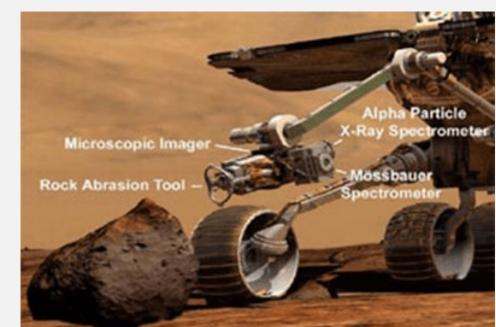

### Development of the high-energy PIXE method using the ARRONAX cyclotron

It is possible to determine the concentration of elements present in a sample, using the number of X-rays detected in the spectrum for each element  $N_X^Z$ .

- N<sub>p</sub>: Number of incident particles
- N<sup>Z</sup>: Number of target atoms per unit volume
- $\omega$ : fluorescence yield of the considered layer
- b: relative intensity of the ray X
- $\varepsilon$ : detection efficiency,  $\varepsilon = \varepsilon_i \times \frac{\Omega}{4\pi}$ ;  $\Omega$ : solid angle
- $\sigma_i$ : Ionization cross section (constant for a thin target)
- $\mu_{\text{c}}$  : linear attenuation coefficient of the target

 $\phi$ : angle of incidence of the beam

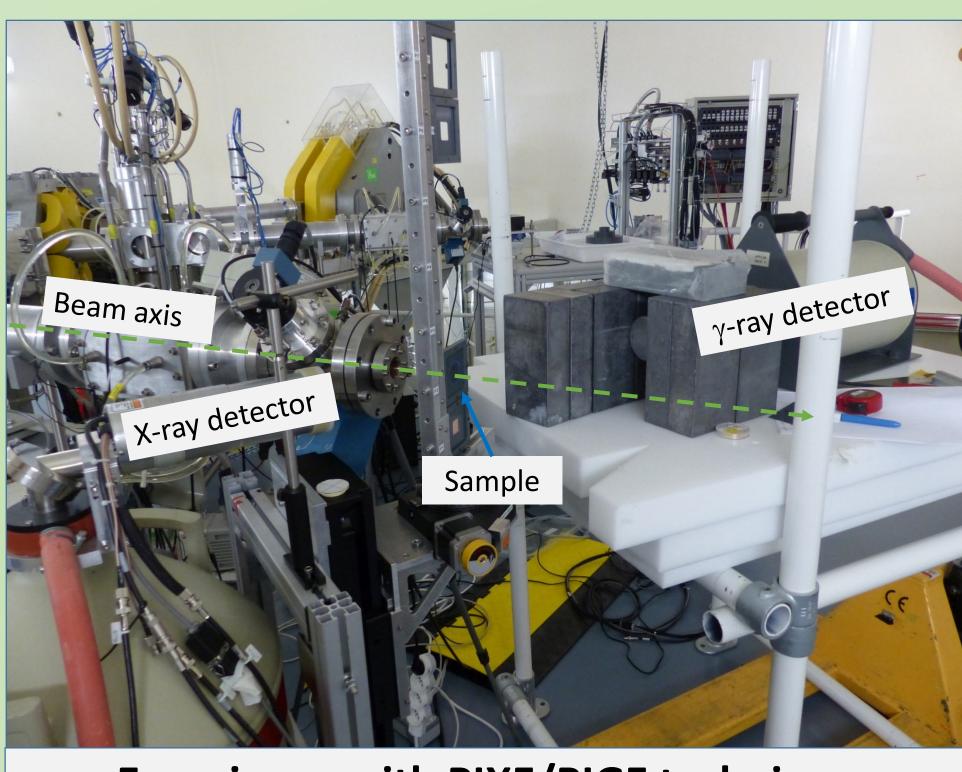
 $\xi = \frac{\cos \phi}{\cos \theta} \int_{E_f}^{E_i} \left(\frac{dE'}{dx}\right)^{-1} dE'$ 

**Beam Dump** 

For quantitative measurement, the following 3 factors are to be measured:  $N_p$ ,  $\varepsilon$  and  $\sigma_i$ 

 $E_i$ : initial particle energy ;  $E_f$ : final particle energy  $\theta$ : angle between detector and target normal

