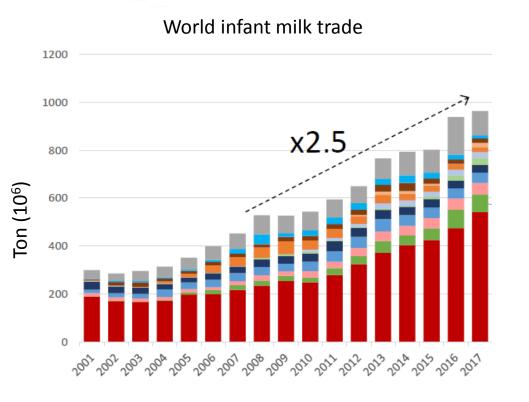


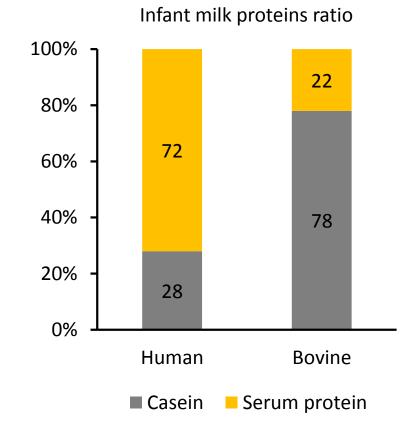






#### World Dairy Industry

fractionation of bovine milk proteins

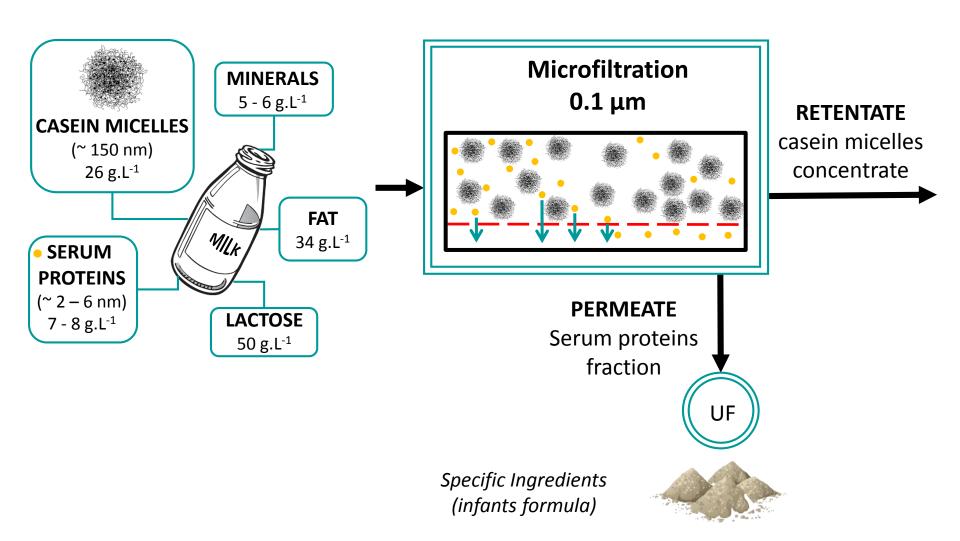

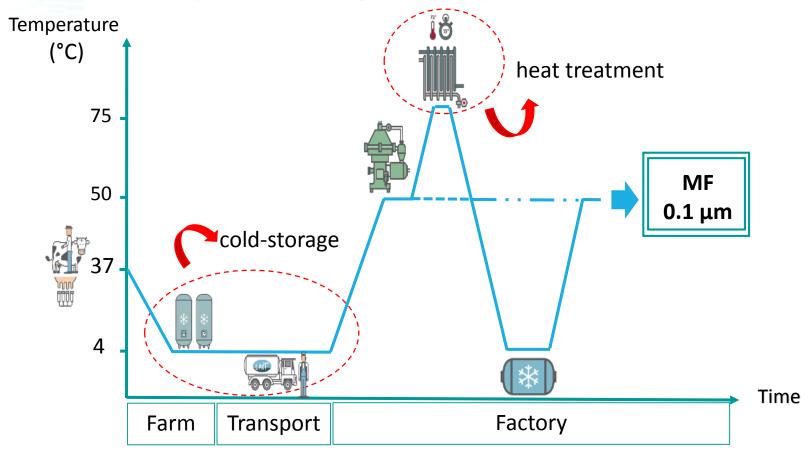








#### Pre-processing steps prior to MF



Lack of knowledge about how the thermal history of milk (cold-storage and heat treatment) affects the MF performances (productivity and fractions characteristics)



