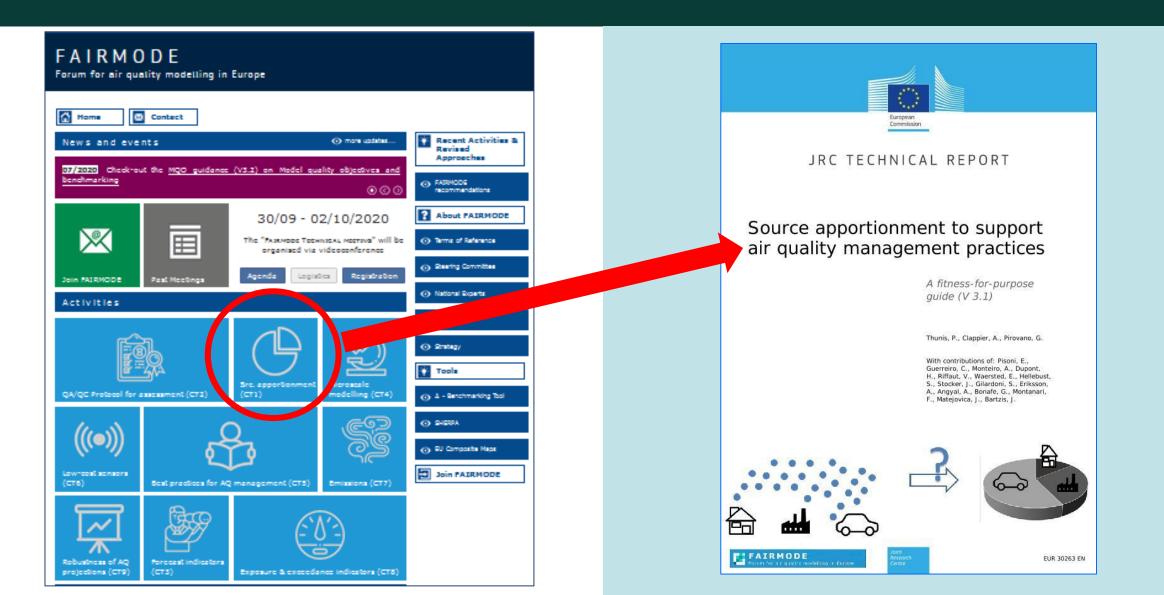

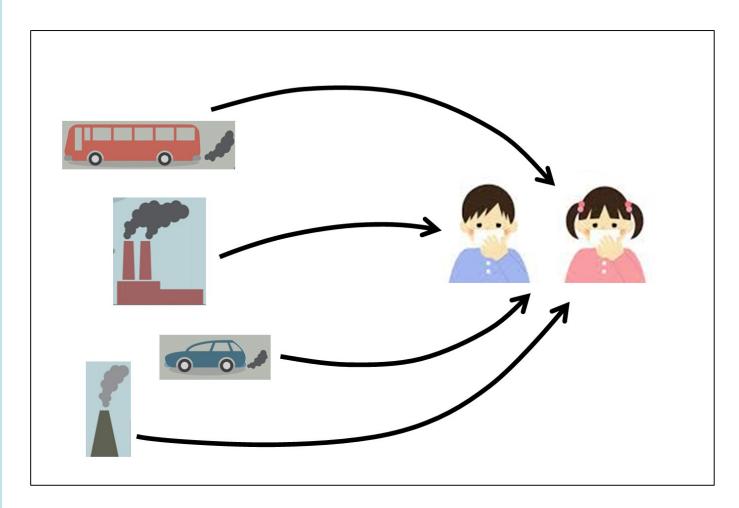

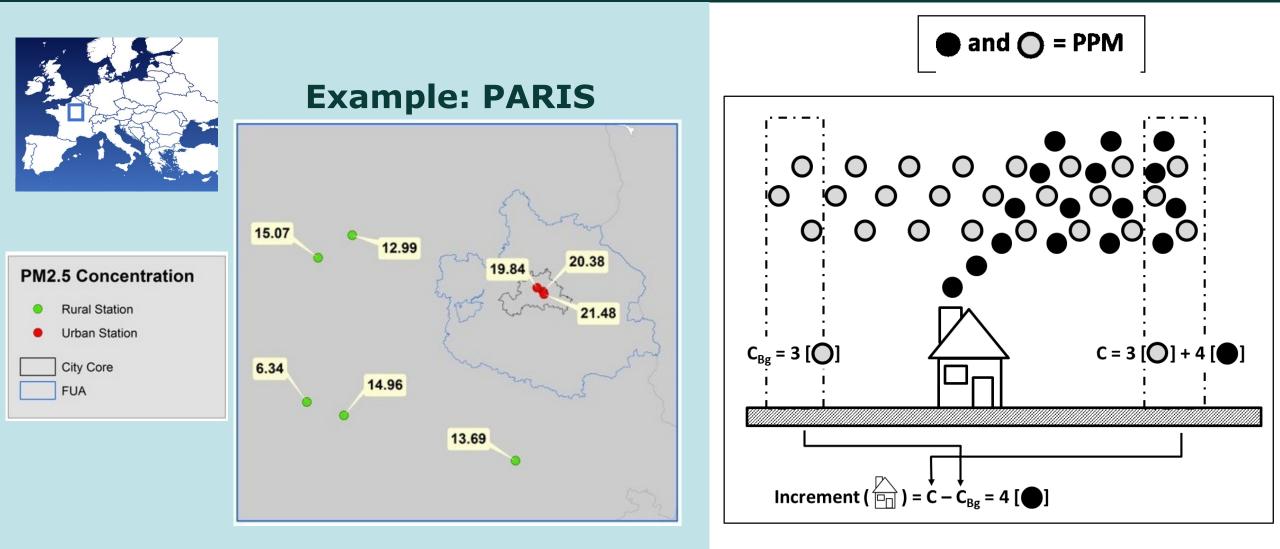


What is Source Apportionment?

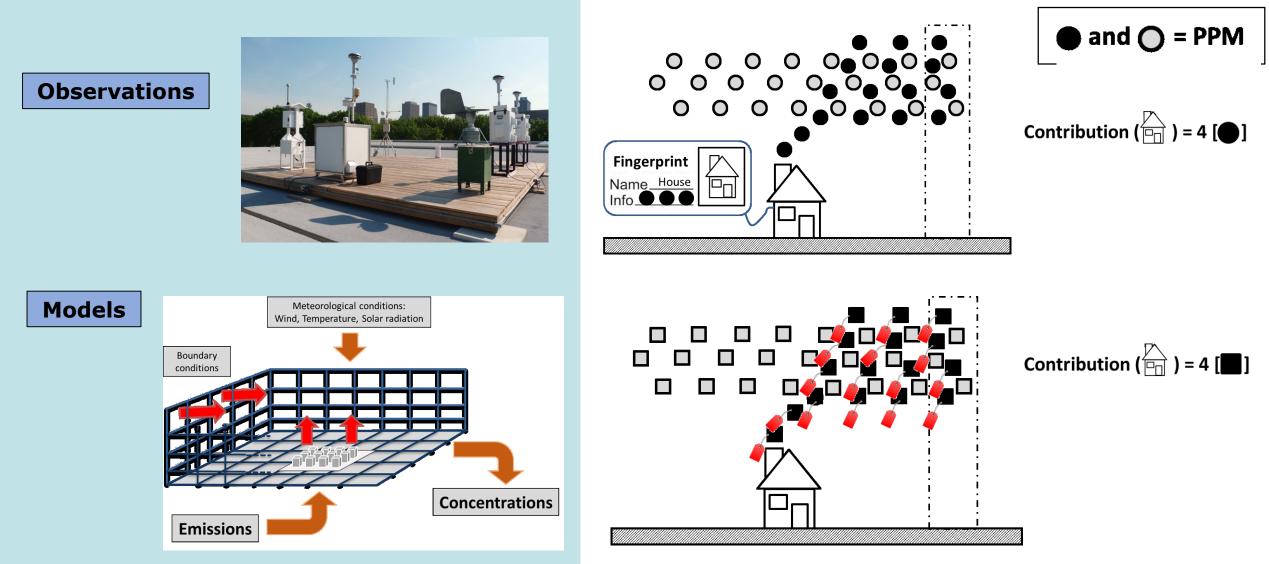
Source apportionment is a technique used to relate emissions from various pollution sources to air pollution concentrations at a given location and for a given time period.



