



Context: The VERDON laboratory located in the LECA-STAR facility is devoted to the monitoring of fission products release and transportation during severe accidents. In the recent context of the Fukushima events, a new key issue has been identified: the impact of control rod degradation on the release of volatile fission products (FP). A higher than expected fraction of gaseous iodine might have been released during the accident due to the reaction of boron with CsI. A test was performed on high burn-up UO₂ fuel to address this new issue and consolidate the database on the source term assessment. For this purpose a new gamma spectrometry device was implemented directly in the VERDON hot cell to record the iodine deposit kinetics on a dedicated filter. It completes the on-line gamma stations of the VERDON CET loop focused on the fuel sample, the first hot leg of the CET, the aerosol FP filter and gaseous FP release.