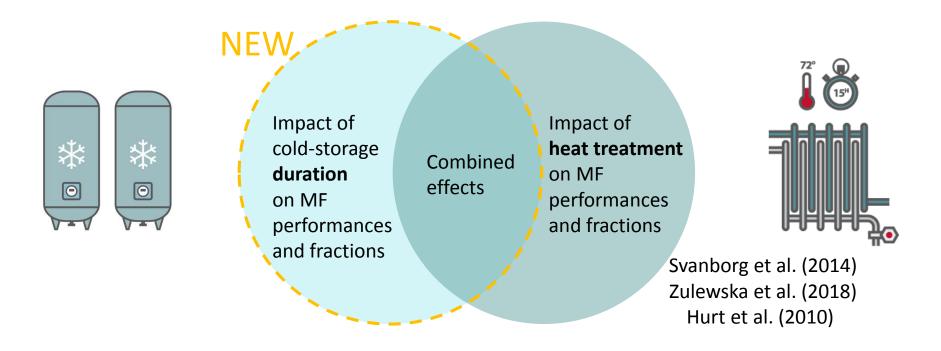






#### **Objectives & Strategy**

Investigating the **impact** of **pre-processing steps** (cold-storage & heat treatment) on the **MF efficiency** 



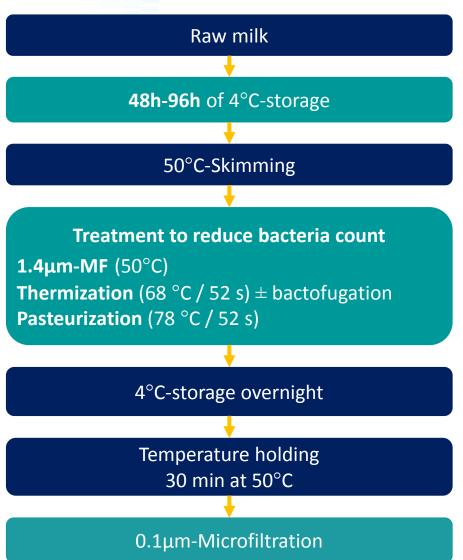
To **adapt** the **stabilization** step to the **cold-storage history** of milk and provide a **sustainable production** of fractions.







## Processing steps





Ceramic membrane (Pall)

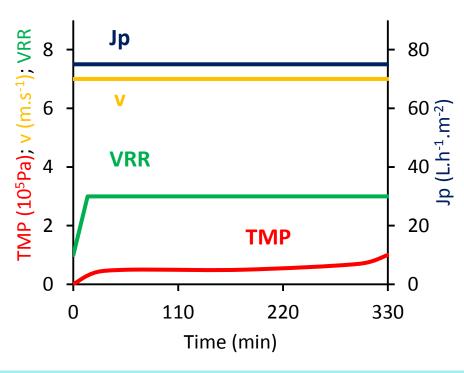
Feed-and-bleed mode of operation: 330min













#### TMP = f(t)

**Serum protein recovery ratio in permeate:** 

$$(SP\ recovery)\ (t)\ = \frac{[SP]_{permeate}\ (t)}{[SP]_{Milk}} * \frac{VRR-1}{VRR}$$

VRR: volume reduction ratio

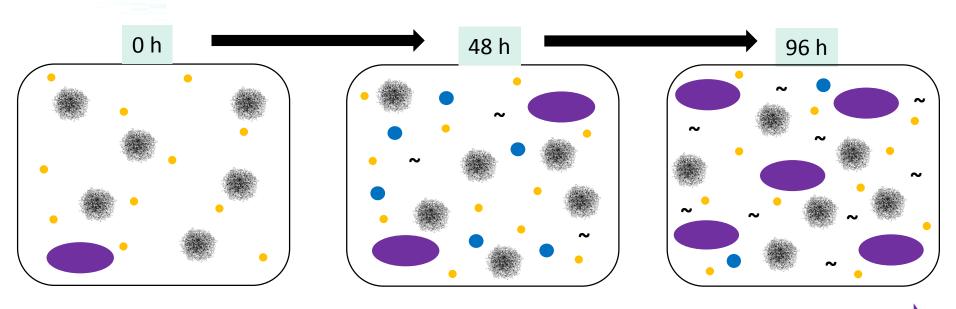

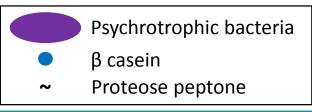

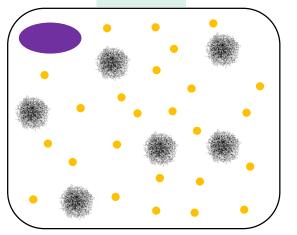




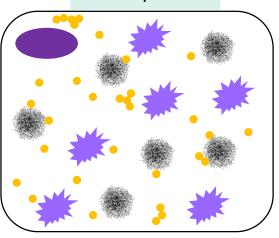


#### Effect of treatment on skimmed milk composition

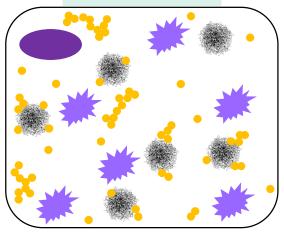

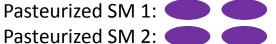




## Hydraulic performances of 0.1µm-MF

Pasteurized SM 1:





- 1.4-MF SM: no evolution of TMP regardless of the 4°C-storage duration
- Heat-treated SM: increase of TMP on the course of filtration when milk is cold-stored 96 h
- Presence of a bactofugation step has no impact on MF hydraulic performances







# Hydraulic performances of 0.1µm-MF

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Pasteurized SM 1:



