DDM for nonlinear problems

- \bullet (NKS) Newton solver in outer loop, linear DD (Krylov) in inner loop
- -Schwarz DD (Cai, Gropp, et al. 1994);
- -Schur DD (FETI) (Bhardwaj et al. 1999)....
- -Coupling with inexact Newton technique (Biros and Ghattas 2003).
- (SNK) Solve the nonlinearity at the scale of the subdomains:
- -Schwarz DD: ASPIN (Cai and Keyes 2002), RASPEN (Dolean et al. 2016), LATIN (Ladevèze, Néron, and Gosselet 2007), (Badea 2009), global/local non-invasive coupling (Gosselet et al. 2018).
- -Schur DD, "nonlinear relocalization": primal (Dirichlet) and mixed (Robin) approach (Cresta et al. 2007), dual approach (Pebrel, Rey, and Gosselet 2008) and nonlinear FETIDP and BDDC (Klawonn, Lanser, and Rheinbach 2014) with large scale assessments in (Klawonn, Lanser, Rheinbach, and Uran 2017a).

 \rightarrow Primal/dual/mixed approaches (Negrello, Gosselet, Rey, and Pebrel 2016), Improvement of the impedance of the mixed approach (Negrello, Gosselet, and Rey 2017).

Nonlinear PDE + FE + DD



Nonlinear PDE representative of quasi-static structure mechanics:

 $g_{int}(u) + g_{ext} = 0 \text{ in } \Omega$

Assumptions:

- g_{int} is differentiable, tangent matrices SPsD
- Global problem is well posed
- Classical Newton-Raphson would converge.

Decomposed version (block notations): $\mathbf{g_{int}} (\mathbf{u}) + \mathbf{g_{ext}} + \mathbf{T}^T \boldsymbol{\lambda_b} = 0 \text{ with } \begin{cases} \mathbf{B} \mathbf{u_b} = 0 \\ \mathbf{A} \boldsymbol{\lambda_b} = 0 \end{cases}$ $\bullet \boldsymbol{\lambda_b} : \text{ unknown local nodal reaction,}$ $\bullet \mathbf{T} : \text{ trace operator,}$ $\bullet \text{ subscript } b : \text{ boundary dof}$ $\bullet \mathbf{A} / \mathbf{B} : \text{ primal/dual assembly,}$ $\bullet \mathbf{\tilde{A}} / \mathbf{\tilde{B}} : \text{ scaling } \mathbf{A} \mathbf{\tilde{A}}^T = \mathbf{I}, \mathbf{B} \mathbf{\tilde{B}}^T \mathbf{B} = \mathbf{B} \\ \mathbf{A}^T \mathbf{\tilde{A}} + \mathbf{\tilde{B}}^T \mathbf{B} = \mathbf{I}$ $\bullet \text{ Small strain hypothesis:} \\ \exists \text{ rigib body motions } \mathbf{R} \\ \forall \mathbf{u}, \boldsymbol{\alpha}, \mathbf{g_{int}} (\mathbf{u} + \mathbf{R} \boldsymbol{\alpha}) = \mathbf{g_{int}} (\mathbf{u}) \\ \mathbf{R}^T \mathbf{g_{int}} = 0 \\ \text{Let } \mathbf{G}_B = \mathbf{B} \mathbf{T} \mathbf{R}$

Condensed NL formulations

Primal approach. Local Dirichlet–Neumann operator: $\lambda_{\mathbf{b}} = \mathbf{s}_{nl} (\mathbf{u}_{\mathbf{b}}; \mathbf{g}_{ext})$ Find $\mathbf{u}_{A} \in \mathbb{R}^{n_{A}}$ such that : $\mathbf{A} \mathbf{s}_{nl} (\mathbf{A}^{T} \mathbf{u}_{A}; \mathbf{g}_{ext}) = 0$ Dual approach. Compatibility condition: $\mathbf{R}^{T} (\mathbf{g}_{ext} + \mathbf{T}^{T} \lambda_{\mathbf{b}}) = 0$ Local Neumann-Dirichlet operator $\mathbf{u}_{\mathbf{b}} = \mathbf{f}_{nl} (\lambda_{\mathbf{b}}; \mathbf{g}_{ext}) + \mathbf{TR} \alpha$ $\lambda_{B} = \lambda_{B_{0}} + \mathbf{P}_{B} \tilde{\lambda}_{B}$ with: $\begin{cases} \mathbf{P}_{B} = \mathbf{I} - \mathbf{Q}_{B} \mathbf{G}_{B} (\mathbf{G}_{B}^{T} \mathbf{Q}_{B} \mathbf{G}_{B})^{-1} \mathbf{G}_{B}^{T}$ $\lambda_{B_{0}} = -\mathbf{Q}_{B} \mathbf{G}_{B} (\mathbf{G}_{B}^{T} \mathbf{Q}_{B} \mathbf{G}_{B})^{-1} \mathbf{R}^{T} \mathbf{g}_{ext},$ α can be computed by minimizing the \mathbf{Q}_{B} -norm of displacement jump. Find $\tilde{\lambda}_{B} \in \mathbb{R}^{n_{B}}$ such that: $\mathbf{P}_{B}^{T} \mathbf{B} \mathbf{f}_{nl} (\mathbf{B}^{T} (\lambda_{B_{0}} + \mathbf{P}_{B} \tilde{\lambda}_{B}); \mathbf{g}_{ext}) = 0$ \rightarrow Newton solver, tangent system is usual FETI (Krylov solver + Dirichlet preconditioner) Identical to FETI with Dirichlet preconditioner in linear
No contraction ⇒ Krylov solver in linear, Newton in nonlinear
One Newton iteration, starting from λ_b = B^T(λ_{B0} + P_B λ_B):
// Solve independant nonlinear Neumann problems u_b = f_{nl}(λ_b)
- Assemble displacement gap, compute continuous displacement û_b
// Solve independant nonlinear Dirichlet problems λ_b = B̃s_{nl}(û_b)
- Assemble reaction lack-of-balance, compute balanced reaction λ'_B
- Krylov solver for the (distributed) interface tangent system
B̃(Ds_{nl}') ([I - B̃^TP_B^TB] (Df_{nl})) B^TP_Bδ = -P_B(λ'_B - λ_B)
- Update reaction λ_b ← λ_b + B^TP_Bδ
Equivalent to classical NKS if no inner Newton iterations

• Equivalent to FETI-NL if no inner Newton iterations for Dirichlet problem

Limited extra parallel computations (inner Newtons)

Work in progress

- Large scale implementation for significant assessement and more general nonlinearities.
- Introducing robustness-enhancing techniques (adaptive coarse space, multipreconditioning) in this framework.
- Improvement of the load-balancing.
