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Motivations

- Mimic interaction wave / (small-scale) current
 - Small-scale currents are hardly observed or simulated
 - Waves see them during very short time
- Quantification of associated modelling errors



- Improve the Scalian's wave simulator
- Study influence of swell / current interactions onto satellite altimetry

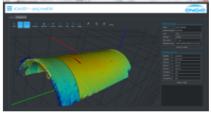

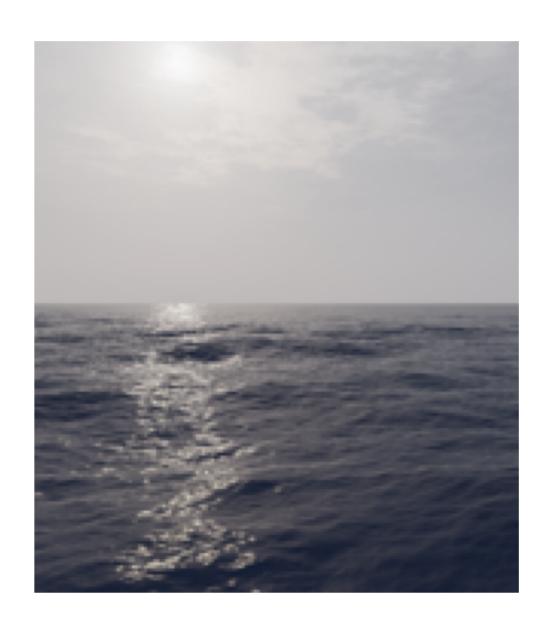




SeaMotion-radar simulator

- Simple and fast simulation of surface gravity waves over very large domain
- Coupled with radar simulation
- Lot of physical phenomena taking into account

 Used to study satellite altimetry measurements (e.g. SKIM)

