$$i = 0,1,2,3 \Leftrightarrow \text{ Stokes } (I,Q,U,V)$$

 $\varepsilon_i^{(2)}$: emission from upper levels (from order-2) $\varepsilon_i^{(4)}$: correction for Rayleigh (coherent) scattering in the far wings

NUMERICAL APPLICATION



- second solar spectrum of Na I D1 & D2
- from Bommier (2016) native equations
 - resolution of the statistical equilibrium equations (for each velocity class)
 - radiative transfer integration: Feautrier's method
- unpolarized infinitely sharp lower levels



- no redistribution functions
- no source functions
- no trapezoid method integrals (all Gauss integrals)
- no angular average (dangerous for polarization !)
- present calculation: no hyperfine structure (I=0)
- the collisional quenching reduces the linear polarization by a factor of 2
 velocity distribution: departs up to 20% from Maxwellian in ²P states

calculation Na I $D_1 \& D_2$ including the hyperfine structure to be submitted to a national computing center (16384 // threads) in 2017