Increment: computing differences between several observation sites

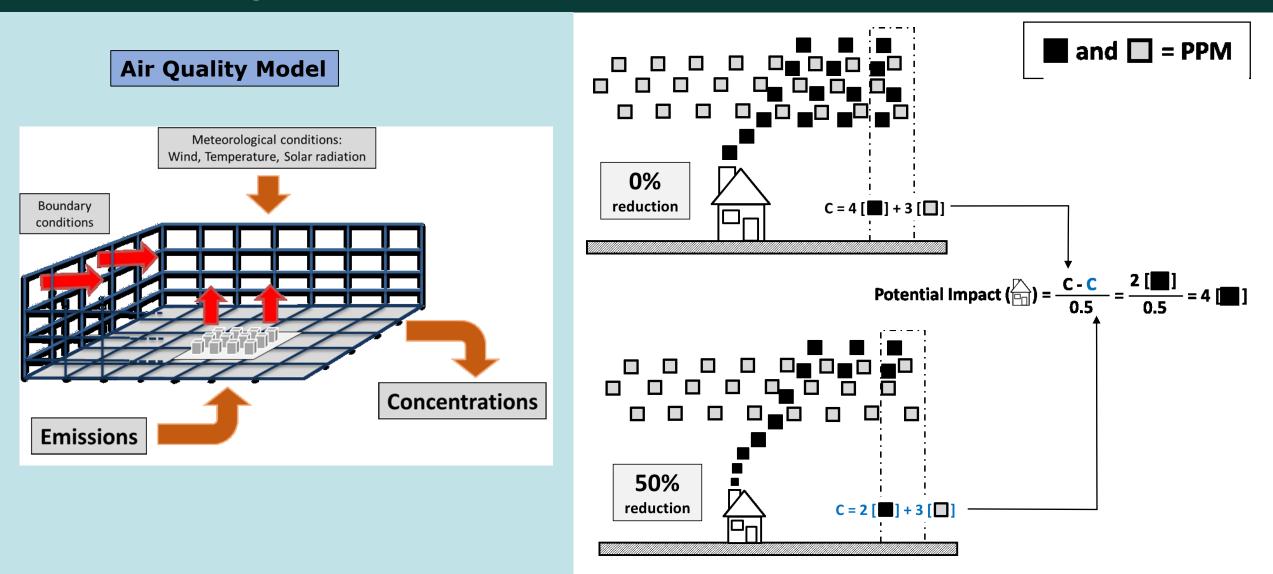


Receptor and Tagging Contributions: tracing pollutant mass

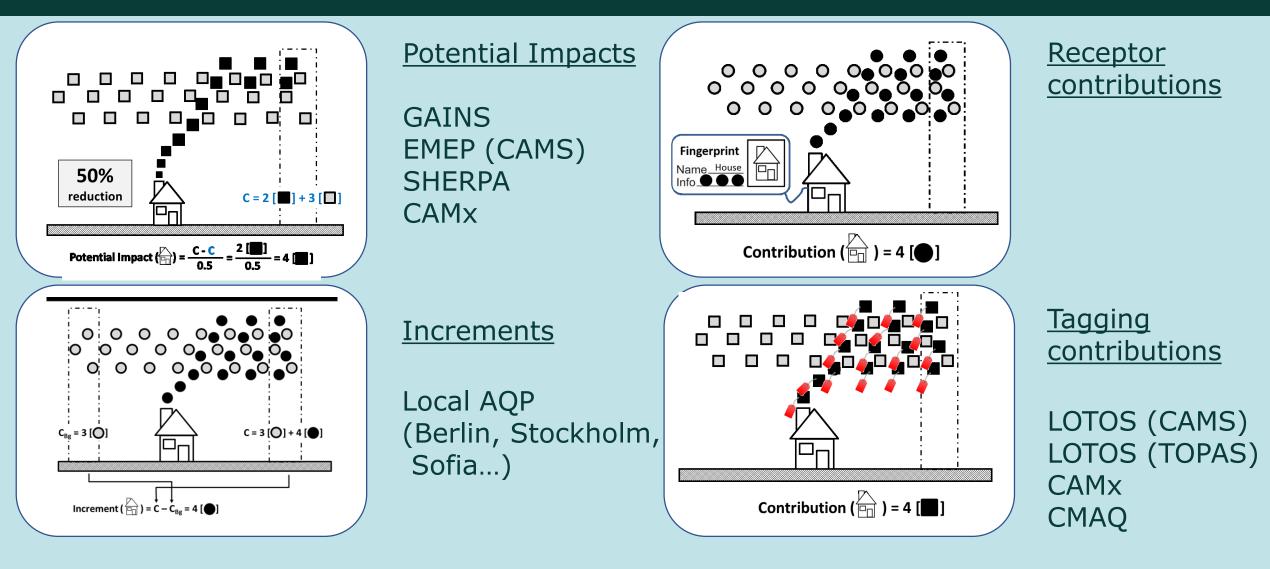


Potential Impacts:

simulating the effects of reduction scenarios

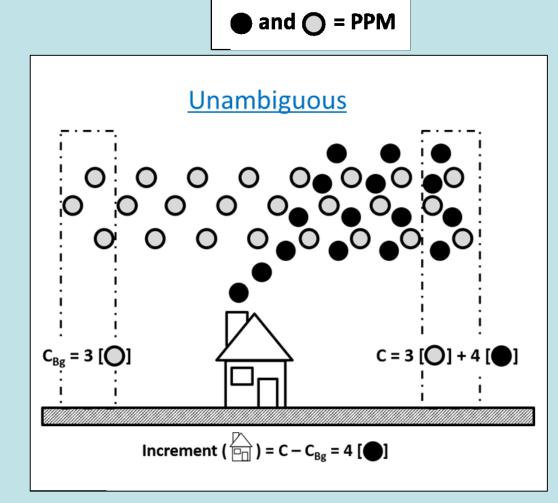


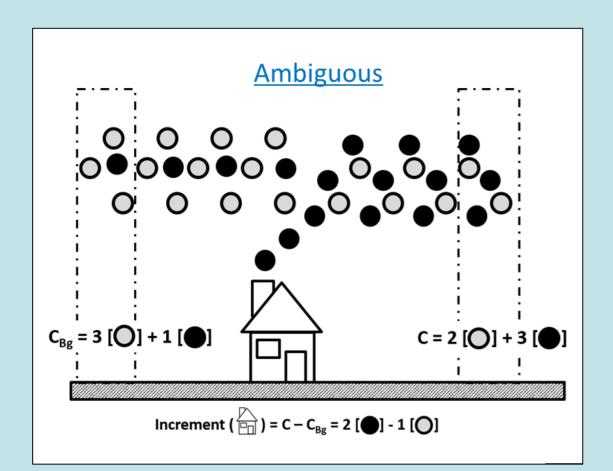
In "basic" situations all methods give the same results BUT...



Why Incremental Components are Impossible to Interpret?

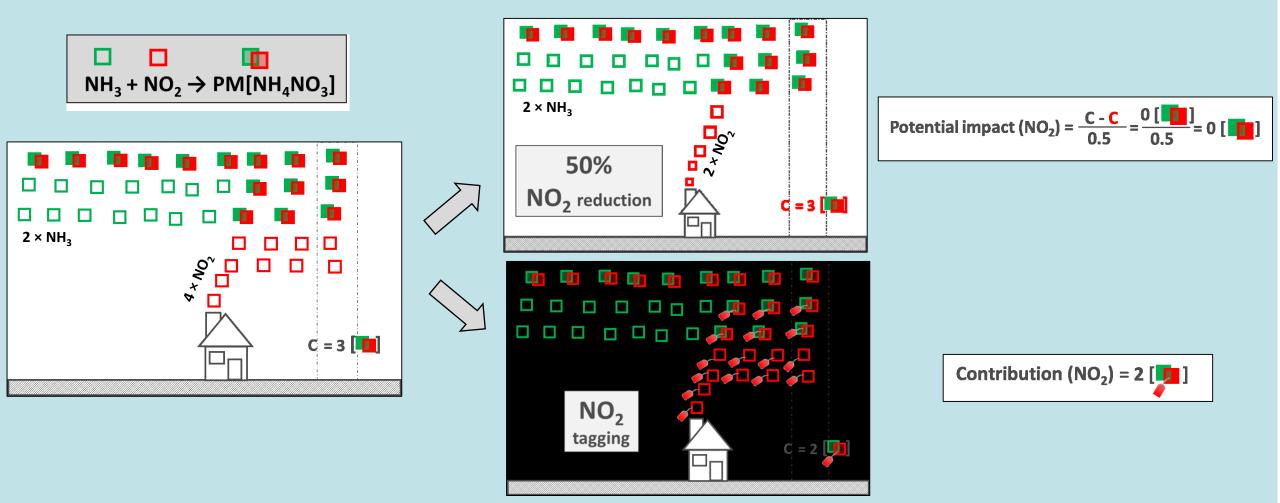
Components computed with the increment method are always ambiguous.