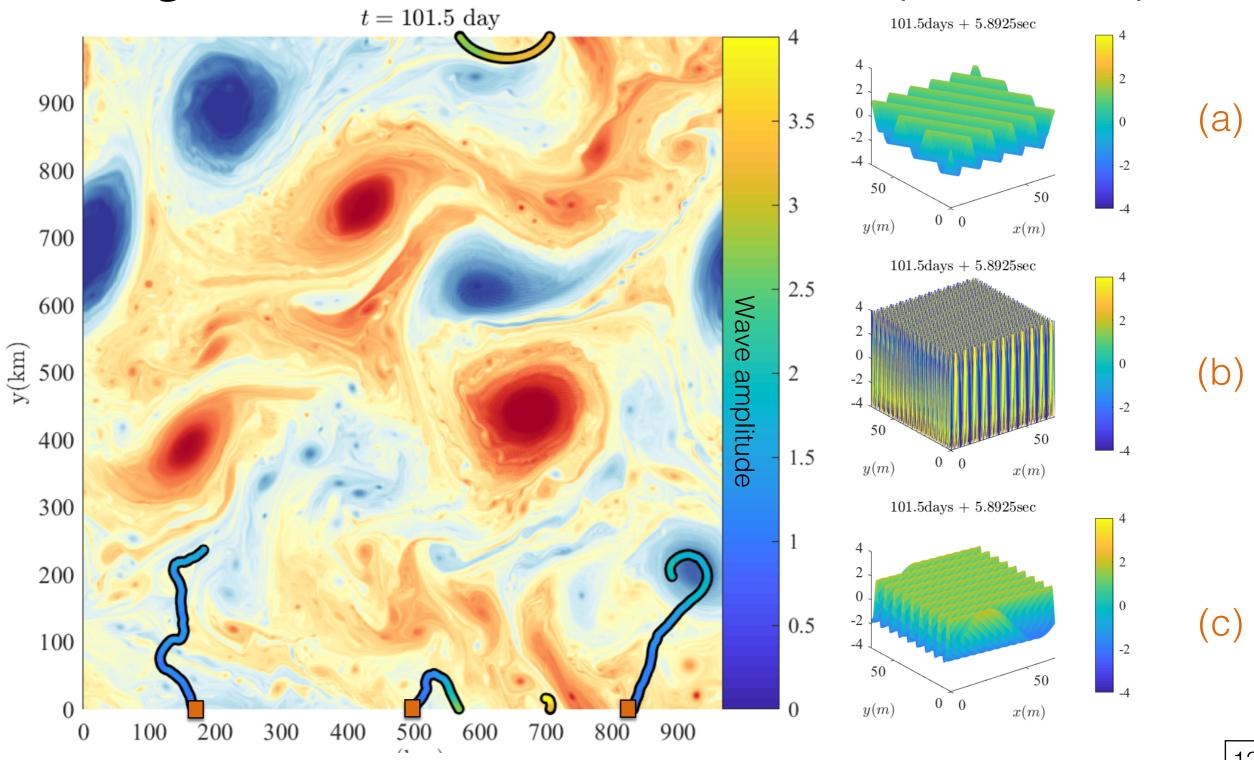

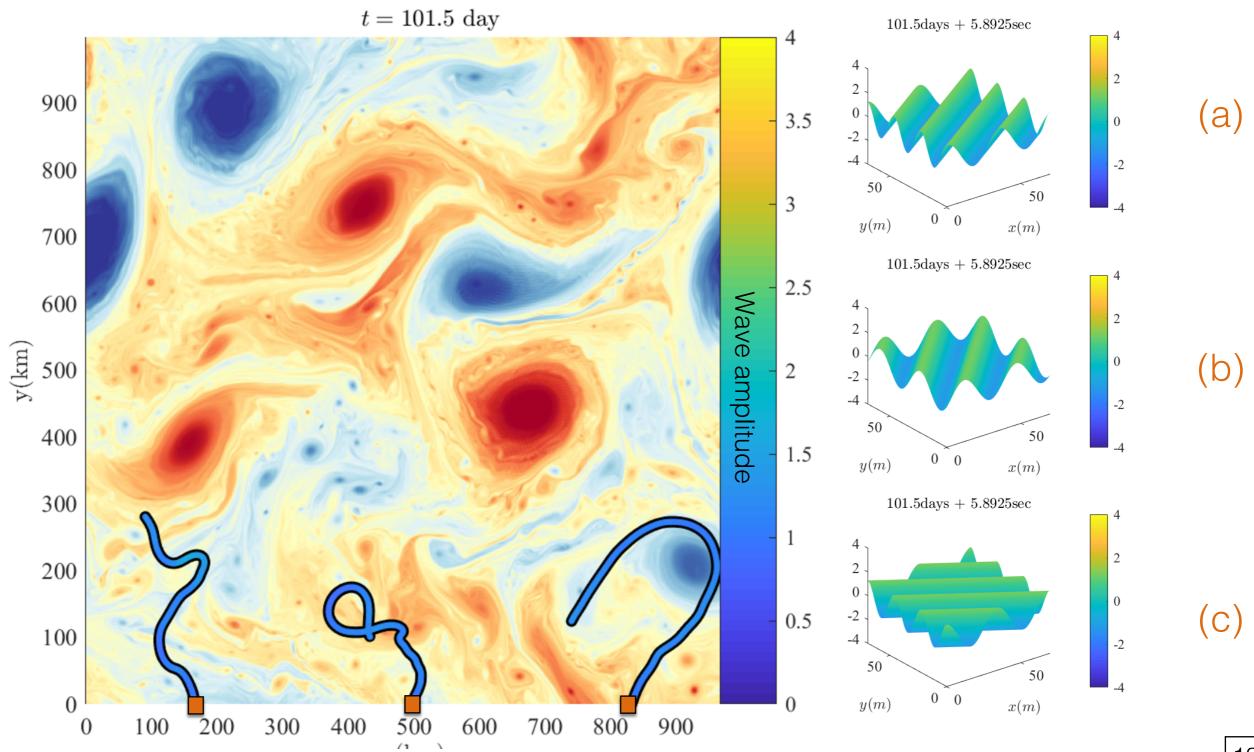

Dynamics of 3 wave group in *high-resolution* SQG currents (512x512)



