- The **chaos** can mask the **forced** evolution locally
- **Extracting the forced evolution is crucial:**  
observations alone ? → very difficult

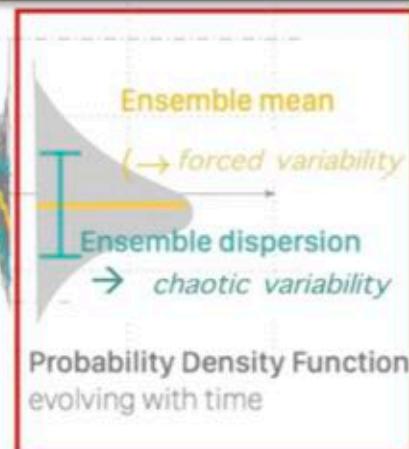
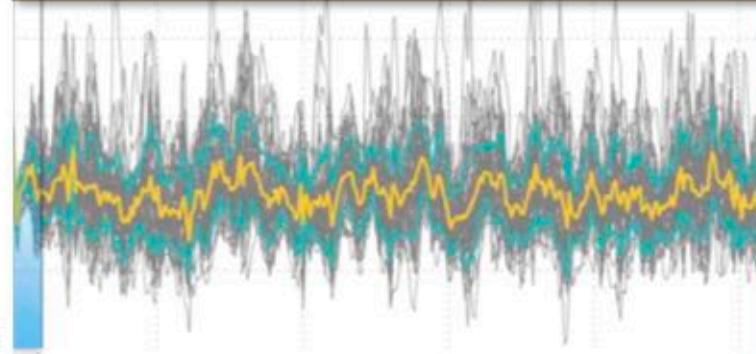


## OCCIPUT ensemble simulation :

- 50 global NEMO simulations ( $1/4^\circ$ )
- same forcing based on ERA-Interim
- slight initial perturbations

→ Separate forced and chaotic signals

Can we use ensemble simulations to estimate the forced signals in observations ?

Still exploratory

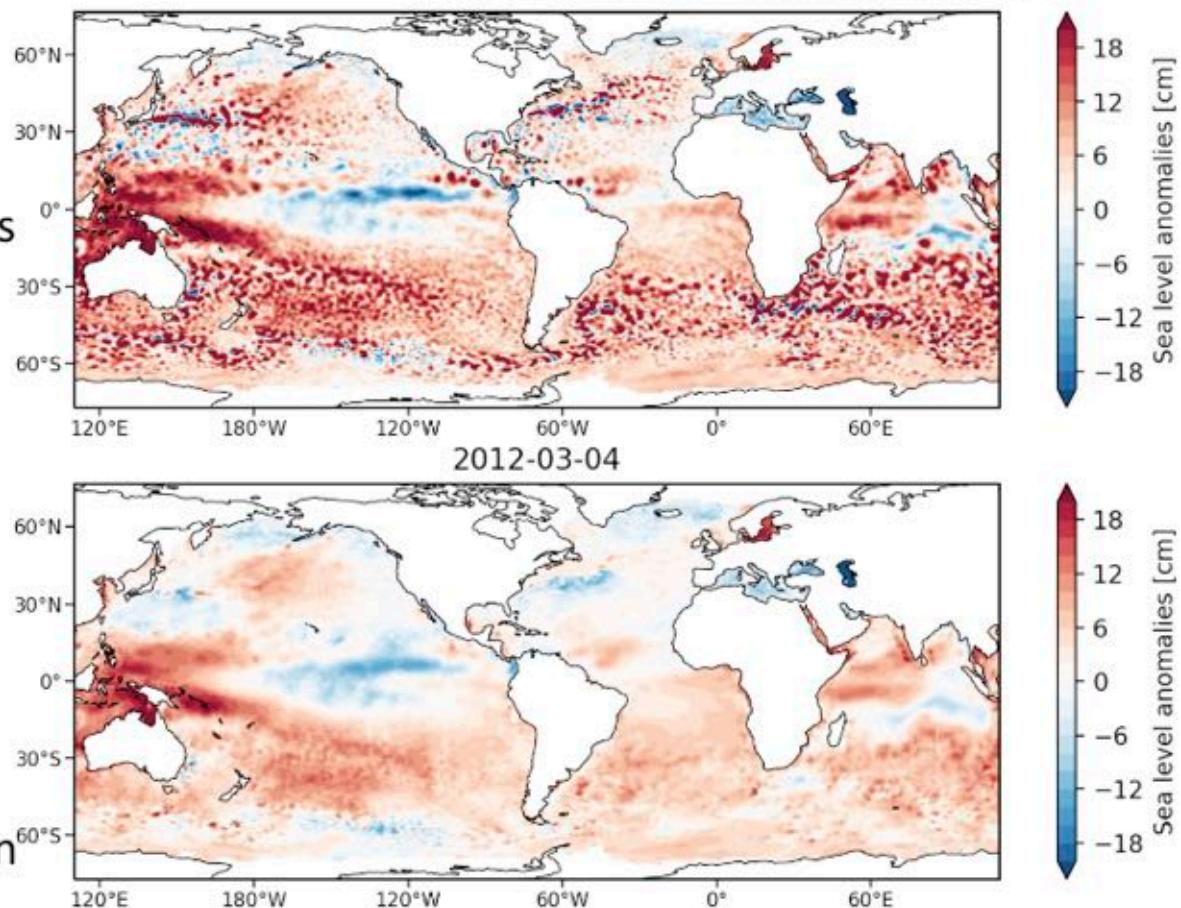
New insights into natural systems
