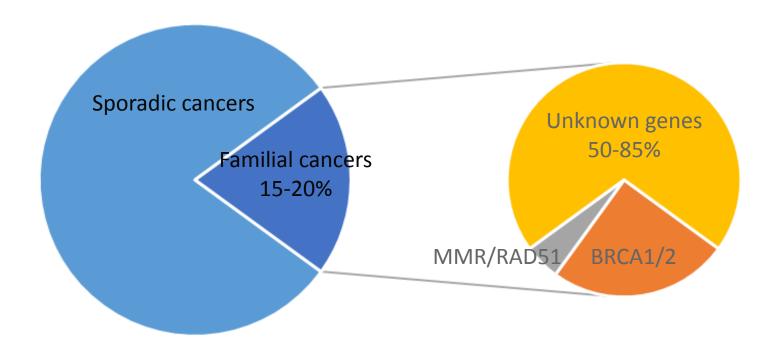






## High grade serous ovarian cancer

- 9th type of cancer
- 5th cause of death
- Late diagnostic and poor prognosis
- 15 20% of familial cancers :

## 11 000 families in oncogenetic department of Centre Jean Perrin



- 2 cases of high grade serous ovarian cancers;
- No breast cancer;
- No mutation in BRCA/RAD51/MMR genes

## 16 families of hereditary predisposition of high grade serous ovarian



- Rare variants (GnomAD <0,5%);</li>
- Truncating variants or splice variants or missense variants
- Genes with variants in at least 2 families;
- Genes described in carcinogenesis processes

37 variants in 12 candidate genes implicated in 3 pathways



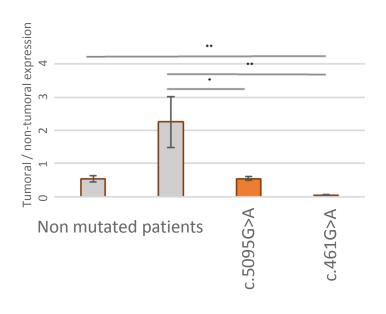

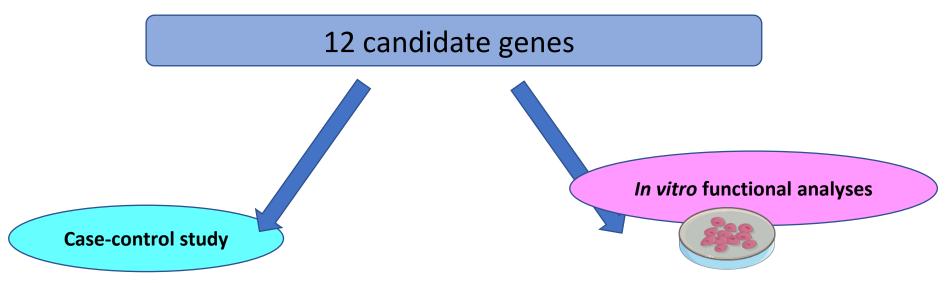
#### **Tumoral expression**

Sequencing of the 12 genes coding regions for 200 blood DNA from women with high-grade serous ovarian cancer.

Inhibition or overexpression of the candidate genes in an ovarian cell line
Study of the impact on proliferative,
apoptotic, migratory and invasive properties