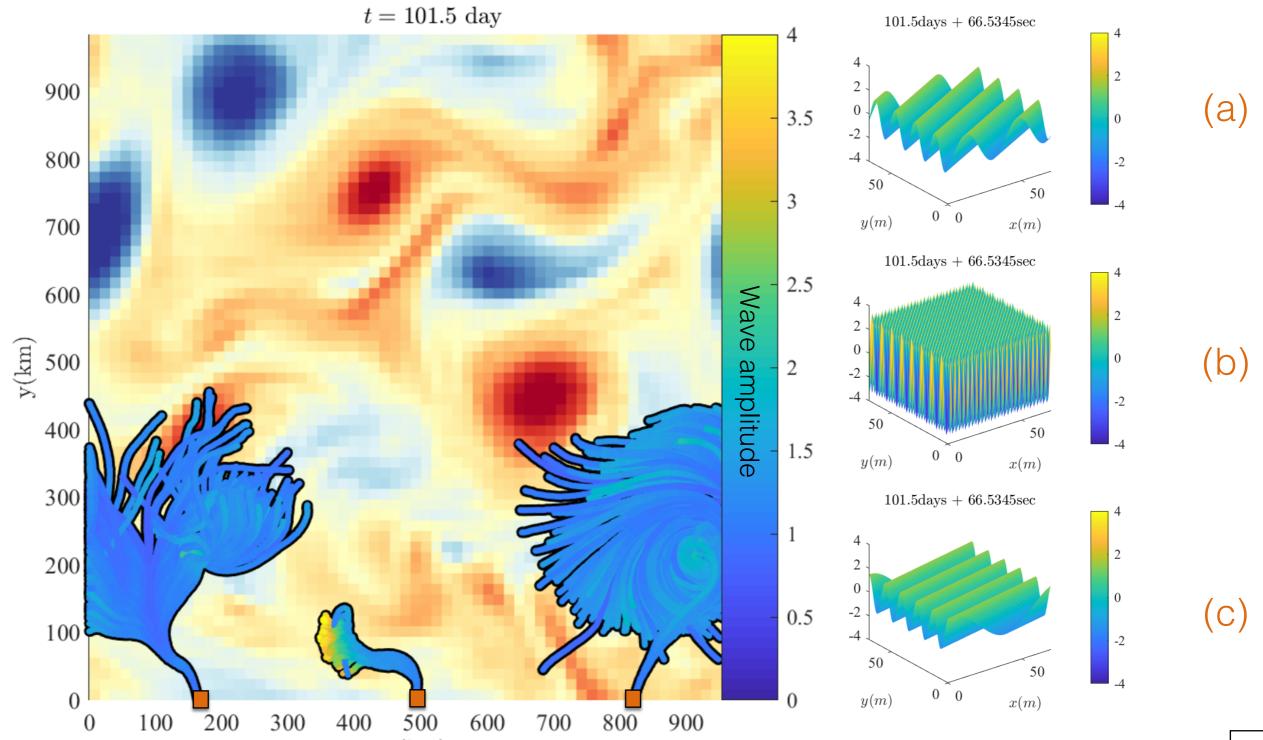

Conclusion

Conclusion and outlooks

- Method of characteristics: low computational costs
 We can simulate a lot of realisations, and initial conditions
- Understanding and simulating the dynamics with increasing complexity
 - Backward integration to obtain wave spectra (Quilfen et al. 2018)
 - Analytic time integration for wave-group subgrid dynamics
 - Heterogeneous small-scale velocity variance and correlation lengths (e.g. Pannekoucke et al. 2018)
- With satellite measurements, try to predict wave spectra variations due to Agulhas courant
- Integration into the SeaMotion Radar
- Which are the swell / current effects on satellite measurements?
- Outlook: stochastic Wave Watch III

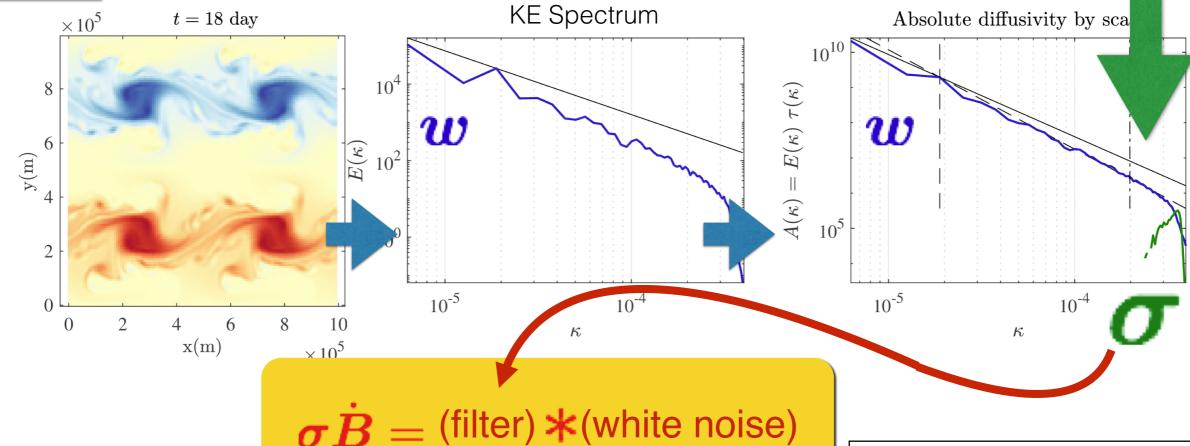
