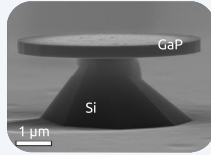

Introduction

Wavelength converter is one of the essential blocks of photonic integrated circuits. One of most established configurations is based on χ^2 nonlinearities in microdisk resonators making use of the Whispering Gallery Modes (WGMs)⁽¹⁾

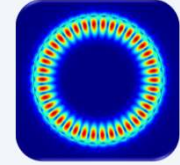
- III-V Semiconductors \rightarrow strong nonlinear properties and specific $\bar{4}$ quasiphasematching
- Challenging optical coupling, hard to couple two frequencies with the same system
- No study of different coupling schemes for nonlinear conversion in literature



SEM image of a GaP microdisk over Si made in the laboratory

The wavelength conversion (second harmonic generation):

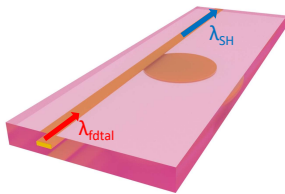
- Fundamental (Fdtal)=2 μ m \rightarrow Second Harmonic (SH)=1 μ m
- TE polarization \rightarrow TM polarization
- $\bar{4}$ Quasiphasematching possible for GaP microdisks⁽²⁾



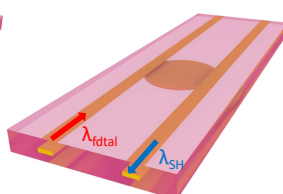
Planar electric field distribution of a WGM for a horizontal plane in a microdisk

Evanescent coupling configurations

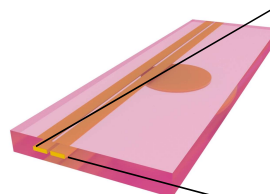
Three coupling schemes studied:



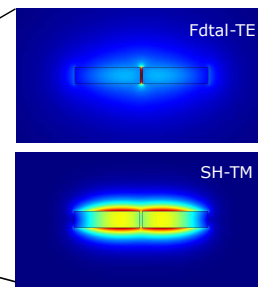
All-pass



Add-drop



Slit



Supermodes

Linear combination of single waveguide modes

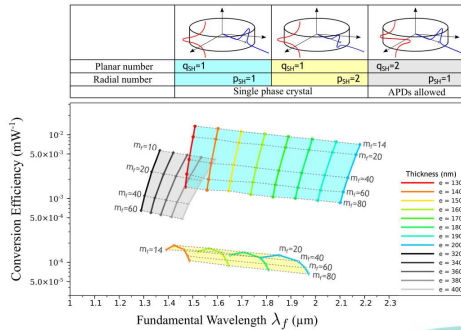
$$E = A(z)E_1 + B(z)E_2$$

$$H = A(z)H_1 + B(z)H_2$$

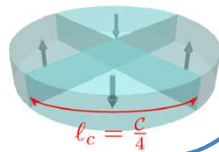
Achieve propagation constant engineering for TE and TM

$\bar{4}$ Quasiphasematching⁽³⁾

Possibility of QPM in circular microresonators

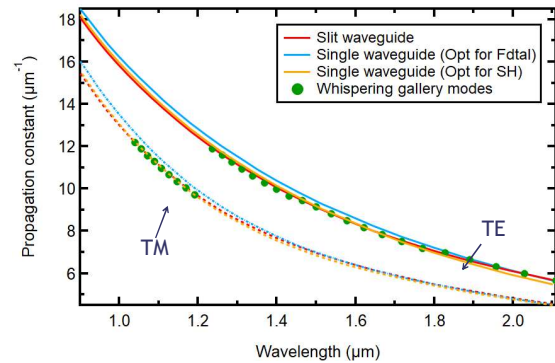


- Strict conditions:
 - $\Delta m = m_{SH} - 2m_{Fdtal} = \pm 2$
 - $\omega = TE // 2\omega = TM$
 - Planar and radial numbers = 1



Study of dispersion

We calculate the dispersion curve for the three configurations

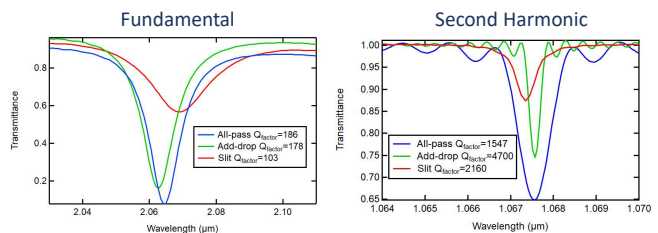


- Modal dispersion \rightarrow Impossible to couple both at once
- Slit size to control B separately
- Group index matching between guide and disk

Study of coupling

We compare the coupling for both wavelengths

- Different coupling regimes \rightarrow Undercoupling/overcoupling cases
- Waveguide vicinity \rightarrow high insertion losses
- Overcoupling regime well suited for pulsed excitation



Conclusion

- Comprehensive study of the different coupling configurations available
- Promising dual wavelength optical coupling scheme to microdisk resonators based on slit waveguide
- These configurations remain compatible with conventional semiconductor device processing