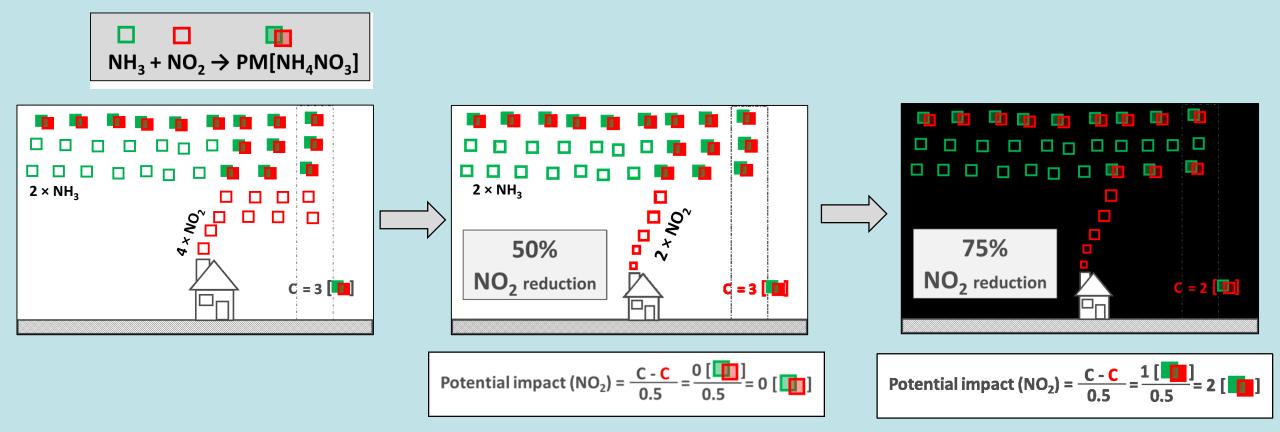
What are the Effects of Nonlinearity?

1. Tagging contributions and Potential Impacts give different results:



What are the Effects of Nonlinearity?

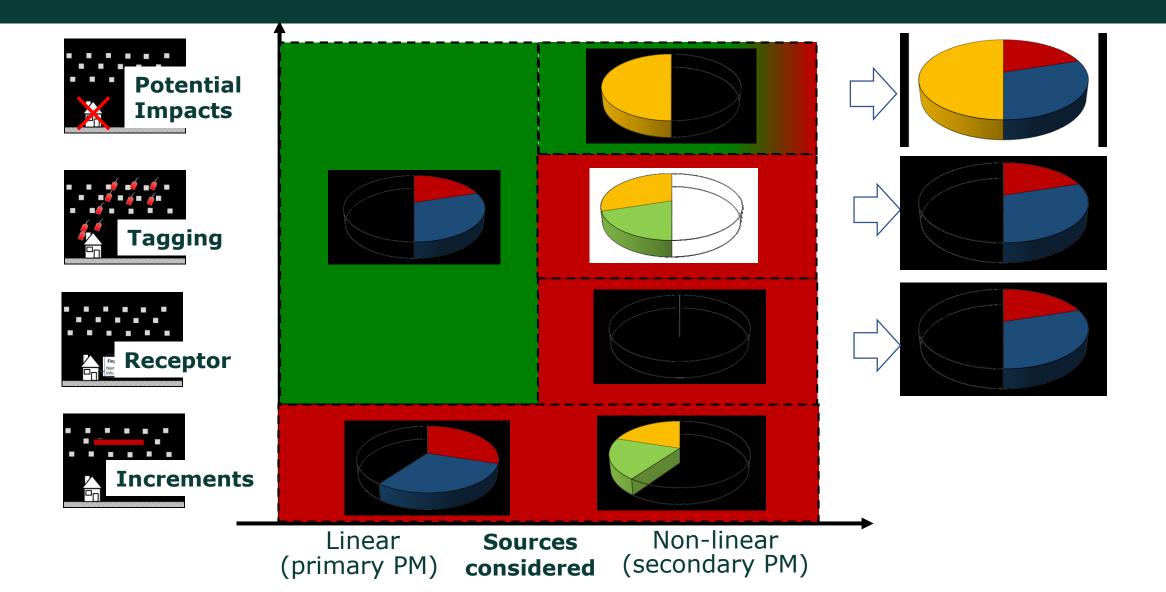
2. Potential Impacts are changing with the percentage of emission reduction:



Experience shows that the Potential Impacts remain constant over a limited range of emission reduction (until 50%)
