Von Kármán approximation for the vibrations of post-buckled beams: supplementary material

Abstract

We plot figures 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the article for different values of L/h.

1 Notations

The beam has length L, width w, thickness h, Young's modulus E and density ρ . The bending rigidity is then $EI = Eh^3w/12$ and the stretching rigidity EA = Ehw, where A is the surface area and I the second moment of area of the cross-section. We consider slender beams, with a small slenderness ratio $\eta = I/(AL^2) = (1/12) (h/L)^2$. We use the following scheme to non-dimensionalize the equations

$$y = Y/L \quad , \quad x = X/L \tag{1}$$

$$\boldsymbol{n} = \boldsymbol{N}L^2/(EI)$$
 , $\boldsymbol{m} = ML/(EI)$ (2)

$$t = T/\tau$$
 , with $\tau = L^2 \sqrt{\rho A/(EI)}$ (3)

and we note that $\Omega = \omega/\tau$ is the physical angular frequency in radians per second. The (fixed) axial displacement D is defined as D = L - X(L,T) and we note d = D/L, T being the physical time in seconds.

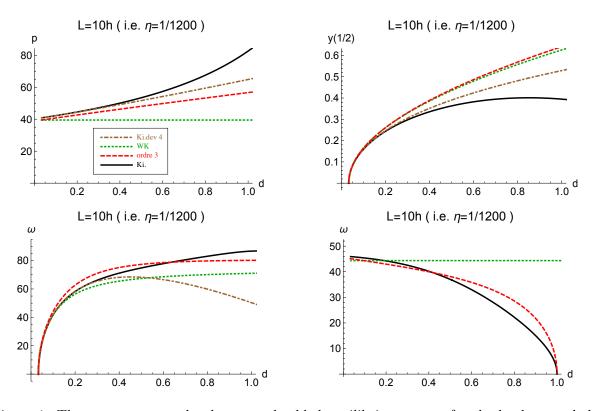


Figure 1: The two upper graphs show post-buckled equilibrium curves for the load p_E and the transverse deflection at midspan y(1/2) vs axial displacement d. The two lower graphs show the frequency ω of the 1st and 2nd vibration modes around the buckled equilibrium. The curves for the Kirchhoff model (noted Ki.), the Woinowsky-Krieger model (noted WK), the ordre 3 model (noted ordre 3), and the 4th order development of Kirchhoff model (noted Ki. dev 4) are shown. 'Ki. dev 4' is not plotted for the 2nd vibration mode.

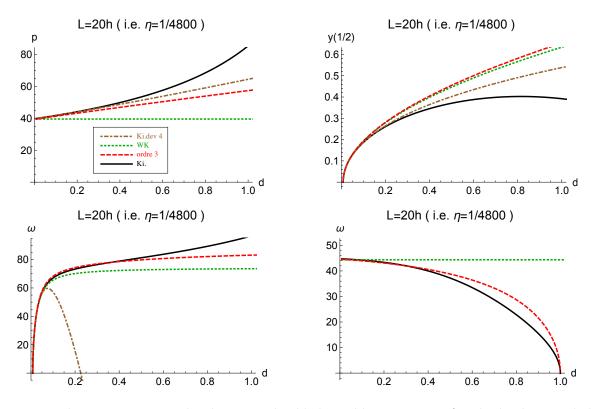


Figure 2: The two upper graphs show post-buckled equilibrium curves for the load p_E and the transverse deflection at midspan y(1/2) vs axial displacement d. The two lower graphs show the frequency ω of the 1st and 2nd vibration modes around the buckled equilibrium. The curves for the Kirchhoff model (noted Ki.), the Woinowsky-Krieger model (noted WK), the ordre 3 model (noted ordre 3), and the 4th order development of Kirchhoff model (noted Ki. dev 4) are shown. 'Ki. dev 4' is not plotted for the 2nd vibration mode.

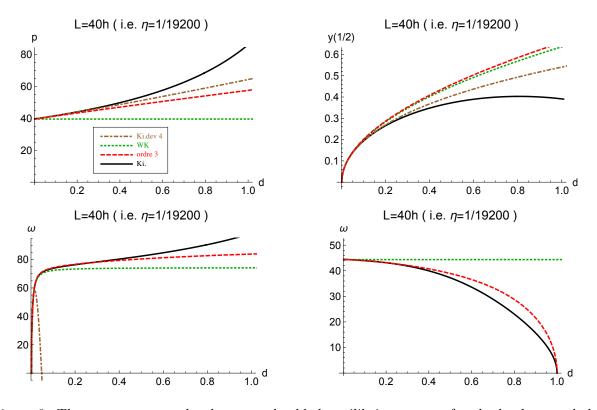


Figure 3: The two upper graphs show post-buckled equilibrium curves for the load p_E and the transverse deflection at midspan y(1/2) vs axial displacement d. The two lower graphs show the frequency ω of the 1st and 2nd vibration modes around the buckled equilibrium. The curves for the Kirchhoff model (noted Ki.), the Woinowsky-Krieger model (noted WK), the ordre 3 model (noted ordre 3), and the 4th order development of Kirchhoff model (noted Ki. dev 4) are shown. 'Ki. dev 4' is not plotted for the 2nd vibration mode.

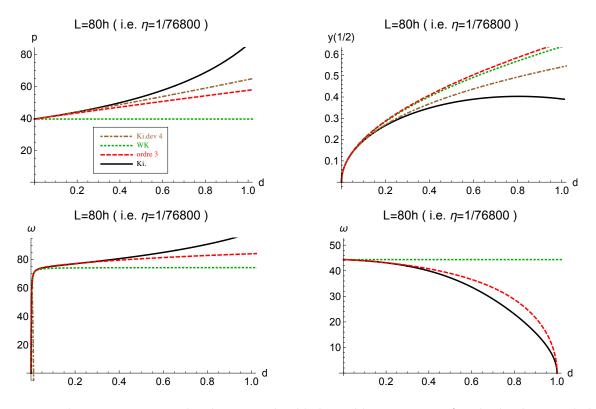


Figure 4: The two upper graphs show post-buckled equilibrium curves for the load p_E and the transverse deflection at midspan y(1/2) vs axial displacement d. The two lower graphs show the frequency ω of the 1st and 2nd vibration modes around the buckled equilibrium. The curves for the Kirchhoff model (noted Ki.), the Woinowsky-Krieger model (noted WK), the ordre 3 model (noted ordre 3), and the 4th order development of Kirchhoff model (noted Ki. dev 4) are shown. 'Ki. dev 4' is not plotted for the 2nd vibration mode.
