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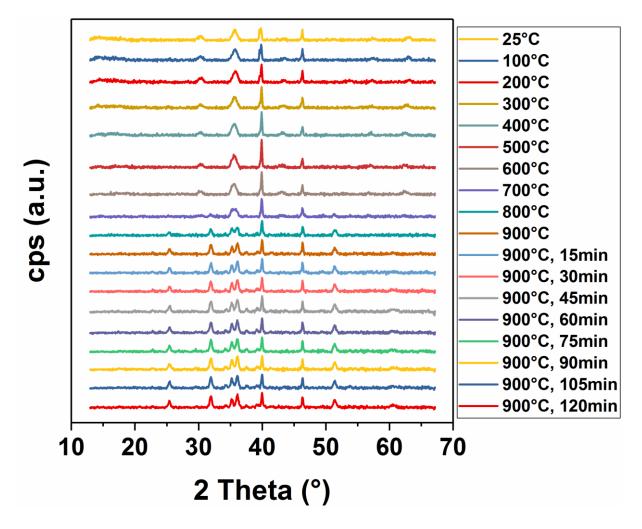


Figure S1. Same as Figure 3, but for additional pyrolysis temperatures and times.

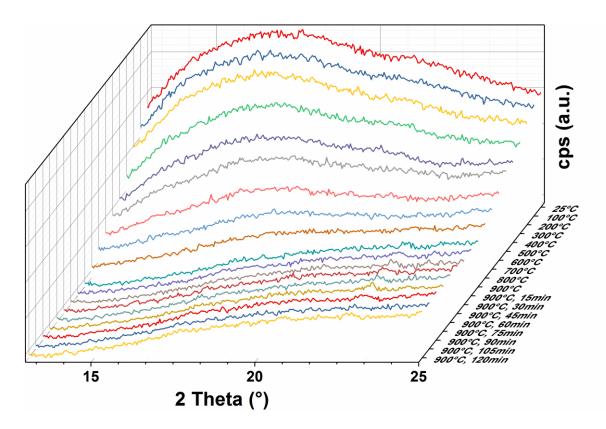
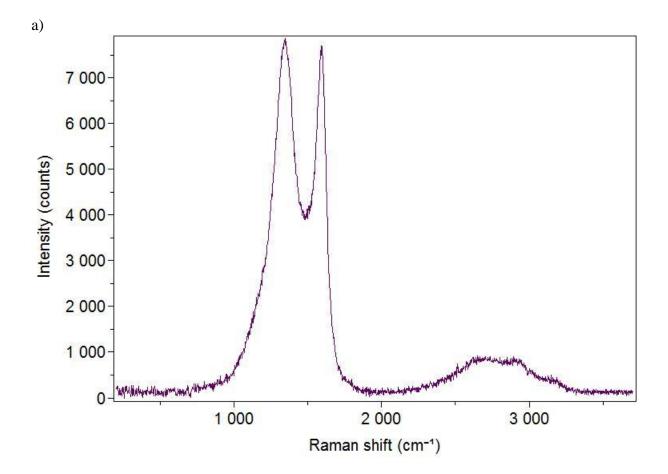
