Non-Smooth Modal Analysis (NSMA)

- Objective: resonant frequencies and energies of structures in unilateral contact
- Requires finding periodic solutions to autonomous non-smooth systems



Figure 1: Modal spectrum of bar in unilateral contact and periodic solution

Current Works

- NSMA for constant-area bar using Wave-FEM¹, and analytically²
- Methods does not apply for varying-area bar or multi-dimensional case

Problem Statement

Governing Equation

$$\rho u_{tt} = (\sigma(u(x,t)))_x \tag{1}$$

$$\sigma(u(x,t)) = A(x)Eu_x \tag{2}$$

Cantilever conditions

$$u(0,t) = 0 \tag{3}$$

- Signorini conditions³
 - Free phase

$$u(L,t) \le g, \quad \sigma(u(x,t))|_{x=L} = 0 \tag{4}$$

Contact phase

$$\sigma(u(x,t))|_{x=L} \le 0, \quad u(L,t) = g \tag{5}$$

Initial conditions and periodicity

$$u(x,0) = u_0(x)$$
 $u_t(x,0) = v_0(x)$

$$u(x, 0) = u(x, T)$$
 $u_t(x, 0) = u_t(x, T)$

Figure 2: motion of bar in unilateral contact

Finite Element Analysis with Newton Impact Law

Displacement approximation via nodal displacements u

$$u(x,t) \approx \sum_{i=1}^{N} \phi_i(x) u_i(t), \quad \mathbf{u} = \begin{pmatrix} u_1(t) & u_2(t) & \dots & u_N(t) \end{pmatrix}^{\mathsf{T}}$$
(8)

- Test functions $\mathbf{w} = \begin{pmatrix} w_1(t) & w_2(t) & \dots & w_N(t) \end{pmatrix}^\mathsf{T}$
- FEM weak-formulation of cantilever bar: for all w

$$\mathbf{w}^{\mathsf{T}}(\mathbf{M}\ddot{\mathbf{u}} + \mathbf{K}\mathbf{u}) - w_N\lambda = 0$$

 λ : boundary-force.

- Application of Signorini condition ⇒ ill-posed problem⁴
- Signorini conditions require an impact law for well-posedness

$$u_N(t) = g \Rightarrow \dot{u}_N(t^+) = -e\dot{u}_N(t^-) \tag{10}$$

(9)

e: coefficient of restitution ($0 \le e \le 1$).

Newton Impact Law and Signorini Condition

- e = 0: Theoretical Sticking Phase (\checkmark) with dissipation of energy (\checkmark).
- e = 1: Chattering (\checkmark) with conservation of energy (\checkmark).

(b) e = 1

Motivation for Nodal Boundary Method

- **Issue:** Impact law e = 0 annihilates periodic solutions.
- Proposed solution: Determination of $\dot{\mathbf{u}}_N$ via FEM stress approximation: $\sigma_N(\mathbf{u})$.

Proposed Methodology

FEM: weak form and stress approximation

$$\mathbf{w}^{\mathsf{T}}(\mathbf{M}\ddot{\mathbf{u}} + \mathbf{K}\mathbf{u}) - w_N \sigma_N(\mathbf{u}) = 0$$
(11)

$$\sigma_N(\mathbf{u}) = EA(L) \sum_{i=1}^N \phi_{i,x}(L)u_i$$
(12)

Nodal boundary method (NBM): explicitly determine u_N at free/contact phase

Contact phase:
$$\sigma_N(\mathbf{u}) \le 0, \quad u_N = g, \qquad w_N = 0$$
 (13)

Free phase:
$$u_N \le g$$
, $\sigma_N(\mathbf{u}) = 0$, $\sigma_N(\mathbf{w}) = 0$ (14)

- Restriction $\sigma_N(\mathbf{u}) = 0$ defines motion u_N during free phase
- Restriction $\sigma_N(\mathbf{w}) = 0$ allows energy conservation during free phase

Example of Nodal Boundary Method on linear shape functions and N = 2

FEM on cantilever bar

$$(w_1 \quad w_2) \left(\begin{bmatrix} 4/3 & 1/3 \\ 1/3 & 2/3 \end{bmatrix} \begin{pmatrix} \ddot{u}_1 \\ \ddot{u}_2 \end{pmatrix} + \begin{bmatrix} 16 & -8 \\ -8 & 8 \end{bmatrix} \begin{pmatrix} u_1 \\ u_2 \end{pmatrix} \right) + w_2 \sigma_2(\mathbf{u}) = 0$$
(15)

$$\sigma_2(\mathbf{u}) = \phi_{1,x}(1)u_1 + \phi_{2,x}(1)u_2 = 2(u_2 - u_1) \tag{16}$$

Determination of Free Motion

Signorini conditions for free motion

$$u_2 < g, \quad \sigma_2(\mathbf{u}) = 2(u_2 - u_1) = 0 \text{ and } \sigma_2(\mathbf{w}) = 2(w_2 - w_1) = 0$$
 (17)

The constraints (17) are satisfied by setting

$$u_2 \leftarrow u_1 \text{ and } w_2 \leftarrow w_1$$
 (18)

Constraints (18) are plugged into ODE (15). Apply for all w₁ ⇒ ODE in u₁

$$8/3\ddot{u}_1 + 8u_1 = 0, \quad u_1 < g \tag{19}$$

Example continued: Determination of Contact Motion

Signorini conditions for contact motion

$$2(u_2 - u_1) \le 0, \quad u_2 = g \Rightarrow \ddot{u}_2 = 0 \text{ and } w_2 = 0$$
 (20)