#### **Assumptions:**

- Bacteria are partly responsible for fouling
- <u>1.4-MF</u>: high retention of bacteria, somatic cells and residual fat globules
- Heat treatment: accumulation of bacteria, somatic cells and residual fat globules

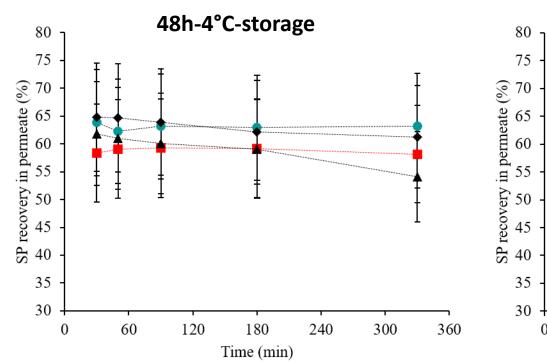


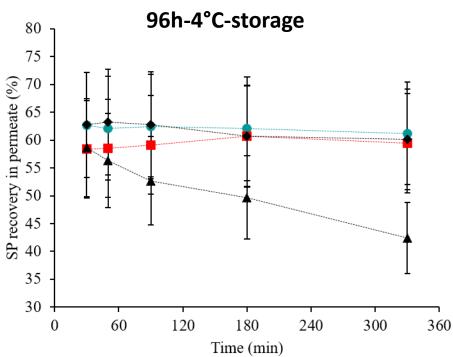




## SP recovery during 0.1µm-MF







#### 1.4-MF SM & thermized SM:

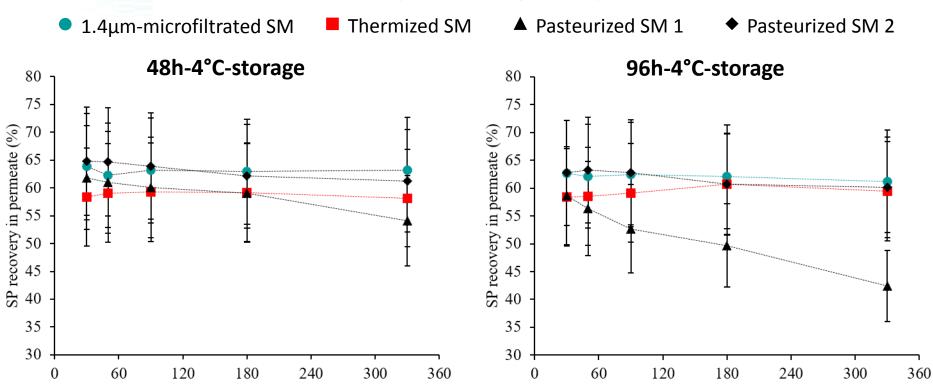
- SP recovery in permeate is stable during MF regardless of the cold-storage duration
- Pasteurized SM:
  - SP recovery in permeate declines over the time of operation
  - decline of SP recovery is all the higher than the cold-storage of raw milk is long







#### SP recovery during 0.1µm-MF



**Assumptions:** 

denaturation of serum proteins and modifications of interactions between proteins participate in the deposit layer and add up to the fouling effect of bacteria

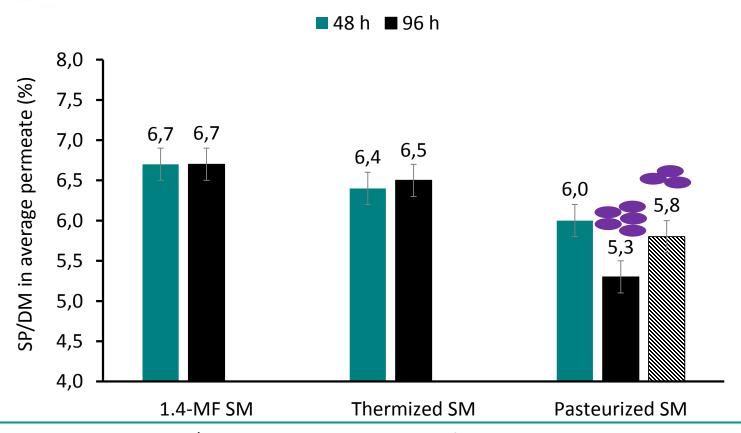

# Quality & value of average permeate



- 1.4μm-MF SM: high SP/DM in permeate regardless of the milk-storage duration
- <u>Thermized SM</u>: intermediate SP/DM in permeate regardless of the milk-storage duration
- Pasteurized SM:
  - low SP/DM in permeate
  - SP/DM even lower than initial psychrotrophic bacteria count in milk is high

# Take home messages

- □ Skimmed milk thermal history (storage duration and heat treatment) has an impact on 0.1μm-MF performances
- lacktriangle Effects of milk modifications induced by thermal history before 0.1 $\mu$ m-MF are cumulative
- Pre-processing by 1.4 $\mu$ m-MF results in good performances of 0.1 $\mu$ m-MF and high recovery of SP in permeate regardless of the milk-storage duration
- If heat-treatment is unavoidable, thermization had to be favored to insure satisfactory serum proteins recovery in permeate
