Harletz (HZ12) Loess & Paleosol Sequence

Sampling and Analyses • Field measurements on cleaned face:

- Magnetic susceptibility Color spectroscopy
- Continuous column bulk sampling of 5 cm intervals, homogenised & redistributed
 - Analyses : granulometry magnetic mineralogy carbon isotopes
- Oriented sampling @ 5 cm depth intervals, 2 to 4 specimens per interval *Analyses : magnetic anisotropy paleomagnetism*
- Other specialized sampling for: Optically stimulated luminescence (OSL) Mollusc species identification

Harletz (HZ12) – Stratigraphy & Chronology

- 20 m thick loess and paleosol sequence (Antoine et al., 2019, *Quat. Sci. Rev.*)
 - Basal Ogosta Soil complex developed on alluvial plain sediment.
 - 10 m of loess with at its base 4 incipient soils
 - Harletz Soil complex (Cambisol steppe soil)
 - 4 m of loess heavily bioturbated
 - Truncated topsoil
- OSL age determinations on fine grained quartz and coarse grained feldspar (Lomax et al., 2019, *Boreas*)
- Tephra in the 12.10-12.00 m depth interval
 - Not observed in the field
 - Prominent in rock magnetic data
 - Likely Vico B ignimbrite (Geochemical and stratigraphic arguments)
 - Leicher et al. (2016) Lake Ohrid 162 +/- 8
 - Manella et al. (2019) Fucino paleolake 158.4 +/- 2.5 ka



Harletz (HZ12) – Stratigraphy & Chronology

- Loess & Paleosol archive spans from MIS 7 to the present.
 - Last 2 glacial / interglacial cycles
- Remarkably dilated 10m record of the penultimate glacial period (MIS 6).
 - Unique in the European loess belt, so far.
- Sedimentation rates through MIS 6 average ~16 cm/kyr.
 - Possible to record millennial timescale variations in climate and environmental change.