Constraints (20) are plugged into Finite Element ODE (15) ⇒ ODE in u1

$$4/3\ddot{u}_1 + 16u_1 - 8g = 0, \quad u_1 \ge g \tag{21}$$

ODE by Nodal Boundary Method

1

- Displacement of contact node, u2, does not participate in ODE
- Displacement u₂ and stress \(\sigma_2(\mu)\) are defined by u₁

$$u_{2} = \begin{cases} g & u_{1} \ge g \\ u_{1} & u_{1} < g \end{cases}, \quad \sigma_{2}(\mathbf{u}) = \begin{cases} 2(g - u_{1}) & u_{1} \ge g \\ 0 & u_{1} < g \end{cases}$$
(22)

Non-contact boundary node u₁ abides non smooth ODE

$$\begin{cases} 4/3\ddot{u}_1 + 16u_1 - 8g = 0 & u_1 \ge g, \text{ contact phase} \\ 8/3\ddot{u}_1 + 8u_1 = 0 & u_1 < g, \text{ free phase} \end{cases}$$

(23)

Example Continued: Properties of Nodal Boundary Method

- Theoretical sticking at contact in the continuous time framework.
- Energy can be regained and does not always dissipate.

Nodal Boundary Method: General Procedure

1. Apply $\sigma_N(\mathbf{u}) = 0$ to determine u_N during free motion

$$\sigma_N(\mathbf{u}) = \sum_{i=1}^N \phi_{i,x}(L)u_i = 0 \Rightarrow u_N = -\sum_{i=1}^{N-1} \frac{\phi_{i,x}(L)}{\phi_{N,x}(L)}u_i \equiv S(\mathbf{u})$$
(24)

- **2**. $S(\mathbf{u})$ does not depend on u_N
- **3**. Apply $\sigma_N(\mathbf{w}) = 0$ to determine $w_N : w_N = S(\mathbf{w})$
- **4**. Restate Signorini conditions in terms of $S(\mathbf{u})$

$$S(\mathbf{u}) \ge g, \quad u_N = g, \quad w_N = 0, \quad \sigma_N(\mathbf{u}) = \phi_{N,x}(L)(g - S(\mathbf{u})) \tag{25}$$

$$S(\mathbf{u}) < g, \quad u_N = S(\mathbf{u}), \quad w_N = S(\mathbf{w}), \quad \sigma_N(\mathbf{u}) = 0$$
(26)

5. Apply Singorini conditions to weak form of FEM.

$$\begin{cases} \mathbf{M}_{f} \ddot{\mathbf{u}}_{r} + \mathbf{K}_{f} \mathbf{u}_{r} = 0 & S(\mathbf{u}_{r}) < g, \text{ Free motion} \\ \mathbf{M}_{c} \ddot{\mathbf{u}}_{r} + \mathbf{K}_{c} \mathbf{u}_{r} = g \mathbf{f}_{c} & S(\mathbf{u}_{r}) \ge g, \text{ Contact motion} \end{cases}$$
(27)

subscript r - removed term u_N .



(d) Contact Boundary Velocity



Nodal-Boundary Finite-Element Method for Periodic Solutions of the Signorini Problem



Figure 6: Convergence plot of bouncing bar

Bar with Varying Area: Periodic Solutions

- Periodic solutions to the bar with varying area A(x) = 1 x/5 and length L = 1.
- Find periodic solutions to nodal boundary method ODE of the bar:

$$\mathcal{L}[\mathbf{u}_r] = \begin{cases} \mathbf{M}_f \, \ddot{\mathbf{u}}_r + \mathbf{K}_f \, \mathbf{u}_r = 0 & S(\mathbf{u}_r) < g, \\ \mathbf{M}_c \, \ddot{\mathbf{u}}_r + \mathbf{K}_c \, \mathbf{u}_r = g \mathbf{f}_c & S(\mathbf{u}_r) \ge g, \end{cases}$$
(28)

Harmonic Balance Method⁵(HBM)

• Trial solution $\mathbf{u}_r \approx \mathbf{U}$:

$$U_i = \sum_{j=0}^{H} C_{ij} \cos(j\omega t)$$
⁽²⁹⁾

• Minimization of residual $\mathcal{L}[\mathbf{U}(t, \omega, \mathbf{C})]$ via projection onto cosine series

$$F_{i}(\omega, \mathbf{C}) = \int_{0}^{2\pi/\omega} \cos(i\omega t) \mathcal{L}[\mathbf{U}(t, \omega, \mathbf{C})] dt = 0$$
(30)

where ${\bf F}$ is a system of non-smooth equations in ${\bf C}$ and $\omega.$

HBM Convergence in H

Difference between HBM solution and accurate ODE solution for specific H $r2\pi/\omega$

$$\operatorname{Error} = \int_{0} ||\mathbf{U}(t) - \mathbf{u}_{r}(t)||_{2} \mathrm{d}t \qquad (31)$$



HBM Convergence in N

Difference in HBM variables C and ω with respect to previous N

> 80 90 100

) Error =
$$||\mathbf{C}_N - \mathbf{C}_{N-1}|| + ||\omega_N - \omega_{N-1}||$$
 (32)

Nodal Boundary method: Conclusions

- Novel method for Singorini complementarity condition with theoretical sticking
- Instead of impact law, motion of u_N (and \dot{u}_N) dictated by stress approximation $\sigma_N(\mathbf{u})$
- Resulting ODE exhibits periodic solutions
- Periodic solutions found for previously unsolved case: varying area bar in unilateral contact

Future Work

- Continuation of periodic solutions to find non-smooth modes
- Analytical proofs for convergence
- Extension of the method in 2D and 3D
