Introduction

- Physical exercise has shown to improve gait disorders in Parkinson's disease (PD)
- In Lyon (France), Sirocco is a novel, comprehensive, multidisciplinary rehabilitation program focused on intensive, high amplitude movements, and loudness of speech for 5 weeks with PD patients
- The aim was to assess the effects of the Sirocco program on DLPFC activity and gait during single task (ST) and dual-task (DT) walking in patients with PD

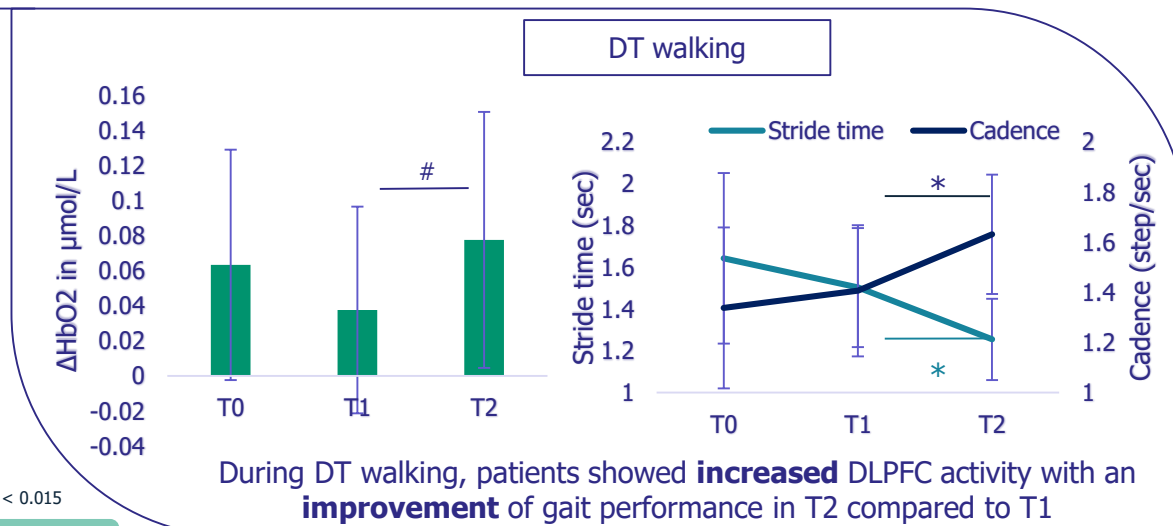
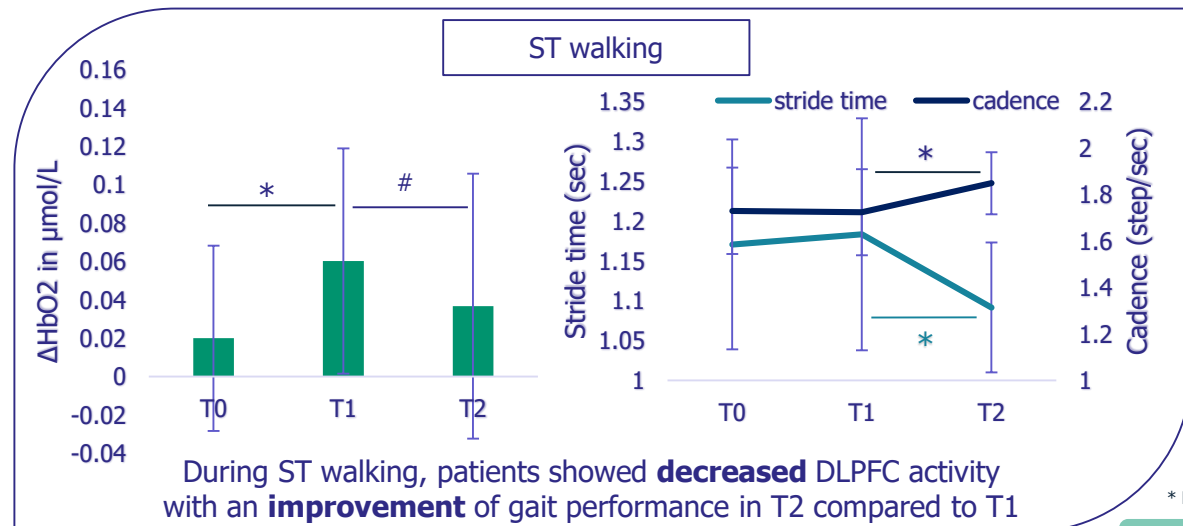
Methods

- 14 patients with PD (10M/4F)
- 3 measurements:
 - 5 weeks before the program (T0)
 - Before the program (T1)
 - After the program (T2)
- ST walking : usual walking
DT walking: walking while subtracting 7
- Changes in oxyhemoglobin concentration (ΔHbO_2)
- Mean stride time and cadence

Conclusion

- The program seemed to improve **automaticity** of walking during ST walking and **mobilization of neural cognitive resources** during DT walking
- Sirocco program seems to be a **promising** program to improve DLPFC activity and gait performance in PD
- Larger sample is needed to confirm these results
