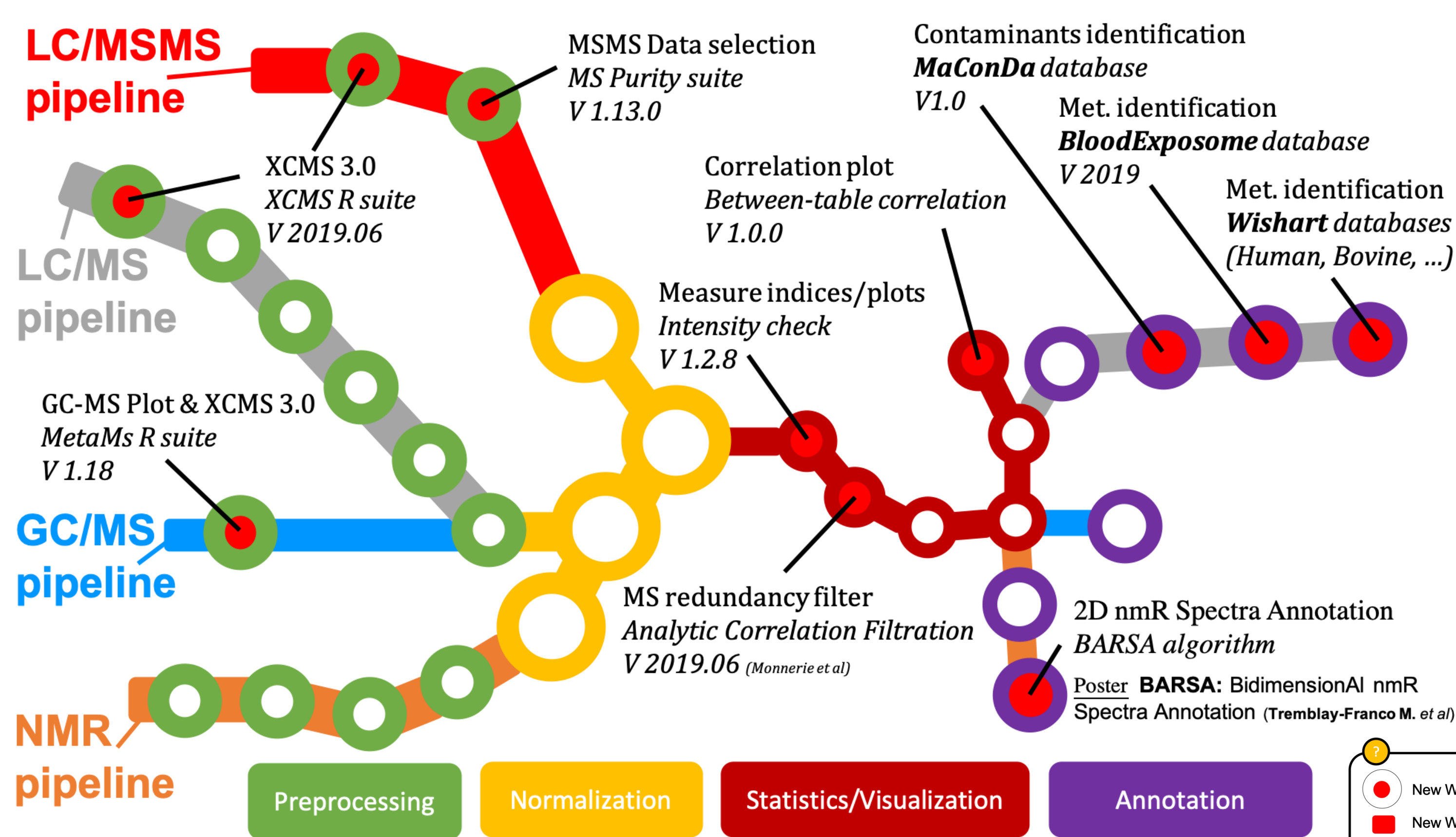
Introduction

Metabolomics data analysis is a complex, multistep process, constantly evolving with the development of new analytical technologies, mathematical methods, bioinformatics tools and databases. **Workflow4Metabolomics** is a collaborative portal dedicated to metabolomics data processing, analysis and annotation for the Metabolomics community. In the **3.0 version**, the W4M core team proposes new upgrades for LC-MS, GC-MS and NMR pipelines, including new preprocessing, quality control, statistical analysis and annotation tools. W4M aims to promote open science in Metabolomics and facilitate knowledge dissemination by providing new community resources.

New W4M LC-MS, LC-MSMS, GC-MS and NMR pipelines

The W4M core team makes continuous upgrades including pipeline enhancement, tool updates and new component development. The V3.0 of the W4M infrastructure integrates:

- A new pipeline, LC-MSMS data specific, including *MS Purity*^[1]
- A major upgrade of the data extraction tools' suite with *XCMS 3.0*^[2]
- Data filtering and visualization steps based on *Analytic Correlation Filtration*^[3] and *Between-table correlation* tools.
- New database resources for metabolite and contaminant annotation^[4,5,6] and the BARSAs new algorithm for NMR-2D spectral annotation.