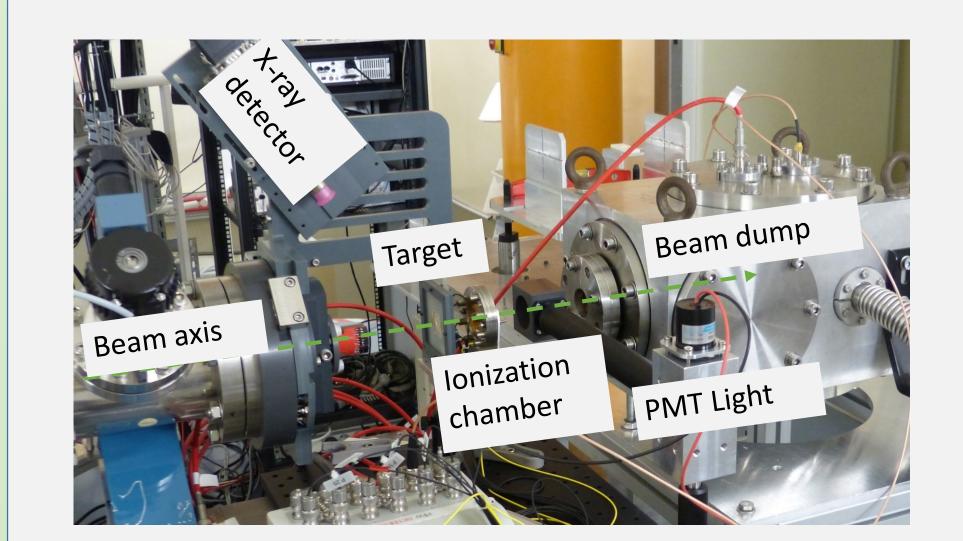
The combined use of the PIGE method, detection of  $\gamma$  emission, allows quantification for lights elements (Z<11).



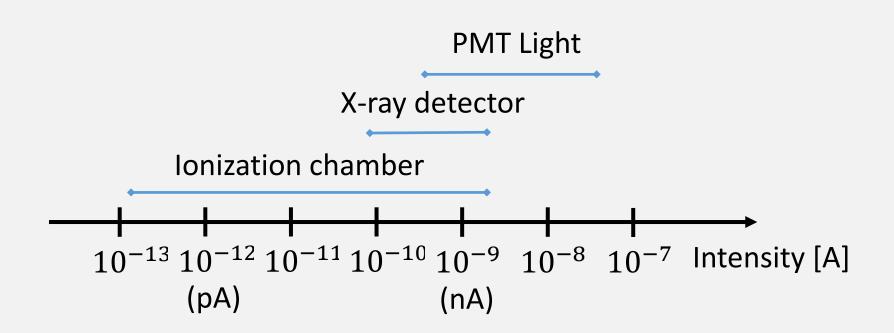
**Experience with PIXE/PIGE technique** 

### Number of incident particles N<sub>p</sub>

The number of incident particles can be determined using a beam current measurment. Several detectors can be used, each with an optimal range of use.



