# Modelling is a complementary tool

Does the slowdown is fully explained by the reduction of the interfacial area ?







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 $\diamond$  Lipolysis rate of a given FAi is proportional to the interfacial area thereof

 $\frac{dm_{FA_i}^{lip}(t)}{dt} = -k_{FA_i}A_{FA_i}(t)$ 

The interfacial area occupied by FAi at time t is proportional to its molar fraction

$$A_{FA_i}(t) = \frac{n_{FA_i}^{lip}(t)}{\sum_i n_{FA_i}^{lip}(t)} \cdot A_{TAG}(t)$$

Only the fraction of FAi transferred into the micellar phase is bioaccessible

$$\frac{dm_{FA_i}^{mic}}{dt} = \underbrace{f_{FA_i}^{mic}}_{dt} \frac{dm_{FA_i}^{lip}}{dt}$$





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# Models of transit and absorption

GI tract = a series of reactors (chemical engineering approach)



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# Examples of experimental results



Above a threshold, which increases with age, muscular synthesis is stimulated

# Modelling the digestion of dairy proteins

Milks clot because of the decreasing pH Gels can undergo syneresis Ingestion (mL/min) Secretions (mL/min) 10 1st compartment  $\Phi_{

Contrasted behaviours within the stomach:

- 20 to 22 model parameters: 3 to 6 unknown
- 3 data sets ([Cr], % dry matter, [AA]) fitted simultaneously for each food matrix

## Conclusions

*In silico* models can be good complements to *in vitro* and *in vivo* studies, in particular to:



- Gather and structure the available knowledge
- Test our understanding on the mechanisms
- Extract hidden information from the results (e.g. gastric secretions and emptying fluxes...)
- Make predictions

but should also remain simple enough (not too many degrees of freedom) & be stable, robust, computationally not too heavy, reusable...
