The Magnetocrystalline Anisotropy (MCA) describes the variation of the total energy induced by the rotation of the overall rotation of magnetic moments for a given magnetic ground state. During this study, we investigated the MCA by taking into account the Spin-Orbit Coupling as a perturbation at the second order of the total energy of such state. For a given orientation of magnetic moments along the [uvw] crystallographic direction, this quantity expresses as:

$$MCA_{[uvw]} = E_{[uvw]} - E_{min} \tag{1}$$

where  $E_{[uvw]}$  is the corresponding total DFT energy, and  $E_{min}$  is the DFT energy of the most stable orientation of magnetic moments.

Figure S 1 evidences the evolution of the MCA in the (a,c) plane with respect to the hydrostatic pressure. By increasing the pressure from 0 GPa to 38 GPa, we showed that i) the easiest magnetization direction is still along the **b** axis, ii) the MCA slightly rotates as evidenced by the direction associated to the maximum which moves away from the **c** axis, and iii) the maximum is slightly decreasing. Our results are in good agreement with our previous DFT simulations [1].

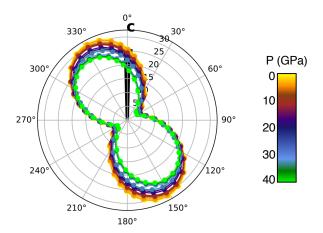
