# CONCLUSIONS

 $\checkmark$  Time series analysis provides a detailed system dynamics overview;  $\checkmark$  Forcing parameters sampling ordering affects the voltage results (hysteresis);  $\checkmark$  Low amplitudes combined with low frequencies provides regular dynamics;
