# **INTRODUCTION:**

# Cancer cachexia:

- Is a multifactorial syndrome often including skeletal muscle atrophy.
- Affects at least 55% of patients bearing Head and Neck Squamous Cell Carcinomas (HNSCCs)
- HNSCC patients.

# **Part 1** : Investigations on human myoblasts co-cultivated *in vitro* with HNSCC cells



Influence of HNSCC cells on human differentiating myoblasts in vitro

→ Significant impact of HNSCC cells on myoblast CONCLUSIONS: Up-regulation of BIRC 3 is a transcriptional modification shared by sarcopenic muscles in ENT patients and in xenografted mice as well as by myoblasts co-cultivated in vitro with malignant cells. Although the mechanism of BIRC3 up-regulation in cachectic muscle cells is not yet known, this finding is likely to be important for the management of HNSCC patients in proliferation and consistent impairment of myoblast a context of promising therapeutic results obtained using Smac mimetics. Because these compounds are inhibitors of the c-IAP protein family, it will be important in the future to monitor differentiation. their positive or negative effects on muscle alterations in cachectic HNSCC patients.