 $10^{-9} A \equiv 6.25 \ 10^{10} \text{ particles/s}$ 

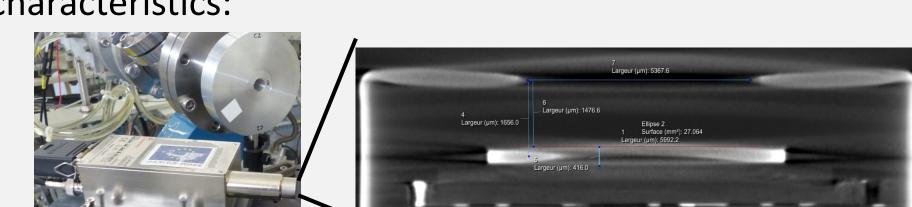


Optimal range of use of the different detectors

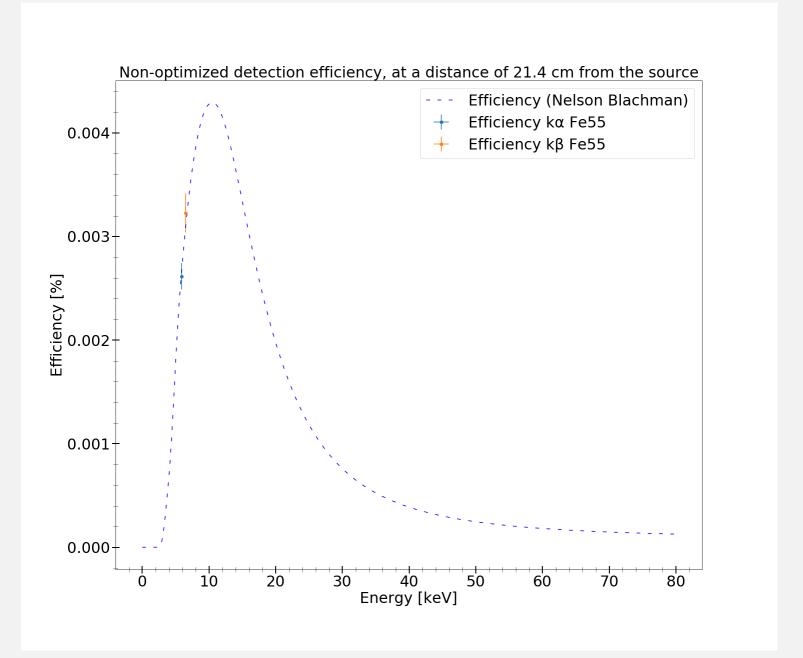
## **Detection efficiency ε**

 $N_X^Z = N_p N^Z \omega b \varepsilon \sum_{E_c}^{E_t} \sigma_i(E) e^{-\mu_c \xi} \left(\frac{dE}{dx}\right)^{-1} dE$ 

Use of an X-ray tomograph to determine some detector characteristics:



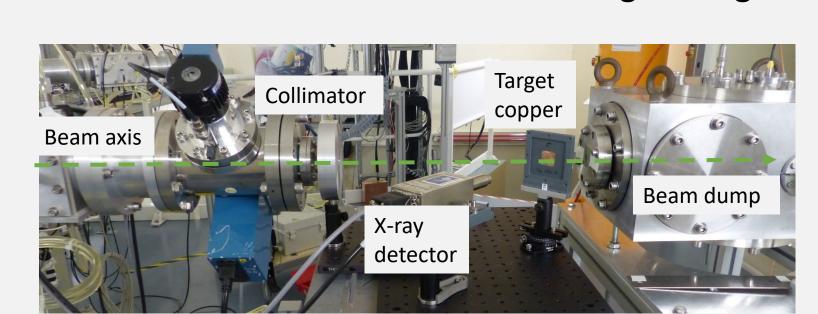
Experimental measurement of detection efficiency using a <sup>55</sup>Fe source:



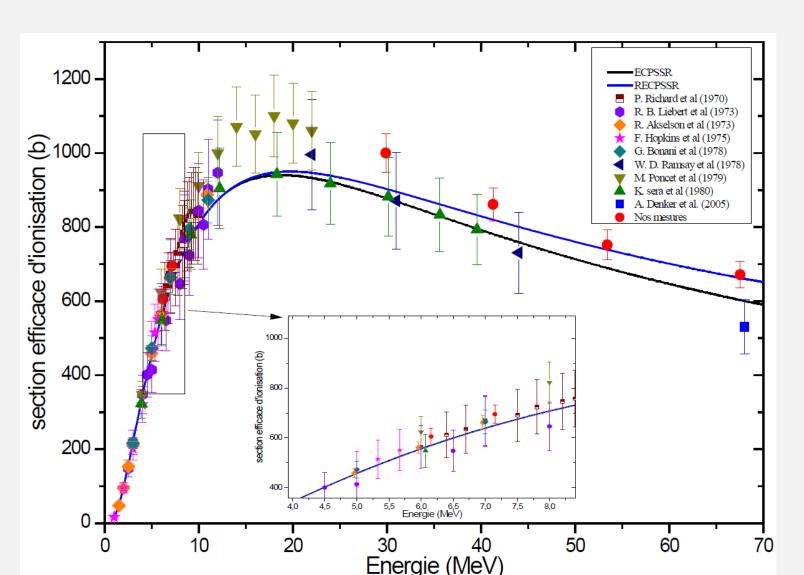
The geometric efficiency is based on the Blachman solid angle model. (B.P. Burtt, Nucleonics (1942) 42) Further measures are necessary to be able to constrain the efficiency curve.

#### Ionization cross section $\sigma_i$

Ionization cross-section measurement, at the energies available at the ARRONAX cyclotron (17 to 68 MeV), are required to validate the theoretical RECPSSR model for high energies.

#### **Future HE PIXE application at GIP ARRONAX**

- Study of cement for the storage of radioactive waste (Landesman C. SUBATECH):
- Investigation of the concentration of different elements in the layers of the sample
- Geological sediment study (Mouret A. LPG BIAF):
  - Investigation of the concentration of different elements along a burrow created by a worm