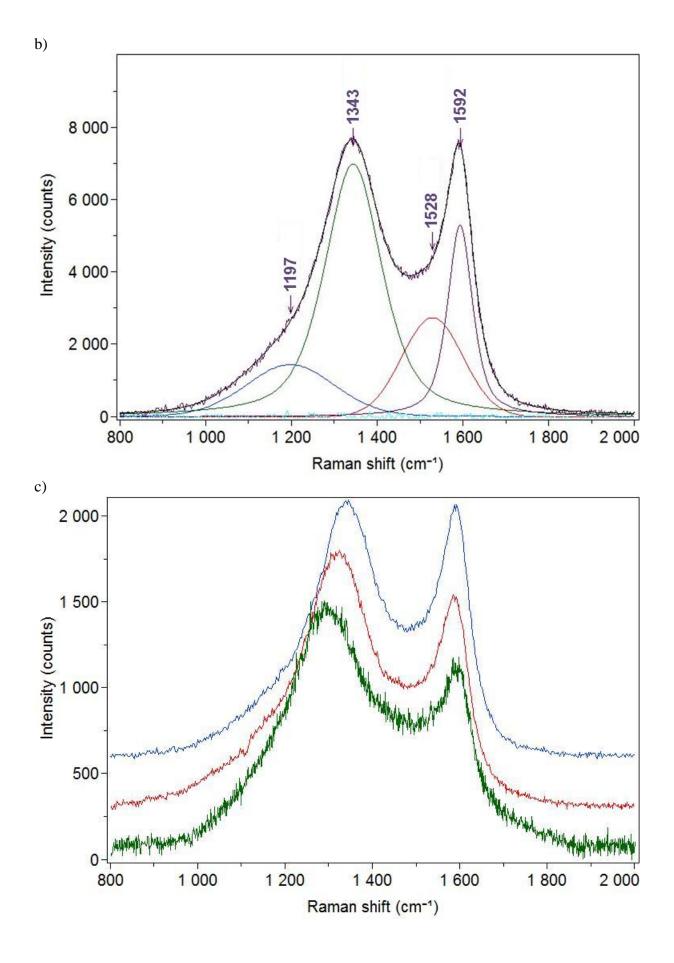
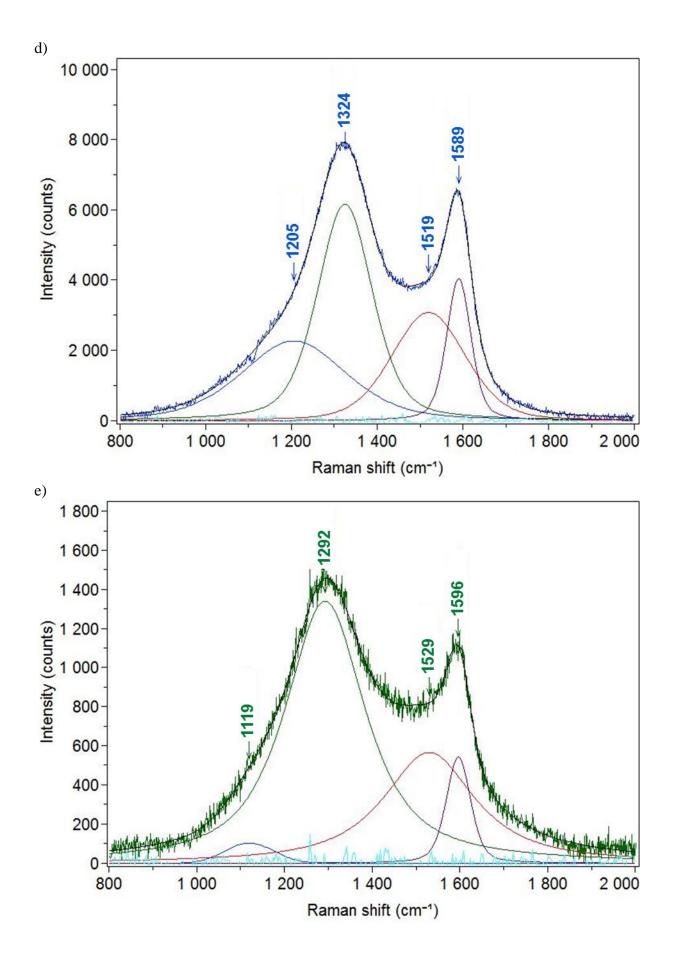


Figure S2. Same as Figure S1 but at low Bragg angle, showing the decay of the amorphous halo with increasing temperature.







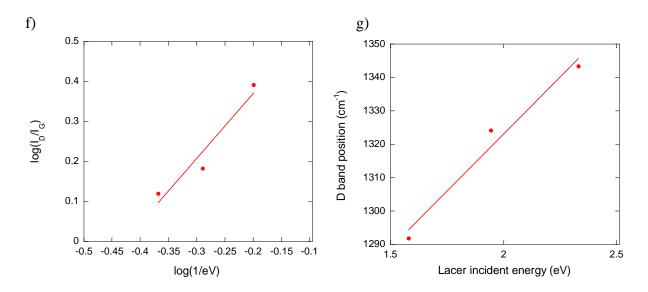
