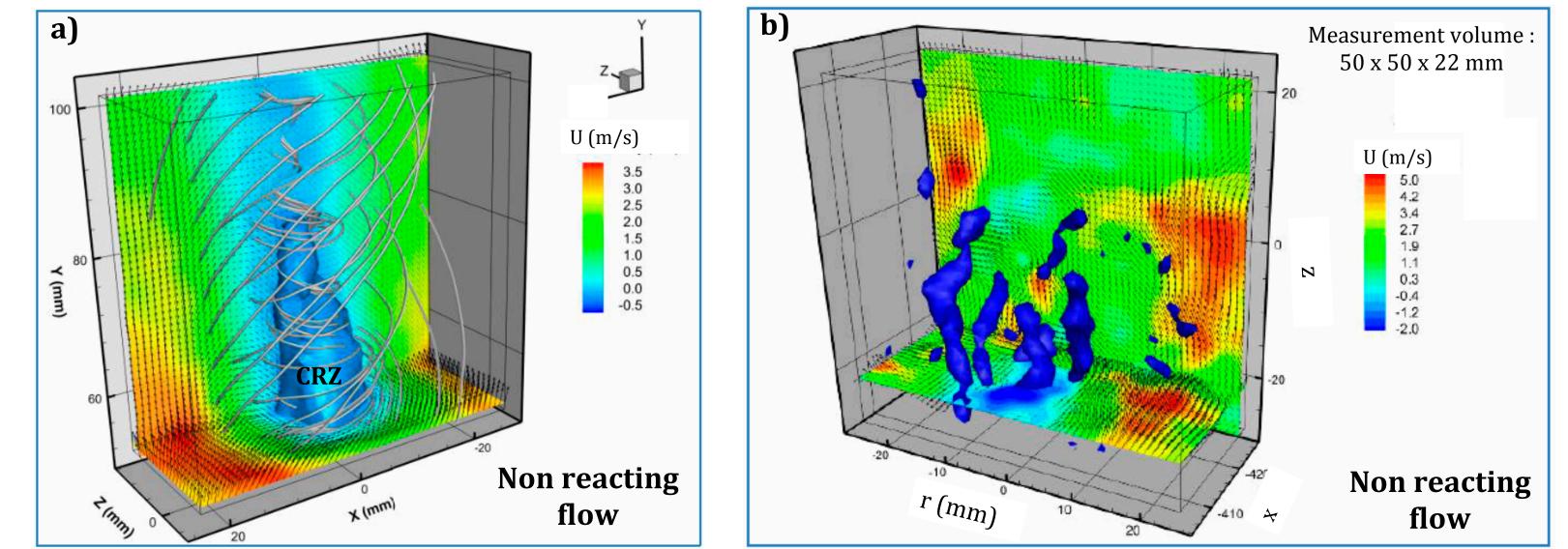
### **Stereo-PIV results of non reacting and reacting flow**

## Flow analysis by stereo-PIV and V3V\* system

#### First results of V3V measurements \_ Collaboration with TSI® on 2014



Swirling flow demonstrated by the streamlines

*Plot of Q-criteria showing counter-rotating vortices extending from the center of the burner* 

- ✓ The presence of flame increases the central recirculation zone (CRZ) (c, d) compared to non reactive cases
  ✓ Strong axial expansion is induced by combustion (c, d)
- In the reacting the azimuthal velocity field tends to show that the intensity of the swirling motion is lower than the motion originally imposed to the flow (e, f)
- ✓ Increasing  $S_n \Rightarrow$  Increasing reverse flow velocities