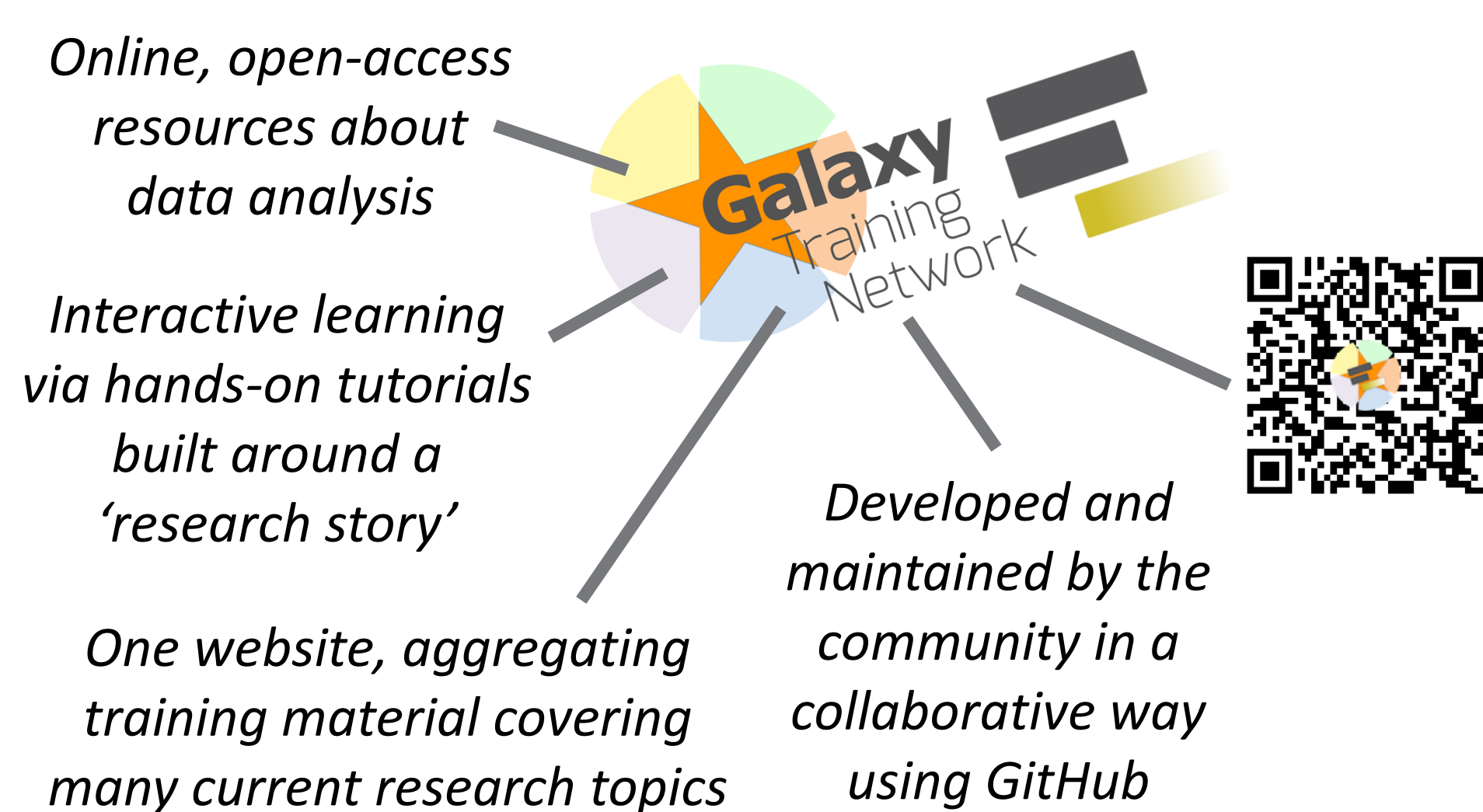

Open Science and open training materials

W4M is fully involved in the Open science movement. After providing Digital Object Identifiers (DOI) for user data history references^[7], new actions include producing training materials based on the Galaxy Training Network (GTN) concept and format.

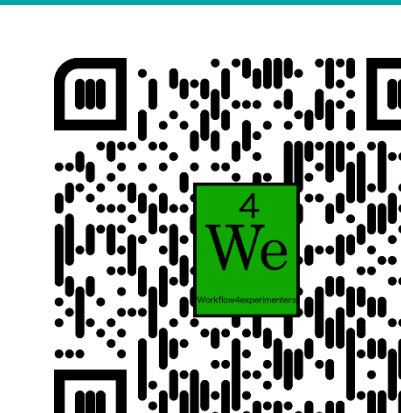
