- Development of **new therapies** is **necessary**.

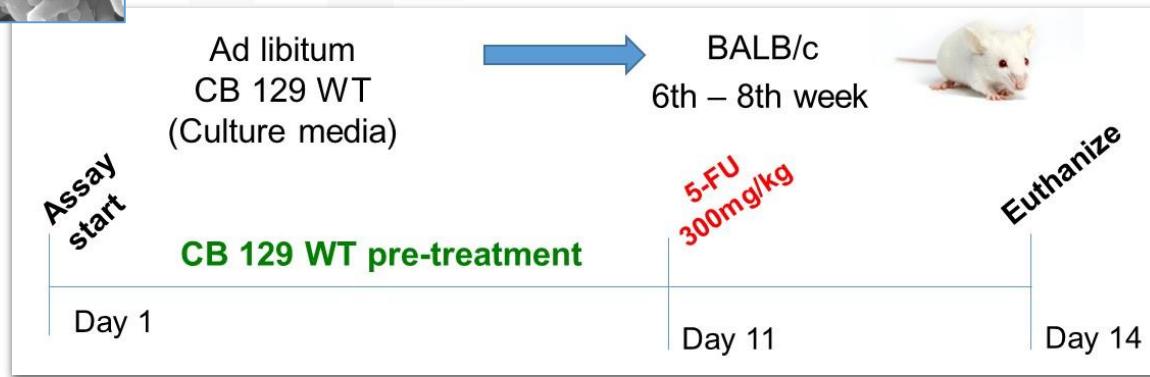

*P. freudenreichii* CB 129 x Mucositis



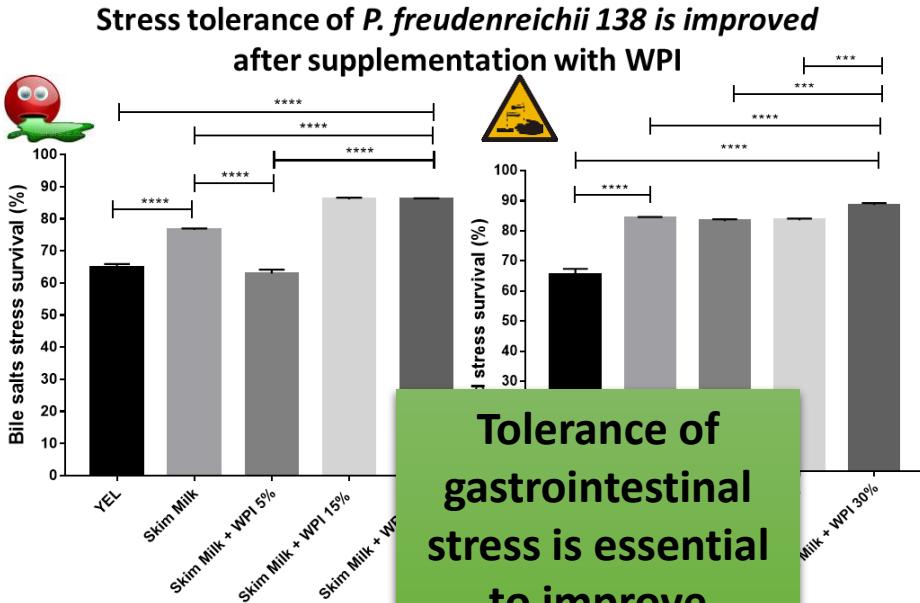

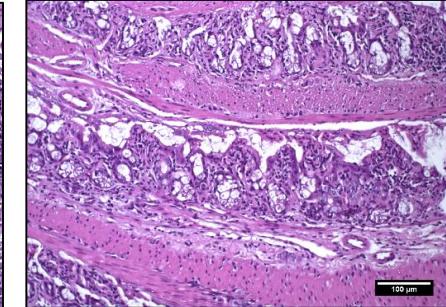
Fermented Milk by *P. freudenreichii* 138  
supplemented with Whey Protein Isolate (WPI).



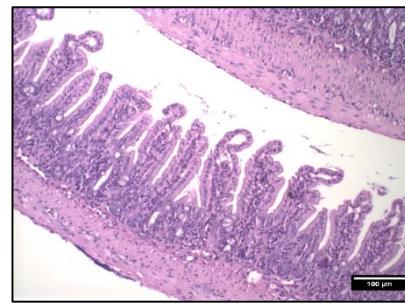
Representative images from mucosal histopathology (H&E)



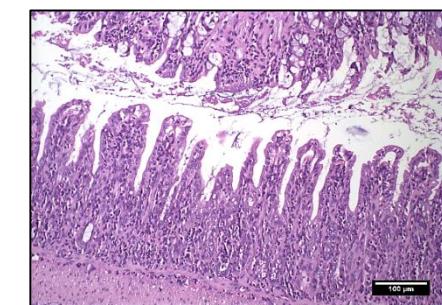

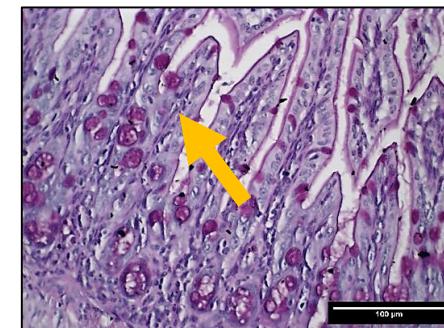
Representative images of stained goblet cells (PAS)



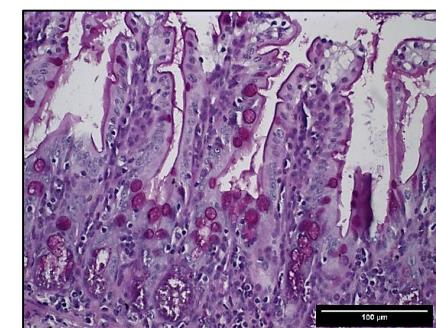

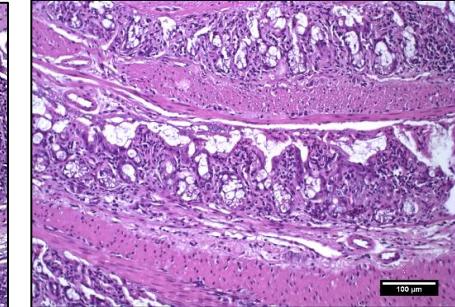

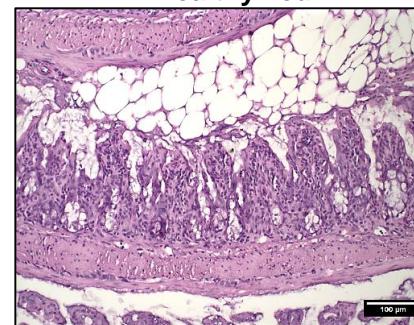
